MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF GONZALES CONVENTION AND VISITORS BUREAU

Thursday, October 12, 2017 City Hall ~ 820 St. Joseph 12:00pm

Call to Order and Certification of Quorum

Chairwoman Crozier called the meeting to order at 12:04pm. A quorum was declared present.

Members present: Barbara Crozier, Clint Hille, Holly Danz, Chris Kappmeyer, Dawn O'Donnell, Paul Frenzel, Ann Covert, Alison Rodriguez; Members absent: Ken Morrow; Ex offico present: none; Staff present: Anne Dollary; City Officials present: Genora Young; Guests: Kat Penrose, Billy Bob Lowe, Tiffany Hutchinson

Public Comments: Paul Frenzel reported on Pioneer Village events during Come and Take It. 61 reenactors were present; was a great turnout. Over 300 paying guests. Lots of those folks were out of town visitors. Paul thanked this group and the Chamber for their help. School tours are already booking. Barbara Crozier would like to add a Pioneer Village report to each meeting.

Approval of Minutes

1. **Approval of Minutes**: The minutes of the September 14, 2017 meeting were approved, with the addition of naming Tiffany Hutchinson as a present guest.

Action Items

- 2. Acceptance of Clint Hille's resignation from the Gonzales Convention and Visitor Bureau Committee. Dawn O'Donnell moved to accept the resignation, Holly Danz seconded; motion carried to accept with sincere appreciation for Clint's work as a committee member.
- 3. Discuss and Consider Application for funding from Central Texas Independent Cattleman's Association. Ann Covert moved to accept the application, Holly Danz accepted. This is the 4th year that this group is requesting funds, and there was discussion of how the committee's budget looked so far this year. The committee has started providing lesser amounts for those that have applied for more than 3 years. Per Mr. Lowe, this will be the biggest sale so far. Dawn O'Donnell then moved to fund \$1,500 for this event, Holly Danz seconded. Chris Kappmeyer stated that we can't keep funding events at the lesser amount forever, and may not be able to fund next year. Motion carried for \$1,500.
- 4. **Discuss and Consider Brochure Distribution.** Ann Covert & Clint Hille are working on this. Clint plans to distribute locally, as well as providing racks for those that haven't previously had them. He suggested that committee members sign up for a month out of the year to refill these around town. Barbara Crozier asked for a signup sheet to be available at the next meeting so

members can sign up for the next year.

- 5. **Discuss and Consider Lunch and Learn.** Ann Covert would like to reinstate this event. Clint Hille then discussed that EDC is working with the Chamber on a similar program. Genora Young could not share much information, but it would be available to all businesses in the community and an outside person would be brought in for the presentation. Barbara asked Genora to let the Chamber know that this board would like to be involved and willing to help.
- 6. Election of Officers. Holly Danz offered to stay on as Secretary; Ann Covert volunteered to stay on as Parliamentarian; Barbara Crozier has volunteered to stay on as Chairwoman. Dawn O'Donnell volunteered to take on the role of Vice-Chair. Chris Kappmeyer moved to accept the slate of volunteers for officers, Holly Danz seconded; motion carried.

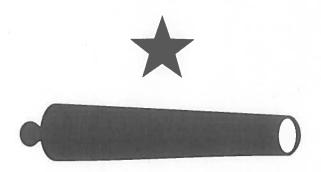
- 7. **Report from Tourism Director.** Clint Hille attended the Texas Travel Industry conference in Arlington, and learned a lot about marketing and blog groups. Clint will be visiting with a couple of bloggers to see what would be available to us. Working on putting the booth together for the upcoming home & garden shows; and gathering collateral as giveaways. Also working to get calendars updated so current info posts on the websites. Looked into the Channel 3 situation, and getting more information to see how this can be utilized. After visiting with the hotels, most of them use Dish and Channel 3 is a Spectrum product. More work to be done on this. Chris Kappmeyer asked that the budget be translated into a pie chart for easier understanding.
- 8. **Update on Home and Garden Shows.** Houston Home and Garden Show scheduled for October 21-22; Clint Hille and Genora Young will be attending.
- 9. **Update on Spring Garden and Grounds Tour.** Still looking for a leader. Hoping to have a list and date available to be handed out during Winterfest.
- 10. **Update on Winterfest Activities.** Home tour will happen and brochures are out. Stars in the Village, Lighted Parade, and Breakfast with Santa all scheduled.
- 11. Report from Anne Dollery on the Expo Center at JB Wells Park. Man Event coming right up. 2 circus performances, wrestling match, horse cutting. ICA sale, team roping, lights festival, barn sale all coming up. Jr High finals are coming back in 2018, but bids will go out for renewal next year and they will be looking for a 5-year contract. Anne was asked if she could ask her event organizers if we could have their email list so those people could be added to our email blasts. PBR has not committed for next year.
- 12. **Report from Gonzales Memorial Museum.** Spreadsheet provided to board members. Still looking for 2014 information. Museum board will also be providing refreshments during the Winterfest tour of homes.
- 13. **Report on Occupancy Trends.** September report has not come out yet. 58% positive change in local occupancy.

- 14. **Report from advisory members on Event Development.** Chris Kappmeyer hoping to have an event in spring 2019 surrounding guns, ammo, the Canon, etc.

The HOT Funds were used to promote the arts and entertainment through the booking of a wide variety of music acts and performers as well as being used to promote family/kid oriented entertainment. These funds were able to assist with music acts and/or performers that covered the genres from Tejano to Folk to Texas Country, Bluegrass to 80's/Classic Country to Square Dancing. These acts consisted of local performers to nationally famous acts.

How many years have you held this Event or Project:

The Celebration has been a Gonzales Tradition since 1956 and is the largest celebration in Gonzales County.

Admission to the Celebration which includes all the entertainment was Free. This was the second year to implement a different financial structure in order for the Come and Take It Committee to generate a renewable source of income. In the previous years, the event was set-up on a cost sharing system with the Come and Take It Committee receiving a small amount of money to cover administrative costs associated with the event. Under the new structure profits from the event are being used for capital improvements to the Celebration with the remaining funds going to operational costs for the next year's Celebration. This year's net profit was approximately \$12,800.00. In 2017 we purchased 80 tables and we anticipate purchasing additional chairs. majority of the funds are distributed to the local non-profit groups that participate in the Celebration.

Several local businesses donated items for a drawing helping to showcase Gonzales. Laurel Ridge Inn and Antiques donated a one night stay as well as a package of their famous Wassail mix. San Antonio Distillery donated a bottle of their "Immortal 32" rum which was produced and is marketed through their facility right here in Gonzales located at 711 St Paul. 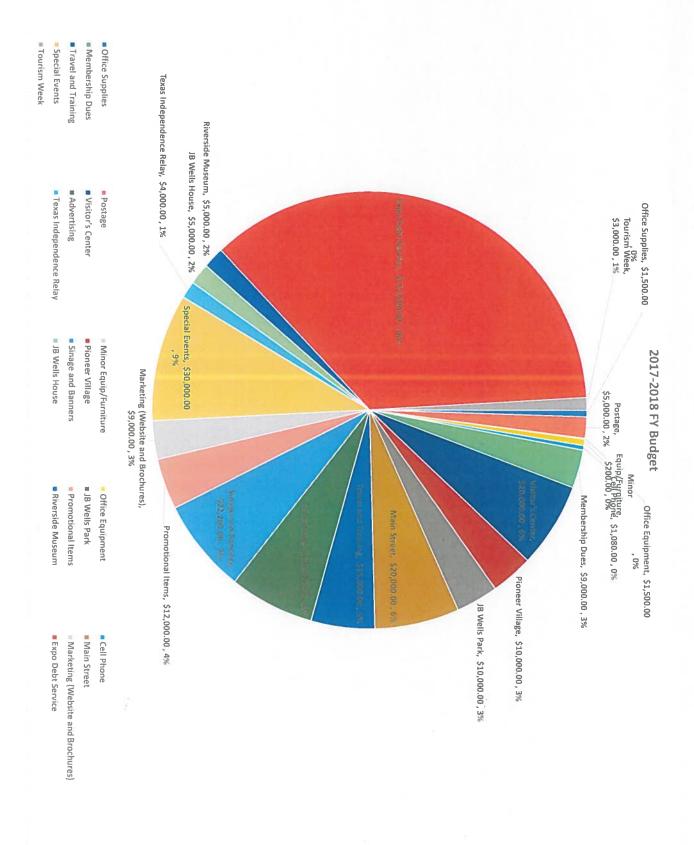

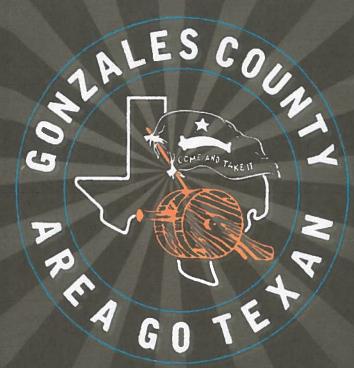

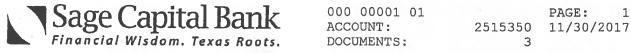

HOTEL OCCUPANCY TAX USE GUIDELINES UNDER TEXAS STATE LAW AND FUNDING APPLICATION FORM

State Law: By law of the State of Texas, the City of Gonzales collects a Hotel Occupancy Tax (HOT) from hotels, motels, bed & breakfasts and inns. Under state law, the revenue from the HOT may be used only to directly promote tourism and the hotel and convention hotel industry. **Chapter 351 of the Tax Code states that the use of HOT funds is limited to:**

- a. Convention Centers and Visitor Information Centers: the acquisition of sites for and the construction, improvement, enlarging, equipping, repairing operation and maintenance of convention facilities or visitor information centers, or both;
- b. **Registration of Convention Delegates:** the furnishing of facilities, personnel, and materials for the registration of convention delegates or registrants;
- c. Advertising, Solicitations and Promotions that Directly Promote
 Tourism and the Hotel and Convention Industry: advertising and
 conducting solicitations and promotional programs to attract tourists and
 convention delegates or registrants to the municipality or its vicinity;
- d. Promotions of the Arts that Directly Promote Tourism and the Hotel and Convention Industry: the encouragement, promotion, improvement, and application of the arts that can be shown to have some direct impact on tourism and the hotel/convention industry. The impact may be that the art facility or event can show hotel nights that are booked due to their events or that guests at hotels attend the arts event. Eligible forms of art include instrumental and vocal music, dance, drama, folk art, creative writing, architecture, design and allied fields, painting, sculpture, photography, graphic and craft arts, motion picture, radio, television, tape and sound recording, and other arts related to the presentation, performance, execution, and exhibition of these major art forms.
- e. Historical Restoration and Preservation Activities that Directly Promote Tourism and the Hotel and Convention Industry: historical restoration and preservation projects or activities or advertising and conducting solicitation and promotional programs to encourage tourists and convention delegates to visit preserved historic sites or museums.
- f. Sporting Event Expenses that Substantially Increase Economic Activity at Hotels: Expenses including promotional expenses directly related to a sporting event in which the majority of participants are tourists who substantially increase economic activity at hotels and motels within the city or it vicinity.
- g. Funding transportation systems for transporting tourists from hotels to and near the city to any of the following destinations:
 - 1. the commercial center of the city;
 - 2. a convention center in the city;
 - 3. other hotels in or near the city; or
 - 4. tourist attractions in or near the city.

The law specifically prohibits the use of the local hotel tax to cover the costs for general city transit costs to transport the general public.

h. Signage directing tourists to sights and attractions that are visited frequently by hotel guests in the municipality.

City Policy: The City of Gonzales accepts applications from groups and businesses whose program fits into one or more of the above categories. All requests for funds should be submitted in writing accompanied by the official application two weeks prior to the Tourism Committee Meeting which is held on the second Tuesday of the month. The application will be reviewed by the Gonzales Tourism Committee at the earliest possible regularly scheduled meeting. The applicant may be asked to be present at the meeting to answer any questions regarding the application. Applicants will be notified one week prior to the meeting of the time and place for the review. City Council will have final approval for any application requesting over \$2,500.00. The Gonzales Tourism Committee will make a recommendation to the City Council. The City Council will make the final decision on your request. You will be notified when City Council will address your request. Attendance is required.

Eligibility and Priority for Hotel Tax Funds: Priority will be given to those events and entities based on their ability to generate overnight visitors to Gonzales. The amount that you are requesting should not exceed more than 25 percent of the gross amount of hotel night revenue that you are predicting that will be created or sustained by your event. If an event will not generate any meaningful hotel night activity, it is not eligible for receipt of hotel occupancy tax funds. Events can prove this potential to generate overnight visitors by:

a) historic information on the number of room nights used during previous years of the same events;

)

- b) current information on the size of a room block that has been reserved at area hotels to accommodate anticipated overnight guests attending the event requesting hotel tax funds;
- c) historical information on the number of guests at hotel or other lodging facilities that attended the funded event; and/or
- d) examples of marketing of the programs and activities that are likely to generate encourage overnight visitors to local lodging properties.

Use of Local Vendors: The Gonzales Tourism Committee encourages all event organizers to patronize Gonzales businesses for food, supplies, materials, printing, etc.

Use of Revenues from Event: A portion of the revenues from any event and/or project receiving any type of funding assistance from the HOT funds should be channeled back into the future costs of operating that same event or the continued operation of the project. No other outside event(s), project, charity, etc., sponsored by the host organization may profit from the City of Gonzales's funding of a particular event.

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- e. Historical Restoration and Preservation Activities that Directly Promote Tourism and the Hotel and Convention Industry: historical restoration and preservation projects or activities or advertising and conducting solicitation and promotional programs to encourage tourists and convention delegates to visit preserved historic sites or museums.
- f. Sporting Event Expenses that Substantially Increase Economic Activity at Hotels: Expenses including promotional expenses directly related to a sporting event in which the majority of participants are tourists who substantially increase economic activity at hotels and motels within the city or it vicinity.
- g. Funding transportation systems for transporting tourists from hotels to and near the city to any of the following destinations:
 - 1. the commercial center of the city:
 - 2. a convention center in the city:

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- 3. other hotels in or near the city; or

The law specifically prohibits the use of the local hotel tax to cover the costs for general city transit costs to transport the general public.

h. Signage directing tourists to sights and attractions that are visited frequently by hotel guests in the municipality.

City Policy: The City of Gonzales accepts applications from groups and businesses whose program fits into one or more of the above categories. All requests for funds should be submitted in writing accompanied by the official application two weeks prior to the Tourism Committee Meeting which is held on the second Tuesday of the month. The application will be reviewed by the Gonzales Tourism Committee at the earliest possible regularly scheduled meeting. The applicant may be asked to be present at the meeting to answer any questions regarding the application. Applicants will be notified one week prior to the meeting of the time and place for the review. City Council will have final approval for any application requesting over \$2,500.00. The Gonzales Tourism Committee will make a recommendation to the City Council. The City Council will make the final decision on your request. You will be notified when City Council will address your request. Attendance is required.

Eligibility and Priority for Hotel Tax Funds: Priority will be given to those events and entities based on their ability to generate overnight visitors to Gonzales. The amount that you are requesting should not exceed more than 25 percent of the gross amount of hotel night revenue that you are predicting that will be created or sustained by your event. If an event will not generate any meaningful hotel night activity, it is not eligible for receipt of hotel occupancy tax funds. Events can prove this potential to generate overnight visitors by:

- a) historic information on the number of room nights used during previous years of the same events;
- b) current information on the size of a room block that has been reserved at area hotels to accommodate anticipated overnight guests attending the event requesting hotel tax funds;
- c) historical information on the number of guests at hotel or other lodging facilities that attended the funded event; and/or
- d) examples of marketing of the programs and activities that are likely to generate encourage overnight visitors to local lodging properties.

Use of Local Vendors: The Gonzales Tourism Committee encourages all event organizers to patronize Gonzales businesses for food, supplies, materials, printing, etc.

Use of Revenues from Event: A portion of the revenues from any event and/or project receiving any type of funding assistance from the HOT funds should be channeled back into the future costs of operating that same event or the continued operation of the project. No other outside event(s), project, charity, etc., sponsored by the host organization may profit from the City of Gonzales's funding of a particular event.

Budget Amendment for Gonzales Memorial Museum

Gonzales Memorial Museum had a \$5000.00 line item approved in the 2016-2017 FY budget for the purchase of souvenirs to be sold as a fund raising effort for the museum. FYE 2017 was September 30, 2017. This money was not utilized during the fiscal year and the Museum Advisory Board has indicated they were not aware the funds had to be invoiced in the FY they were approved for. Christmas ornaments were ordered in October 2017 which falls under the 2017-2018 FY.

The Museum Advisory Board would like to request the funds be reinstated in the current FY. To accomplish this, a budget amendment will have to be approved to move the \$5000.00 from the funds held account to the budget in the current FY.
