Open Class Beef Guidelines:

- All entries in this department must be registered. A photocopy of all registration papers must be to the Superintendent or Competitive Exhibit's Office by July 31st. All registration papers and tattoos will be checked.
- No animal deemed unworthy shall be entered.
- Each exhibitor will be limited to 14 head, all breeds included. No more than two dry cows per exhibitor. In case of shortage in stall space, exhibitors with the most entries will be cut first.
- Each exhibitor will be limited to two premiums in any one class.
- The same cattle cannot be shown in 4-H and FFA.
- Only blue and red ribbon winners in 4-H and FFA are eligible to enter Open Class Cattle.
- 4-H and FFA may enter Open Class cattle provided there is a minimum of ten open class cattle per breed or two exhibitors.
- Any breed Division with less than 5 head becomes an exhibit, not qualified for class premiums. Exhibit premiums will be \$30.00 per head.
- Cattle exhibitors will follow the general rules of the fair
- See the Superintendent for information and equipment use.
- Beef bulls over six months must have nose restraint.
- A maximum of two animals from any one exhibitor are allowed in the wash rack at any one time.
- A respiratory complex vaccine is strongly recommended four (4) weeks prior to the fair.
- Keep the barns neat and clean for the public. Bedding will be furnished by the Fair. Exhibitors must provide attendants for their cattle.
- Herdsmanship must be performed between 10 am and 9 pm daily. Failure to do so could result in loss of premiums.

CLASS NUMBER

- 23. Pair of females owned by exhibitor and shown in individual classes.
- 24. Pair of calves, one bull calf and one heifer calf, must be a spring, junior, or senior
- 25. Produce of dam, 2 animals, either sex from one dam, may be owned by more than one exhibitor. Limit one (1) entry per exhibitor. To be eligible each animal must be shown in individual classes.
- 26. Get of sire, 3 animals with both sexes represented, all sired by one bull, all owned by exhibitor.
- 27. Breeders best 5 head. Five head shown in individual classes. Must be bred by and owned, or co-owned by exhibitor. Either or both sexes represented. To be eligible each animal must be shown in individual classes.

DIVISION J – BEEF HERDSMANSHIP

Large and small divisions will be determined by the Superintendent on Tuesday when the animals are in place.

PREMIER BREEDER AND EXHIBITOR AWARDS

The Northwest Washington Fair will award banners for premier breeder and premier exhibitor awards. To qualify for banners there must be competition of two or more herds in each breed and a minimum of three head per herd.

- Premier Breeder The breeder winning the most money for no more than six animals in the open single classes exhibited by themselves and/or other exhibitors shall be designated the Premier Breeder.
- Premier Exhibitor The exhibitor winning the most money for no more than six animals owned and exhibited by themselves shall be designated the Premier Exhibitor. An exhibitor's qualifying animals shall be defined as follows: Any animal within the family unit housed on exhibitor's farm may be used for this award.

ID Prior to arrival:

- REQUIRED: Legible Bangs Tattoo on females over 12 months of age.
- RECOMMENDED: USDA Metal ID or Brucellosis Tag & USDA NAIS ID & RFID Tag

The goal of the Veterinary Inspection is to minimize the potential for contagious and infectious diseases (including parasites). Examples of Infectious Disease and Parasites include:

• Infectious Foot Rot

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- Snotty Nose/Respiratory
- Ring Worm
- Pinkeye

- Coarse, Dry Cough Evidence of Diarrhea
- Warts
- High Fever

- No Visible External Parasite Burden (or related clinical signs):
- Mange
 Lice

Adequate Body Condition – Minimum BCS of 2.5

- 1: Emaciated 2: Thin 3: Good Condition
- 4: Overweight 5: Obese

• Feed and water should be available at the Fair at all times
