- No pre-show milk-out, over extended udders will be discriminated against.
- Two (2) animals per class except group classes. No Exceptions.
- Animals will be shown by breed NO male goats are allowed on the fairgrounds.
- In all group classes, one (1) animal may be borrowed to complete a group.
- September 1st is to be used as the base date for computing ages in all classes. You may enter two (2) entries per exhibitor in each group class, providing the animals are all different.
- All pens must be cleaned daily before the fair is open to the public (by 10:00am).
