2024 HAY SHOW PARTICIPANT RULES

- 1. Entries for Hay Show must be produced in Smith County or by producers residing in Smith County.
- 2. An entry consists of **one small sack** (lunch bag size) full of hay. All entries become property of the Hay Show Committee.
- 3. There are no entry fees to participate.
- 4. Hay can be entered July 29^{th} August 3^{rd} at one of the following locations:

Official entry cards must be attached to each entry and will be available at each location listed above.

- 5. Hay samples will be submitted for testing on August 7th.
- 6. Hay will be judged by chemical score as follows: % crude protein + (2 * TDN). Example: 10% crude protein hay with 61 TDN = 10 + (2 * 61) = 132.
 *Crude protein values will be capped at 12%
- 7. Hay show results will be announced at the Howdy Neighbor Bar-B-Que on September 23rd at 11:30am in the Rose Garden Center.
- 8. Blue, red, and white ribbons will be awarded. Additional awards presented to Top 10 Producers. Participants will be notified if they are in the top producers prior to the Howdy Neighbor Bar-B-Que.
