## **RULES AND REGULATIONS**

- 1. Flowers must be entered in proper category with exact number of specimens, as listed, or exhibit will be disqualified. THIS APPLIES TO ALL CATEGORIES AND ALL AGE GROUPS.
- 2. Flowers must be freshly cut, not artificial, and grown by the exhibitor.
- 3. Exhibitors are requested to refresh their flowers or arrangements after 3-4 days. This is NOT required but does enhance the exhibits.
- **4.** Exhibitors must furnish their own containers for all flower exhibits.
- NOT ALLOWED: Containers made of fruit, vegetables, paper, or those that contained alcoholic beverages.
- 6. Color of water and moisture beads, if used, must be clear.
- 7. Arrangements MUST be free of diseases, insects, or pest of any type.
- 8. NO arrangement can include any weed labeled as noxious by the IDA.
- **9. NO** more than 2 entries in any one Lot.
- 10. Note: Specific exhibits can be entered only once in consecutive years in classes 33 thru 38.
- **11. All entries**, excepting artistic arrangements, **must be grown by the exhibitor** and must remain in place until the close of Fair.
- **12.** Exhibits must be entered under the premium number only.
  - \*\*The same entry <u>cannot</u> be entered as an individual entry, then combined in a community exhibit, club or individual.
- **13.** All Best of Class winners will be judged to determine the "Best of Show".
- **14.** Judges consider the stems, foliage, and freshness of the flowers in judging. The container in the Arrangement, Window Box and Bonsai categories is being considered by the judges as part of the overall entry.
- **15.** Exhibits to be fresh cut, dried, or treated plant material. **NO** artificial flowers or artificial foliage will be permitted.
- **16.** Exhibits must be free standing; containers must be of appropriate shape and size to hold up the plant material.
- **17. The Superintendent** has the right to remove, at any time, any exhibit or part thereof which is unsightly.
- **18.** If more than one specimen is required, such as 3 to 5, these must be of one variety and color, unless otherwise specified.
- **19.** Exhibitors entering in Classes 36 thru 38: Please contact Superintendent at 760-484-6525 ONE WEEK prior to Fair to allow for appropriate space available and to schedule decorating time.

- Nomenclature the judges will take into consideration if you know what your plant is and you label it either with the common name or botanical nomenclature.



- 2. <u>LIVESTOCK CASH PREMIUMS</u>: PAID IN THE PREMIUMS/LIVESTOCK OFFICE

  11 AM TO 7 PM ON SPECIFIED DAYS

  PREMIUMS NOT PICKED UP BY 7 PM ON LAST DAY OF FAIR,

  MONDAY, NO CHECKS WILL BE MAILED.

Only one of each placing in any one Lot will be awarded.
- 6. The possession of ribbons and premium cards does not entitle holder to premiums. The premiums on exhibits are paid only on the signed record returned to the Premiums Office by the Judge. Ribbons and cards must remain attached to exhibits while they are on display.
- 7. Disrespect Shown to any award, or to any Judge, by an exhibitor forfeits all awards made to the offending exhibitor.
- 8. COLORS-Blue denotes First Premium, Red Second Premium, White Third Premium, Pink Forth Premium, Yellow Fifth Premium, Green Sixth Premium, Purple Reserve Champion, White and Purple Rosette Champion & Best of Lot.
- 9. Superintendents and Judges must sign and return to the Premiums Manager all award sheets and cards as soon as the judging in complete and awards are made.
- 10. Superintendents and Judges shall exercise great care that the awards are properly recorded, as ribbons, cards, etc., are valueless as evidence of premiums unless the Judge's signed report validates them.
- 11. Judges shall not enter items for judging in the Division they are associated with; they may however enter in other Divisions.
- 12. If for any reason there are not enough exhibitors in any one breed, or Lot, to make a competitive showing, then the exhibitor showing will be entitled to one cash premium in each Lot. The Judge will indicate the highest award eligible in the Lot according to the quality of the animal or exhibit.
