



Dwight Yoakam **Table Mountain Concert Series Presented by Modelo Especial and Toyota**

Iconic country music singer Dwight Yoakam is making his way back to The Big Fresno Fair on Monday, October 14 at 7 p.m. to close out the Table Mountain Concert Series presented by Modelo Especial and Toyota.

Originally hailing from Pikeville, Kentucky, Dwight Yoakam made his mark on the country music scene in the mid-1980s with his debut album, *Guitars, Cadillacs, Etc., Etc* (1986). His music blends traditional country influences with a modern edge, drawing inspiration from artists like Buck Owens and Elvis Presley with hits such as "Honky Tonk Man" and "Guitars, Cadillacs,".

After his successful debut, Dwight Yoakam continued to expand his musical repertoire with albums like *Hillbilly Deluxe* (1987), *If There Was a Way* (1990), and *This Time* (1993) while producing a series of hit singles including "Streets of Bakersfield" (a duet with Buck Owens), "I Sang Dixie," and "Ain't That Lonely Yet." These tracks not only dominated the country charts but also achieved mainstream success, broadening Yoakam's appeal well beyond traditional country music audiences.

Throughout the 1990s and 2000s, Yoakam continued to thrive with albums such as *Gone* (1995), *Under the Covers* (1997), and *Tomorrow's Sounds Today* (2000). Known for his authentic storytelling and ability to blend traditional country themes with a contemporary music, Yoakam earned critical acclaim and numerous accolades, including Grammy Awards and Academy of Country Music Awards. His contributions have left a lasting impact on the genre, solidifying his reputation as a significant figure in country music history.
