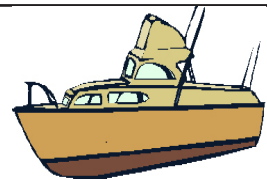
Benton County Fair General Rules

1. Upon entering fairgrounds be advised that photographs or videos may be taken of the activities or events and used for future fair promotions, publications and social media.
2. No person will be permitted to distribute advertising matter on fairgrounds except from their place of business or exhibit. Posting or distribution of any kind is strictly prohibited.
3. No pets, skateboards, rollerskates, inline skates, bikes, motorized scooters, ATV's or golf carts with the exception of handicap scooter allowed on the fairgrounds. The fairboard can authorize acceptance of special needs by stopping at the office for permission. Use of motorized vehicles on fair grounds during fair week limited only to golf carts, 4-wheelers, gators and the like which are in use by the Fair Board and staff will be permitted during the fair.
4. **No pets shall be allowed** on the fairgrounds premises unless:
 - A.) It is a bonifide service animal
 - B.) Its presence is authorized by the fair board in advance of its attendance and it is either leashed or kenneled at all times while on site.
 - C.) Its presence is part of an orgainzed and announced fair activity.Anyone violating this rule will be asked to take their animal off fairgrounds immediately upon being asked by any fair official or law enforcement personnel.
5. No smoking or vaping inside any of the buildings. No marijuana is allowed on the grounds.
6. No person shall bring alcoholic beverages onto the fairgrounds during the fair.
7. No refunds for any event on fairgrounds during the fair once the event has started.
8. The greatest possible care will be executed by the Benton County Fair Board to protect patrons while at the fair, however, each individual will be held personally responsible for his or her actions and the fairboard will not be accountable or responsible for injury.

THE EXHIBITOR IS RESPONSIBLE TO COMPLETE THE REQUIREMENTS AND INCLUDE ANY PAPERWORK DOCUMENTATION THAT IS REQUIRED WITH YOUR REGISTRATION FORM.

FOR AN EXPLANATION OF THE HEALTH REGULATIONS GOVERNING BOTH 4-H AND OPEN CLASS ANIMAL EXHIBITS, PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING:

REQUIREMENTS FOR LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING FROM MINNESOTA MUST MEET MINNESOTA REQUIREMENTS

Livestock or poultry known by the exhibitor to have an infectious, communicable disease or to have been exposed to an infectious, communicable disease, or to be from a quarantined herd or flock may not be entered in an exhibition. Warts and ringworm are considered communicable diseases. Therefore, livestock affected by these diseases cannot be exhibited. A statement from a veterinarian that an animal is being treated for these diseases is not acceptable. All livestock will be inspected by the Official Veterinarian on the opening day of the exhibition and daily during the exhibition. The Official Veterinarian will order the immediate removal to a quarantine facility or removal from the exhibition premises of any livestock with symptoms of infectious or communicable diseases. Animals placed in a quarantine facility must remain there until removed from the exhibition premises. They may not enter a show ring. This includes livestock with warts or ringworm. All testing must be conducted prior to the exhibition, and record of the test results on a test chart or intrastate Health Certificate must accompany the tested animals. Livestock and poultry entered in a petting exhibit are not exempt from the exhibition rules if the animals are from more than one farm or there are other animals at the exhibit.

DOGS: If over 6 months of age, must be accompanied by a Certificate of Rabies Vaccination issued by a licensed veterinarian. The dog must be immunized by or under the supervision of a licensed veterinarian with a vaccine licensed by the USDA and used in accordance with the label and be within the duration period for that vaccine.

REQUIREMENTS FOR LIVESTOCK AND POULTRY ORIGINATING FROM STATES OTHER THAN MINNESOTA:

CATTLE, SWINE, SHEEP, GOATS AND POULTRY: Originating from states other than Minnesota must meet the Minnesota Importation requirements in addition to the requirements outlined in this summary. Health certificates must list the Minnesota Exhibition as consignee, and will be accepted if examination and tests are conducted within 90 days prior to the exhibition except swine pseudorabies tests must be made within 30 days prior to the exhibition.

HORSES AND DOGS: Requirements are the same for those originating from Minnesota.

LOCAL FAIRBOARD OPTIONS: The exhibition management may adopt more but not less restrictive health requirements than required by state rules.

GENERAL RULES:

1. The Benton County Agricultural Society reserves the right to reject or remove any exhibit or individual from the fair grounds.
2. **No animals will be permitted to be taken away before 5:00 p.m. on the last day of the Fair.**
4. All exhibitors with animals must be sure that their stock is entered in the proper class. It will be the duty of the judge to rule out any animals not answering the entry and no change or alteration will be permitted after the entries are placed in the hands of the clerk.
5. The fairboard will take every precaution in its power for preservation of livestock on exhibition, but will not be responsible for loss by theft, fire or damage that may occur in the delivery.
6. No advertising of any kind shall be permitted on the grounds unless space is rented, unless approved by the Board of

Directors and signed off by the Secretary.

7. The management will not be responsible for typographical errors in the list, but should any occur, same will be interpreted by the Executive Committee.
8. No animal will be allowed to compete for cash premiums that is not named and numbered in this premium list.
9. Benton County residents exhibitors shall be given priority in limited entry classes. Exhibitors are strongly encouraged to keep their animals at the fair from Friday thru close of fair on Sunday.
10. If the receipts should prove insufficient to meet all demands, the Society reserves the right to first pay all bonafide expenses of the Fair and pay premiums prorated with the balance on hand.
11. Pens will be assigned by barn supervisors.
12. A parking pass is required to park on-grounds. Passes may be purchased at livestock gate or at fair office. Livestock trailers **MUST** park in designated areas.

SPECIAL RULES GOVERNING COMMITTEES

1. No person will be permitted to interfere with the committee members or judges while in the performance of their duties. In case of doubt as to their power, committee will refer the matter to the Fair Secretary.
2. Stalls will be provided at a charge of \$10.00 per head for beef and \$5.00 per head for dairy. Pens will be provided for sheep, goats and lambs at \$5.00 per head. Entry/pen fees must be included with registration form and paid in advance.
3. All appeal cases shall be settled by the executive committee at a future meeting when all parties interested shall be notified to appear.
4. Awards will be deemed final, unless appealed from the protest filed with the Secretary before the close of the Fair.
5. No animal shall be entered in more than one class with these exceptions: a. In all divisions as one of the sweepstakes. b. An animal may compete in its regular class and also as one of a herd or pen.
6. No animal will be awarded a prize unless promptly brought into show ring when lot is called. Animals entered and not brought into the ring at the proper time, unless excused by the Superintendent will be charged \$3.00 per day for the use of pen/stall.
7. Judges shall give reasons for their decisions, embracing the value of desirable qualities of the animal to which premiums are awarded.
8. The Superintendent of each department will confirm that the judging reports are correct as reported for their departments.
9. Animals that are leased may only be shown by the person that is leasing the animal. Owner of the leased animal may not show the leased animal in competition. Exception: Llamas.
10. The directors of the Benton County Fair reserve the right to release or take control of any animals that are found to be unsafe or that could cause potential harm to the public. Animals that are found to be unhealthy or have potential infections to other animals or humans by owners or veterinarians will be asked to remove the animals from the grounds. Decisions of the health and safety of the livestock being exhibited will be done by the Boards Consumer Protection committee which oversees the health and safety of all of our fair attendees.

ATTENTION 2024 CATTLE EXHIBITORS:

PER MN BOARD OF ANIMAL HEALTH:
New rules have been drafted with animal traceability in mind. The Board has taken a proactive approach that enhances Minnesota's ability to effectively trace livestock during a disease event. All cattle, including breeding cattle for exhibition must be officially identified upon movement from the herd to another location. All cattle must be officially identified through the State of Minnesota's ID process.

**POULTRY:
EXCEPT WATERFOWL/PIGEONS**

Accompanied by an official form identifying the fowl by using a leg or wire band and with a record of a negative test for pullorum-typhoid conducted within 90 days prior to entry to the exhibition or a record of origin from parent stock tested negative within 12 months prior to entry to the exhibition.
Turkeys must be tested at a laboratory for typhimurium and mycoplasmas or have a statement of origin if less than 5 months old.

RULES AND REGULATIONS:

1. Must be free from any infectious communicable disease. A veterinarian will check all birds and sick birds will be quarantined.
2. All poultry must be negative to the rapid whole blood test for pullorum and typhoid disease applied within 90 days prior to opening date of exhibition. No test required on poultry originating directly from parent stock that is tested and negative.
3. All birds must be banded.
4. Coops will be provided by the fair. Feed and care of birds will be done by exhibitor.
5. All birds must qualify according to American Standard of Perfection. Birds will be judged by comparison and entrants should take note that the judge is authorized to disqualify birds not meeting the Standard of Perfection.
6. Fair board is not responsible for theft, vandalism or entries left after 6:00 pm on Sunday, Aug 4.
7. Only those breeds and varieties listed in State Fair Premium Book will be eligible to compete for cash prizes.

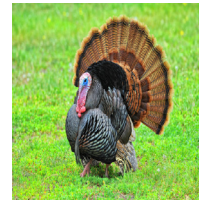

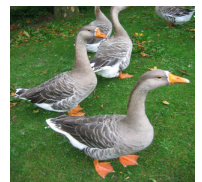
