- Entries must have been completed in past 3 years and have not been shown previously at the fair.
- Entries will be released for pickup AFTER 5:30 pm on SUNDAY, JULY 21.
- Judging will be TUESDAY, JULY 16 JUDGING IS CLOSED
- The Exhibitor's name must be the person who made the item, if the item is exhibited by another maker, the item will not be judged and will be "for display only".
- Exhibits may be disqualified if the rules are not followed
- Dried exhibits will be in a glass canning jar with lid, others will not be accepted
- Entries must have been processed since the end of the 2021 Columbia County Fair
- Artificial flavorings, colorings, or preservatives will automatically disqualify entries, exceptions are Mint, Kiwi, and Maraschino
- Canned foods are judged on color, clarity, texture, shape, back, and flavor.
- The pack should be neat and uniform, with whole or uniform pieces filling the jar covered with liquid
- The judges may open any jar for inspection. However, if other visible characteristics of product eliminate the product from consideration of award, the judge is not obligated to open for further consideration
- Jellies should retain their natural color, be transparent, and cut easily, yet hold their shape (jellies are made with juice)
- Jams and preserves should contain pieces of fruits that are firm, with clear, thick syrup (jams are made with fruit)
- Butters (fruit that has been pressed through a sieve) should be of a standard size
- All jams and jellies should have 1/4" headspace
- Freezer jams are not allowed
- DO NOT PUT YOUR NAME ON CANNED GOODS
- Beer and Wine Exhibitor must be over 21 years of age
- Beer and Wine Exhibitor must enter actual product and an identical bottle of water for display purposes, as alcohol is not permitted by law to be displayed during fair

- Flowers in Division in 1-16 must be grown by exhibitor
- Locally grown plants only

- The Department Superintendent reserves the right to remove any exhibit that is no longer fresh
- Container Gardens should be readily moveable by superintendent

Flower Hints:

- Cut your flowers late in the afternoon the day before they are submitted. Immediately place in deep lukewarm water treated with floral preserved, keeping out of drafts and dark places.
- Select material in its prime, pest free, cutting stem as long as possible. Specimens should be as uniform in size and quality as possible
- Foliage and stems count in judging as well as blossoms. Groom plants well. Foliage should not extend into water.
- Remove all wilted flowers at check-in. Do not remove stamens from lilies
- Flowers must carry own attached foliage. All stems should be proportionate to flowers. Container should be proportionate to flowers.
- Unless otherwise specified, when more than 1 spray/stem is required they should be uniform in color and variety.
- Flower shows are meant to be educational as well as beautiful; please name varieties, to add value and points
- Please De-Bug and De-Bud all entries as possible
