The Big Fresno Fair is proud to announce the 2024 inductees into The Big Fresno Fair Hall of Fame, which was first established in 2007 as a way to honor those individuals who have demonstrated long-time continued support and extraordinary passion for the betterment of The Big Fresno Fair.

The 2023 Hall of Fame inductees will be formally honored at the 2024 Big Fresno Fair's Opening Ceremonies on Wednesday, October 2 at 2:30 p.m. in the Pacifico Yosemite Stage. Additionally, all Big Fresno Fair Hall of Fame inductees will receive prominent visual recognition on the Fair's Hall of Fame Wall at the Fairgrounds and an official Big Fresno Fair Horse & Jockey Bronze statue. Members of The Big Fresno Fair Hall of Fame will also be listed on the Fair's website. Additionally, a "Hall of Fame" stakes race will be held at the 2024 Fair's horse race meet in honor of 2024 inductees.

• Manuel Ponte | For the past 40 years, Manuel Ponte has been a fixture in the livestock barns at the annual Big Fresno Fair. His volunteering first began in 1985 with his son, Brian, and the Pacheco brothers. When his granddaughter Madison starting showing replacement heifers, he was back in the barns. Ever since then, Manuel has been helping exhibitors prepare their heifers for the show and sale. With more than 50 years of experience in the rendering industry in Fresno County, Manuel has shared that knowledge and guidance with generations of exhibitors.

His volunteering efforts don't stop there – he has consistently donated to the 4-H and FFA Exhibitor Breakfast, even cooking and serving the meals. Manuel also generously donates to the livestock "Tool Box Program", also known as the All-Around Ag Award, as well as provides the wine each year for the Dairy Replacement Heifer Sale. He has and continues to participate in the Kerman Lamb BBQ group for over 20 years, where he has supported 4-H and FFA exhibitors by purchasing their lambs – further punctuating his commitment to encouraging youth participation in agriculture.

Manuel's ongoing volunteer work with Kerman 4-H exemplifies his ultimate dedication to the Fair and the local ag community. His consistent support and active participation not only enhance the Fair's operations, but also inspire and uplift the next generation livestock exhibitors and future community leaders.
