- 1. Online Registration/Entry Deadline is March 15, 2023. Please refer to the JLA rules for all dates, policies and procedures that pertain to online entries and fees.
- 2. Because of current uncertainty, all official fair week dates and times, including weigh-ins, shows, sales and check-outs will be verified by May 15, 2023.

- 3. All colt entries are subject to the General Rules and Regulations and the Jr. Livestock Division Rules, except where they conflict with the rules of the Show, in which case the Show rules prevail. Any exhibitor not complying with Washington County Fair Colt rules will be removed from the Washington County Fair Colt Program immediately.
- 4. Any permanent registered breed that does not have a height limit may be exhibited in the sale division, either filly or gelding. All stud colts must be gelded by April 26, 2023. If not attending April 26, 2023 workout, the exhibitor must have verification of gelding from veterinarian turned into fair office or chairman the day of or before the deadline date of April 26, 2023.
  - a) Colts must have two (2) rounds of West Nile, Strangles and VEWT vaccinations and one (1) round of rabies on or before the April 26, 2023 workout.
  - b) Colts/fillies HYPP susceptible must have a negative HYPP test result of HYPP N/N prior to being checked in at the first workout (Wednesday, March 22, 2023).
  - c) Colts must have current Coggins and health papers presented to committee prior to the Colt Show.
  - d) All exhibitors must keep all medical and worming records on colts.
  - e) All colts/fillies must have a negative HERDA test result prior to being checked in at the first workout (Wednesday, March 22, 2023). Fillies with test results of N/HRD (carrier) or HRD/HRD (positive) are not eligible to be shown. Geldings with test results of N/HRD (carrier) are eligible to be shown. Geldings with test results of HRD/HRD (positive) are not eligible to be shown.
- 5. All colts must be foaled between January 1, 2022 and December 31, 2022. Exhibitors must possess a breeder's certificate or a photocopy of colt's papers, with transfer form showing the name and registration number of the colt's sire and dam, plus the breeder's

- name. Completed entry, release forms & dues must be turned in on or before the first workout (Wednesday, March 22, 2023).
- 6. Exhibitor must independently own colt and be registered in exhibitor's name on June 14, 2023 and continue to own colt throughout the feeding period. Exhibitor must feed, care for and exhibit colt entered without any aid or assistance other than their immediate family (parents, siblings, and grandparent), Washington County Extension Agents/Washington County Ag-Science Teachers, Washington County 4-H Adult Club Managers, fellow Colt Exhibitors and/or their parents or guardians, and Colt Committee Members. Violations will cause the exhibitor to forfeit the right to show in the Junior Colt Division. Colt Chairperson or designated committee member will make scheduled visits to exhibitor's home.
- 7. All exhibitors and their colts must attend three (3) of the five (5) workouts. (ATTENDANCE AT ORIENTATION IS NOT CONSIDERED ONE.) It is mandatory that the exhibitor attend either the fourth or fifth workout. If not in attendance at the first workout verification reports are due, then the exhibitor must deliver same to Chairperson, or to the fair office on/or before that date. During workouts, parents are allowed in the arena. During show, parents are not allowed in arena.

## When colts are due at Fairgrounds, the following documents listed are required:

State Texas Health Certificate dated within thirty (30) days of show Original Registration Papers with signed transfer Current Coggins Test

- 9. ALL Exhibitors are required to participate in Confirmation and Showmanship. Confirmation will count for seventy-five (75) percent of the total score. Showmanship will count for twenty-five (25) percent of total score. The exhibitor which accumulates the most points will be the champion, etc.
  - a. Fillies and geldings will be shown together in one (1) confirmation class.

- 10. This project is part of the Junior Livestock Division; however, 4-H & FFA members can show and sell in this program as well as in the Junior Livestock Sale. (Example: You can sell commercial heifers in addition to a barrow, carcass hog, fryers, lamb, rabbits, steer, turkey or goat). Exhibitors must abide by the General and Junior Livestock Division Rules.
- 11. During the Fair, random drug testing may be conducted, with entries to be tested being selected under the direction of the Washington County Fair Association Executive Board on the day of the shows. A parent/guardian must be present for testing. All horses are subject to blood, urine or saliva test and evaluation by a veterinarian and supervised by Committee Chairman or Committee Member. Any horse requiring medical attention during the Fair must notify Committee Chairman before being administered by veterinarian.
  - a. All horses must be shown free of prohibited substances (medication) in accordance with AQHA rule 441-H, and abide by the Washington County Fair Code of Show Ring Ethics or forfeit sales check, all other awards and may not be permitted to exhibit a colt throughout their 4-H and FFA tenure.
  - b. No chains allowed at workouts or Colt Show.
  - c. Roper Halters ONLY will be allowed at workouts and Colt Show.
- 12. Colts will be released by the committee. Any colt not picked up at the assigned time will have a \$25.00 fee assessed to the exhibitor. All exhibitors will continue to feed and care for their colts until colt is delivered to the buyer or taken home by exhibitor. Exhibitor is responsible for providing a good halter and lead rope to their buyer. If a halter is not provided the cost of purchasing a halter (\$25.00) will be withheld from the exhibitor's check. The exhibitor must set a time with the buyer for delivery of their purchase.

At least five (5) colts must be entered in the Washington County Fair to keep the program active.
