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SWINE GENERAL RULES:

1. Animals will be shown by breed.
2. Limited to five animal entries per exhibitor, not limited to one entry per class. Contact the Competitive Exhibits Office to request permission for more entries.
3. Animals shown in market class will not be eligible for show in breeding classes.
4. Rosettes for Grand and Reserve awarded if deserving.
5. All tack, feed, etc. must be stored within allotted areas.
6. No pens may be separated or broke into smaller pens without permission from the Superintendent.
7. No weaned boars. Uncastrated piglets in Sow with Litter are accepted.
8. Barrows may be eligible to be entered in Market Hog classes.
9. Open Swine can be shown in 4-H or FFA. However, Open Swine cannot sell in the Lynden Jr. Livestock Sale without also being shown in 4-H or FFA which would mean being at Fair all 10 days.
10. Herdsmanship is required from 10 am to 9 pm daily. You may team up with another exhibitor(s).

DIVISION A- BREEDING SOWS

Be sure to include breed on entry form. Will be shown by breed. Example Breeds: Kunekune, Hampshire, Chester White, Berkshire, Idaho Pasture Pig, Duroc, Tamworth, American Guinea Hog, Landrace, Gloucestershire Old Spot, Yorkshire, and Crossbreeds.

FOR VETERINARIAN USE ONLY – CHECKLIST TO BE MET FOR THE NORTHWEST WASHINGTON FAIR

The goal of the Veterinary Inspection is to minimize the potential for contagious and infectious diseases (including parasites). Examples of Infectious Disease and Parasites include:

- Erysipelas
- Evidence of Diarrhea
- Ring Worm
- High Fever
- Snout Health/Respiratory
- Evidence of Coughing

No Visible External Parasite Burden (or related clinical signs):

- Lice
- Mange
- Ticks

Adequate Body Condition – Minimum BCS of 2.5

- 1: Emaciated
- 2: Thin
- 3: Good Condition
- 4: Overweight
- 5: Obese
- Feed and water should be available at the Fair at all times

Castrated Properly

- Castration site must be completely healed

Swine Handling: Very Important at Fair Time

- Prevent Fighting
- House Properly
- Prevent Overheating/Hyperthermia
