2024-2025 Rules Pasco County Fair Youth Plant Show and Auction

All functions will occur in the Joe Herrmann Greenhouse, apart from the sale taking place in the Dan Cannon Auditorium, on the Pasco County Fairgrounds, Dade City, FL unless stated otherwise.

Dec. 1st, 2024 is the DEADLINE for entries. All entries will be done online this year. There will be NO exceptions for late entries. If your plants are donated make sure you keep a copy of a letter with the date they were donated on it. This must be in your record book. The entry fees are \$6 per entry with a max of 4 entries. Remember to make copies of everything (receipts, letters, entry forms etc.) for your record books.

Class C: Foliage Plants: Purchase deadline is September 20. Each entry shall be one species and grown in <u>identical</u> size containers, 5 to 7 in 6" diameter containers, OR 3 to 5 in 8" diameter containers, OR 2 to 4 in 10", 12" diameter containers. No containers bigger than 12" diameter. Entries containing less than the minimum number of plants will not be accepted. Plants in this class may include, but are not limited to:

Class D: Liners, Rooted Cuttings, Seedlings: Deadline to purchase seeds or stick cuttings is November 30. Each entry shall be two full flats of the same species. Do not mix species in a flat. Flats should be standard nursery size with a maximum container size of 4.5 inches. Entries containing less than the minimum number of plants will not be accepted. Plants in this class may include, but are not limited to: Woody Ornamental, Groundcover or Foliage Liners; Annual or Perennial Bedding Plant Liners; Vegetable and Herb Liners or Seedlings.

Class E: Miscellaneous: Deadline to purchase plants is November 30. **Mixing species** in an entry is acceptable, so scientific names are not required in this class. Entries containing less than the minimum number of plants will not be accepted. Plants in this class may include, but are not limited to:

Purpose: The purpose of the Youth Plant Show and Auction is **educational**. Students should learn to properly produce an agricultural product. Plant projects require the daily management skills used by all landscapers, wholesale and retail nurseries. Students learn to water, fertilize and control pests on schedule to meet the needs of their plants.

Students keep a Plant Production Record Book and learn to keep records that are similar to those needed in any business.

Part of the educational process is also learning to market a product. Students participate in the plant sale in order to learn how to market their product and how an auction works. They are required to write marketing letters to five bidders and to post flyers to promote their product.

As part of marketing, Garden Center Display awards are based on the student's knowledge of their plants and the way they are displayed, since growers and landscapers must have basic knowledge of their plants and use attractive displays to market them.

Eligibility: PLEASE NOTE:

The Pasco County Fair Association rule is for <u>ALL Agriculture Projects</u>. An exhibitor must be a member of a Pasco County 4-H or FFA. Exhibitor must also either live in Pasco County or attend a Pasco County School. If an exhibitor was eligible to show in the 2020 fair but would not be eligible under this new rule, they will be Grandfathered in. This Grandfather Rule will be in place as long as the exhibitor is a continuous exhibitor. Exhibitor must register and tag project to be eligible each year.

*All exhibitors must have an unweighted cumulative 2.0 grade point average or better, as stated on the school issued 2024-2025 report card for the first semester, is required for eligibility to show. Proof of grade point average must be submitted on the Academic Satisfaction Form available on the fair web page and attached to the record book at time of record book check-in. The form must be embossed with the school seal or signed and stamped with school stamp (if available). A copy of the most recent report card must also be included in ALL record books.

Peewee exhibitors must also include report card and Academic Satisfaction Form with their record book.

- Peewees (5 to 7 years old as of Sept. 1, 2024) Peewees must follow the same rules as other exhibitors.
- <u>Due to limited space in the greenhouse Peewees will be grouped with other Peewees,</u> however we will do everything possible to keep clubs together. (Groups with more than 8 Peewees entries will have a space of their own.)
- Peewees will be required to sell their plants.
- Will receive all across the board add-ons.
- Will compete for Peewees Grand Champion.
- May compete for Peewees Garden Center Knowledge awards, however it is not required.
- Do not compete for Overall Grand Champion, Reserve Champion, Class Winners
- Must attend the mandatory exhibitor seminar.
- Must submit a correctly completed entry form online
- Must turn in the Peewees record book, the record book will be judged.
- Must send five (5) buyers letters and attach a copy in the record book.
- Parents are allowed to minimally assist Peewees with their record book and setting up their display.

Sunday, Feb. 16th, 2025, 9:00 to 11:00 AM: Plant Show Exhibitor Check-In at the Joe Herrmann Greenhouse, Pasco County Fairgrounds.

Check In Procedures:

- Step 1: Plants will be inspected by a Department of Plant Inspector for insects or disease and will be rejected if there is an insect or disease problem.
- Step 2: Plants will be inspected for sufficient rooting. If rooting is not sufficient the plants will be rejected. (Sufficient rooting = roots growing to the outside walls of the container)
- Step 3: Exhibitors must verify information at the check in table
- Step 4: Exhibitors receive their assigned place in the greenhouse.
- Step 5: **After** exhibitors complete Step 4, they may begin to move plants into the greenhouse and set up their exhibit.

***Due to overcrowding and safety concerns in the greenhouse no parents, siblings, friends, etc. of elementary, intermediate or senior exhibitors will be allowed in the greenhouse until after the fair opens later in the day.**

Youth Plant Show Committee members will be available to help when and where it is needed. Only 4-H Peewees will be allowed minimal parental help.

No sand or plants other than those entered in the show are allowed in the displays, this includes artificial plants. Any material brought into the greenhouse must be removed after the auction on Sunday.

Sunday, Feb. 16th, **2025 11:00 AM:** Exhibitor meeting will be held under the tent at the greenhouse immediately following check in. The Garden Center Knowledge judging will take place following the meeting. Exhibitors must wear black pants, a white collared shirt & closed toed shoes. (**NO** shorts, t-shirts, bare mid-riffs, tank tops or flip- flops). The Garden Center Display judging and the judging of the plants will begin after the Garden Center Knowledge judging is complete. Awards will be posted in the greenhouse by 7:00 p.m. the following day.

Feb. 16th - **23**rd, **2025 3:00 PM:** The greenhouse will open each day at 3:00 PM for exhibitors to water and maintain their plant exhibit as needed. Youth Plant Show Committee members will **NOT** water plants for exhibitors unless prior arrangements have been made.

Feb. 23rd, 2025 Award and Auction Procedures:

- Step 1: **12:30PM**: Exhibitors are required to help with the luncheon at the Dan Cannon Auditorium. Exhibitors must wear black pants, a white collared shirt & closed toed shoes. (**NO** shorts, t-shirts, bare mid-riffs, tank tops or flip- flops).
- Step 2: 1:30 PM: Exhibitor meeting in the Dan Cannon Auditorium
- Step 2: 1:45 PM: Youth Plant Show Awards
- Step 3: 2:00 PM: Auction begins in the Dan Cannon Auditorium.

Check Out Procedures:

- Step 1: Immediately following the end auction: Exhibitors must return to their displays in the greenhouse.
- Step 2: The buyer will present you with a copy of their receipts, you will then help the buyer load their plants.

Step 3: Once all of your plants have been loaded, your area is clean and your hand has been stamped you must report to the exhibitor table to pick up your buyer's information. You will have to wait to be released till after all buyers are checked out in the Dan Cannon and all exhibitor invoices are printed out. (This could take at least an hour after the sale ends.) You need to bring your completed buyer's letters and envelopes with stamps on them with you to the sale. They can be written the day before with the exception of whom it is to. Once you receive the buyer's information you can address the letters and envelopes. You need to write a letter for every entry you will be selling. If you are selling four entries, then you will need four letters. Cards inside the buyer's gifts DO NOT count as your thank you letters.

Step 4: Upon turning in your thank you letters you will be given your record books and you will be free to go.

Within two weeks following the fair you will receive a list containing information for all add-ons given. It will be your responsibility to send them thank you letters. You will only receive a list if you have add-ons.

Checks will be given out no earlier than the middle of May 2025.

Restrictions:

- No Citrus of any type is allowed
- Patented plants must be accompanied with patent tags.
- Category I Invasive Plants, Florida Exotic Pest Plant Council (www.fleppc.org/01list.htm) cannot be exhibited.
- Plants will be inspected by the Division of Plant Industries for insects and diseases. Plants
 infested by insects or diseases will be rejected. DPI Inspector's decision is final.
- Only blue and red ribbon plants will be sold.
- White ribbon plants must be removed from the exhibit area after judging.
- <u>All plants exhibited</u> must be sold to the highest bidder at the Pasco County Fair Youth Plant Auction.
- The Pasco County Fair Youth Plant Show Committee reserves the right to interpret show rules.
- The Pasco County Fair Youth Plant Show Committee reserves the right to adjust exhibitor spaces to accommodate all exhibitors.

Judging: Plants will be judged by criteria set forth by the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, Division of Plant Industries, and the Florida Grades and Standards for nursery stock. Plants are judged as Florida Fancy (blue ribbon), Florida #1 (red ribbon), or Florida #2 (white ribbon). Judges decisions are final.

Garden Center Display will be judged by the criteria on the score card in the back of the Plant Production Record Book. A second impartial judge will break any ties. Judge's decisions are final.

Garden Center Knowledge will be judged by the criteria on the score card in the back of the Plant Production Record Book. A second impartial judge will break any ties. Judge's decisions are final.

Plant Production Record Books will be judged by the criteria on the score card in the back of the Plant Production Record Book. A second impartial judge will break any ties. Judge's decisions are final.

Awards: Plant awards will be posted in the greenhouse by 7:00 PM on the day after judging. All other awards will be posted the day of the auction.

Plant Production Record Books: All exhibitors are required to keep a Plant Production Record Book. Record Books must be handwritten by the exhibitor, except the bidder letters, which may be done by word processing, printed and added into the Record Book. 4-H Peewees are allowed assistance from their parents.

Plant Production Record Books can be downloaded from <u>www.pascocountyfair.com</u>. Books will be judged by criteria found on the score card in the back of the Plant Production Record Book.

Bidder Letters: All exhibitors, including Peewees must mail five letters inviting their bidders to the Youth Plant Sale. Exhibitors must keep copies to include with their record book. Exhibitors **WILL** be fined 10% of the individual's gross income per letter not enclosed in the record book. Exhibitors may want to include copies of the Bidders Guide (included at the end of this rule book) with their personal letters. Exhibitors may want to include photos with their letters. Marketing is an important skill for exhibitors to learn.

Auction and Sale Order: The auction will begin at 2:00 PM on the last Sunday of fair week in the Dan Cannon Auditorium.

The Grand Champion will be sold first, followed by the Reserve Champion and 4-H Peewee Grand Champion. Class Champions will sell next.

All other exhibitors will sell by randomly assigned numbers.

No re-sale of plants will be allowed.

Commission: The Pasco County Fair Association will charge a 5% commission fee deducted from all sales to cover the expenses of the show.

Plants are judged by master gardeners / nurseryman from neighboring counties with many years of experience. The plants must meet the grades and standards of our nursery industry (Florida Fancy, Florida #1, Florida #2). Their place in the auction is based on where the judges placed their plants in the show.

A Grand Champion is chosen from the most highly graded plants and is sold first at the auction. However, there are **no restrictions** on bidders and buyers (i.e. relatives may bid / buy and there is no limit on prices). There will be no re-sale of plants.
