General Rules for Poultry

- Each exhibitor must attend the mandatory avian flu testing (8/6, 2-7 PM) before entering at fair. If exhibiting 4+ birds, only 3 from the flock need tested.
- Exhibitors will be allowed in the barns to feed 7:00 9:00 AM each morning.
- The latest editions of the Standard of Perfection will be the guide for the judges in awarding prizes for poultry.
- The show will use the American Poultry Association show rules. All exhibits will be cared for by the exhibitor.
- Exhibitors are responsible for the food, water and wellbeing of their animals during the fair. Assistance with barn watch and answering questions is strongly encouraged.
- All poultry must be free of lice or mites.
- Exhibits that show symptoms of sickness will be removed from the exhibit building.
- No age restrictions
- Fowl that constitute a pen may not be listed as singles.
- Minimum of 5 entries per breed required to qualify for premium payout.
- Exhibitors may choose to provide their own cages. Cages must be approved by superintendent by 8/7/2024. (If using cages provided by fair, no alterations are to be made and cages must be cleaned following the show-exhibitors will be charged)

Default cages are as follows:

- Chickens and Guinea: 30"x20"x24" Wire bottom cage
- Turkeys and Peafowl: 7'x5'x7.5' Dirt bottom chain-link pen with no top
- Pigeons and Quail: 3 units per cage left 10", center 12", right 10"x10"x12" Wire bottom

- A cock, old tom is a male over 1 year of age.
- A hen, old hen is a female over 1 year old.
- A cockerel, young tom is a male under 1 year old.
- A pullet, young hen is a female under 1 year old.
- A young trio is under 1 year old and consists of one cockerel and two pullets (chickens only).
- An old trio is over 1 year old and consists of a cock and two hens (chickens only).

EGGS

Division 1965

- Each entry shall consist of 3 eggs on a plate which will be provided
- Shell must be natural, not oiled or otherwise treated.
- One egg will be cracked for judging freshness
- Eggs should be out of the same hen.
- Non-standard eggs include those from birds not accepted in the APA standard of perfection, mixed breeds and those of unknown ancestry.

 Eggs will be disposed of, but ribbons will be available for pick up on Sunday August 17, after 8pm

What the Judges look for in Eggs

- Shell color (when breed standard has been stated, any color variation from this will be penalized)
- Shape
- Texture
- Uniformity
- Freshness (One egg will be cracked to check for freshness)

CLASS

- **16** Large Eggs: breed or nonstandard or mix breed and color noted on entry card. Color to include white, brown, or colored. Speckled or modeled to be entered by background color.
- **17** Bantam Eggs- breed or nonstandard or mix breed and color noted on entry card. Color to include white, brown, or colored. Speckled or mottled to be entered by background color
- 18 All other Eggs- quail, turkey, etc. white, brown, or colored. Speckled or mottled to be entered by background color
