The Family Living Exhibit of the Sumter County Fair is open to ALL YOUTH ages 5-18. The fair will follow the age divisions set forth by the Florida 4-H program. All ages are as of September 1st of the current 4-H year. All youth exhibitors are responsible for knowing the criteria specified in each exhibit class and entry category. It is also the exhibitor's responsibility to register and follow the guidelines in this document. If you have questions, please contact the UF/IFAS Extension Sumter County office at 352-569-6863.

- 1. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE PRE-REGISTERED ON THE EXHIBIT ENTRY FORM.
- 2. All entries should be owned, produced, or made by the YOUTH EXHIBITOR, and clearly marked with the name, age, and club/school information on affixed entry tag.
- 3. All entries must have been completed since March 1, 2024, or never entered.
- 4. All entries are sent and exhibited at the owner's risk. While every precaution will be taken to protect exhibits, the Sumter County Fair, Family Living Exhibit volunteers, or UF/IFAS Extension Sumter County employees are not responsible for any accidental loss or damage.
- 5. All entries must be entered during published check in times with a *completed* entry form. **NO EARLY ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.**
- <u>DO NOT take entries to the Fair office</u>. These items will not be accepted, nor will we be held responsible for these items.
- 7. Exhibits may be unattended during non-fair hours.
- 8. Exhibits must be picked up during check-out times. DO NOT remove exhibits early. **Unclaimed items will not be stored, nor will we be held responsible for these items.** Youth exhibits picked up early will not receive premium money.
- Premium money will be available during check-out or during regular office hours at the UF/IFAS Extension Office. 4-H leaders may pick up premium money for their members. All premiums must be picked up at pick up. Any premiums left will be forfeited.
- 10. The modified Danish System of judging will be used in placing awards by oriented volunteers. The Danish System is based on a standard of quality. The judge's decision is final.
- 11. Entries will be judged according to 4-H age divisions. All ages are determined as of September 1st, 2024.

JUDGING:

All Cloverbuds (5-7 ages) will receive a green participation rosette. Each entry will be judged according to Blue, Red, or White ribbon based on the Danish System. Every article will receive a Blue, Red or White strip ribbon. Blue is considered above average or excellent quality, Red is average quality, and White is below average quality. A <u>First-Place</u> article will then be chosen from *each Entry* category and eligible to be considered for the <u>Best of Show</u> for *each Class*. Each <u>First Place</u> will receive a Rosette Ribbon and each <u>Best of Show</u> will receive a Purple Rosette Ribbon.

PREMIUMS & AWARDS:

<u>Blue, Red or White Ribbons</u> given to each individual item <u>FIRST PLACE</u> IN EACH *ENTRY* CATEGORY = BLUE RIBBON & \$5.00 <u>BEST OF SHOW</u> IN EACH *CLASS* = Purple ROSETTE & \$10.00

CLASS A - BAKED GOODS

- 1. All exhibits must be entered on a small disposable plate in a sealed plastic bag or other disposable, clear container. Not responsible for containers.
- 2. Each entry must be accompanied by the recipe on a *3x5 index card* and show all ingredients used, as well as the method of preparation.
- 3. No refrigerated entries allowed.
- 4. Entire Baked Good must be entered. (Example: entire cake, not just a slice of cake)
- 5. Entries will be judged the following day of check in.
- 6. Youth may enter up to **2 different** items in each ENTRY category.

CLASS EE-QUILTING

- 1. Quilts may be appliquéd, pieced, embroidered, or a combination of quilting techniques. The quilts may be by an individual, two people, or a group of three or more.
- 2. A quilt by an individual must have been pieced, quilted (either by hand or machine), and finished by an individual. A two-person quilt is one that two people work on in the construction or finishing in any way. This includes quilting done for hire. A group quilt is one created by three or more people.
- 3. Hand quilting is to be entered in this category, quilting must be done by the person (or persons) entering the quilt.
- 4. Machine quilting entry form must reflect whether the quilting was done on a longarm machine (quilting by hire) or a regular sewing machine.
- 5. Youth may enter up to **2 different** items in each ENTRY category.

- 2. Banner designs may be painted, glued or sewn, but all decorations and lettering must be securely fastened to the banner.
- 3. All banners must display the name of their 4-H club. (Must use clover appropriately).
- 4. Banners may not be commercially made and must be made in the current 4-H year. Banners should be the work of the 4-H club members.
- 5. Only quality banners will be displayed.
- 6. Banners will be judged based on creativity, neatness, and unique representation of the 4-H club.
- 7. 1 entry per 4-H club.

CLASS Q - 4-H DIGITAL DESIGN CONTEST

- 2. The entry must be saved as a pdf file, with the exemption of the PowerPoint entries. All files should be saved as follows: Last Name, First Name, County, Age Division, Class. (example: Clover, Johnny, Sumter County, Senior, Brochure)
- 3. The entry must also be printed for display during the fair.
- 4. Graphics become the property of Florida 4-H upon entry and may be used for promotional purposes by Florida 4-H.
- 5. No hand drawn entries will be accepted.
- 6. The entries will be judged on font style and graphics, flow of design, color, educational components, and clear delivery message.
- 7. Use of copyrighted or protected characters or logos is prohibited. Use of the 4-H Emblem must be following the graphics standards set by the USDA. Those standards can be found at: <u>4-H Name & Emblem</u>
- 8. All blue-ribbon entries will be submitted to the state graphic design contest. Youth must submit photos electronically by June 1st to <u>smithadam@ufl.edu</u>
