STATE OF NEW MEXICO COUNTY OF LEA RESOLUTION NO. 23-AUG-188R

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE REPORT OF THE CANVASS OF THE RETURNS AND CERTIFYING THE RESULTS OF THE AUGUST 1, 2023, TOWN OF TATUM SPECIAL ELECTION TO ADD A FIFTH COUNCILOR POSITION TO TATUM TOWN COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the (NMSA) 1978, Section 1-13-13 states:

- A. The county canvassing board shall complete the canvas of the returns and declare the results no sooner than six days and no later than ten days from the date of the election; *and*
- B. The county canvassing board, immediately upon approval of the report of the canvass of the returns of an election, shall issue a certificate of canvass of the results of the election and send one copy of the certified results to:
- (1) the county clerk;
- (2) each local governing body with a candidate or ballot question receiving votes from any precinct in the county;
 - (3) the secretary of state;
 - (4) the state records center.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Lea County acting as the board of Canvassers of Lea County, State of New Mexico, canvass the Tatum Municipal Election held by mail only in Lea County, August 1, 2023, and certify that the canvass results text file sent to the office of the Secretary of State is a correct canvass of returns of said election and is hereby approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Commission Chair and/or County Manager may finalize and sign any agreements consistent with the terms of this resolution.

PASSED, APPROVED AND ADOPTED on this 9th day of August, 2023, by the Lea County Board of County Commissioners in an open meeting in Lovington, New Mexico.

RESOLUTION AND PROCLAMATION OF TOWN COUNCIL SPECIAL ELECTION TO ADD A FIFTH COUNCILOR POSITION TO TATUM TOWN COUNCIL

WHEREAS, a Petition containing 61 signatures was filed with the Town of Tatum Clerk to request a special election, in accordance with NM State Statute 3-12-2.1; and

WHEREAS, at least 5% of the 468 registered voters within Tatum city limits signed the Petition; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Tatum, in Lea County, has determined that a special election shall be held on the 1st day of August, 2023, pursuant to the NM State Statute 1-24-2; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Tatum, in Lea County, has determined that there should be submitted to the electorate the option to approve or disapprove the following change: the number of members on the council be raised and the governing body be comprised of five (5) councilmen, in addition to the mayor.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWN OF TATUM, THAT:

- 1. On the 1st day of August, 2023, there will be held a special election for the purpose of submitting to the registered qualified electors of Tatum the question of adding a fifth Councilor position to the Town of Tatum Governing Body.
- 2. At the special election, the following question shall be submitting to the registered qualified electors of Tatum:

ADDITION OF A FIFTH COUNCILOR TO THE TOWN OF TATUM GOVERNING BODY

Shall the Town of Tatum Governing Body be comprised of an additional Council member, raising the number of Council members on the Governing Body from four (4) to five (5), in addition to the Mayor?

- 3. If at the election a majority of the registered voters voting on the question of changing the number of councilmen vote in favor of such change, all councilmen shall serve until their current term of office expires. At the subsequent regular municipal election, a fifth councilman will be elected.
- 4. If a majority of the registered voters voting on the question of changing the number of councilmen disapproves or approves of such change, then such change in the number of members shall not be considered again for a period of four (4) years from the date of the election.
- 5. The special election shall be conducted absentee and mailed ballots shall be used exclusively for voting in special elections, provided by the Lea County Clerk's Office.
