








U.S. Drought Monitor New Mexico

Dry, often windy weather has affected the nation's southwestern quadrant. As a result, deterioration has been observed in parts of the Southwest, particularly in New Mexico.

New Mexico, in addition to the McBride Fire, has been dealing with several other blazes, including the 7,573-acre Hermits Peak Fire, which started as a prescribed fire northwest of Las Vegas on April 6 before escaping containment.


