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ELIGIBILITY:

- Exhibitors must be a current member of Osceola County 4-H, FFA, or FCCLA
 - Junior Exhibitors (8-10 years old as of September 1st of current school year)
 - o Intermediate Exhibitors (11-13 years old as of September 1st of current school year)
 - Senior Exhibitors (14-18 years old as of September 1st of current school year)

REGISTRATION:

• All Exhibitors are required to register all entries online on the Fair Website; under YE by the registration deadline.

IF YOU ARE ASKED TO PAY YOU ARE NOT IN YOUTH EXHIBITS.

- Please ensure that you hit SUBMIT at the end of your entry so that you will receive a fair entry confirmation.
- Please print out your confirmation so you will have a record of your entries. This confirmation may be required at check in to confirm all entries.
- Additional entries will not be accepted.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

- All animals are required to be free of disease, parasites, and mites.
- If not free of the listed above, they will be disqualified.
- All animals will be checked at check-in.

ANIMAL ELIGIBILITY:

- All small animals must be left in their own cages at the fair.
- ALL CAGES ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE A LOCK TO SECURE CAGE. This is for the protection of your animal. ALL AQUARIUMS ARE REQUIRED to have secure cover or ratchet lock.
- See small animal section or rabbit and poultry committee for rules and regulations.

NOTICE: KVLS IS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR LOST, DAMAGE, OR STOLEN ITEMS REGISTERED FOR PUBLIC VIEW. ITEMS MAY BE BROKEN OR STOLEN WHILE ON DISPLAY AT THE FAIR.

CHECK-IN SATURDAY:

All entries will be turned in on check in day except for Baked Goods, Small Animals and Horticulture. Check-in will be from 12-4 pm. Check the fair website for exact dates and times as they are subject to change.

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CHECK-IN THURSDAY:

All Baked Goods, Horticulture and Small Animals will be checked in from 5-7 pm.

Please check the online Event Calendar for a complete listing of award ceremony dates and times, as these are subject to change.

PREMIUMS:

ALL PREMIUMS ARE THE SAME UNLESS OTHERWISE NOTED IN SECTIONS

- Ribbons:
 - 1st Blue \$5.00 | 2nd Red \$3.00 | 3rd White \$2.00
 - Best in Class (Pink) \$7.00 | Best in Show (Purple) \$25.00
 - Exhibitors will be paid FOR EACH AWARD EARNED (Premiums are stacked)
- To qualify for Best in Class or Best in Show, you must place with a Blue Ribbon.
 - Best in Class and Best in Show may not be awarded to every class.
 - These awards may be awarded based on number of entries and Judges discretion.
- All premium checks will be mailed to the exhibitors after the fair. Please allow up to 8 weeks.
- Any exhibits removed before checkout time will forfeit their premium money unless prior arrangements have been made with Youth Exhibit Chair or Co-Chair.
- Any exhibits NOT PICKED UP during checkout time will forfeit their project unless previous arrangements have been made.
- Anyone can pick up your exhibits if they have your claim checks. They will be asked to sign for them.
- No Exhibits will be held in the Fair or Extension Services after checkout day.
- Any remaining items will be discarded unless prior arrangements have been made with the Youth Exhibit Chair.
- Awards will be presented during the *Youth Exhibit Awards*, this ceremony will not include Share the Fun and Fashion Revue as those will be awarded at the time of the show.
- The Superior Exhibitor Award is for those that have gone above and beyond. The award availability is based on sponsorship.
- All entries (except live animal exhibits) must be dry. (no wet glue or other substances that have not fully dried, including water)
- Any late entries will be for display only. No premiums will be awarded to late entries.

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SCORING

We use the Danish method of judging. It does not judge one person's work against another. It is an evaluation made against the project's standard. A judge will evaluate the requirements and awards according to the degree that the project meets the standards.

The purpose of this system is to give all exhibitors recognition for the hours of hard work and dedication they have put in to complete each project while comparing it to the standard for that project. This system is used to help youth improve their skills, recognize their effort, encourage them to continue with their projects, and advise them on how they may improve.

Below is a breakdown for each award:

Blue Ribbon (Excellent): Awarded to those entries that exceed the average standard. The workmanship meets the standards but has a few flaws.

Red Ribbon (Good): Awarded to those entries that meet or are slightly below the average standard for that class. The workmanship meet expectations but has multiple flaws.

White Ribbon (Fair): Awarded to those entries that do not meet average standard. The level of accomplishment is less than expected.

No Ribbon: this will be given if exhibitors fail to follow rules, submit their project late, or fail to meet the minimum reasonable expectation.

Best in Show (Superior): Awarded to those entries that have met and far exceed the average standards established. The workmanship is outstanding with minimal flaws. There is typically one per section.

Best in Class (Incredible): Awarded to those entries that have met and slightly exceed the average standards. established. The workmanship is outstanding with some flaws. There is typically one per class awarded.

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SECTION 1 | TABLETOPS/TRI-FOLD DISPLAY BOARD

RULES:

- Each Osceola County 4-H, FFA or FCCLA member may enter FOUR (4) CLASSES, BUT ONLY ONE (1)
 ENTRY PER CLASS.
- You must enter a new display each year. Please add Name, Club or Chapter,
 Current Fair Year, Age and Phone Number in pen or marker on back of display. Failure to include this information can result in a reduced score or disqualification.
- A 4-H, FFA or FCCLA emblem is **suggested** on all tabletop exhibits.
- Only Tri-fold Exhibit Boards will be accepted. Please do not use staples.
- Tri-fold size must be 27in x 39in to 36in x48in. Other sizes may be disqualified.
- Only one board can be used in the display.
- Full display cannot exceed the 36in height.
- NOT Allowed in display: live animals/insects/plants, food items, flammable materials, ie. Matches, lighters, etc.

Tips for a Successful Project

• Select a class from the list below: Choose a subject/topic that goes along with the class.

Example: Class 26- Clothing/Sewing Topic-Types of fabric and seams

Example: Class 18-Shooting Sports Topic- Archery

• **Specific Subject to teach/share message:** The goal is to teach the viewer or get a message to the viewer. Many topics are broad so narrow the information to fit your trifold area.

Example: appropriate seam for cotton versus silk

Example: Parts of a bow and arrow

Title: Have a title on the project that tells the viewer what the content is. Keep your title short. Attract
attention.

Example: Super Seams
Example: Bulls Eye!

- **Techniques to Grab Attention:** Use 3-D objects, colors, actual objects related to the topic, illustrations, select lettering that is simple and easy to read. Use a ruler to keep letters the same size and straight.
- Arrangement: Simple, uncluttered arrangement of material will keep your project aesthetically
 pleasing. Less is more. Use bullets instead of paragraphs. Designs should draw the viewers eyes to a
 center of interest.
- Attaching 2D and/or 3D items: Make sure items are attached neatly and securely. Rubber cement,
 spray mount, and clear tape are great adhesive. Hot glue or strong craft glue (like E-6000) for 3D items.

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- **Citations:** Make sure to cite the source for content and/or illustrations. Put this on the front of the board. Citations can be handwritten or typed. <u>Seniors should use proper MLA format.</u>
- **Text:** Punctuation and spelling should be age appropriate. Text can be handwritten, typed, or a combination of both.
- **Personalization:** Include photos with exhibitors or own handwriting. Will NOT be judged on penmanship.

What Judges Look For:

- Good design Simple, neat, orderly layout. Color and fonts are pleasing to the eye and used effectively.
- **Text** Easy to read from a distance.
- Originality/Creativity Does the display show imagination, is this topic displayed in a new way, did the exhibitor use innovative ways to present the material.
- **Educational** Exhibitor has a main idea/message that is effectively displayed and accurate. Make sure the message is appropriate for the audience,
- Age Appropriate Quality of the work should reflect the age and experience level of the exhibitor. A
 younger exhibitor may not be as neat as a Senior exhibitor.

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SECTION 2 | SEWING, CROCHETING, NEEDLEWORK

RULES:

- Open to all Osceola County 4-H, FFA or FCCLA members may enter SIX (6) CLASSES, BUT ONLY ONE (1)ENTRIES PER CLASS.
- All items must be made by the exhibitor, after the end of previous year's Fair and not exhibited previously. Items must be clean, pressed and in good condition.
- All sewing items must be brought to the SATURDAY Youth Exhibit check-in from 2-4 pm.
- All construction must be completed by hand or use of a SEWING MACHINE.
- No tied blankets will be accepted.
- Pillows and weaving projects must be within 5"x5" to 16"x16" overall size parameters, (suggestion: cut fabric 16x16 before sewing).

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SECTION 3 | BAKED GOODS

RULES:

- Open to all Osceola County 4-H, FFA or FCCLA member may enter THREE (3) CLASSES, BUT ONLY ONE
 (1) ENTRY PER CLASS.
- A **recipe form is needed** and is in Forms on the fair website **UNDER YOUTH EXHIBITS** and must be submitted with your entry.
- Recipe must be attached baked goods for judges. Please list ingredients and cooking information.
- All baked goods must be brought on Thursday at Youth Exhibit check-in from 5-7 pm.

GENERAL RULES:

- Items must be in a **DISPOSABLE CONTAINER.** (photos of entries will be displayed in leu of displaying actual product)
- Items must be cooked (except candy), must contain flour (except candy), and cannot use raw eggs in recipe or have meringue (all eggs must be cooked or baked into recipe) and require NO REFRIGERATION.
- No "Friendship" bread or other products that are "aged" without refrigeration before baking. A minimum of five ingredients is required.
- A new recipe is required each year.
 - For example, if you made Grandma's chocolate cookies last year you cannot make them again this year.
- NO PRE-PACKAGED, BOXED PRODUCTS OR PREMADE INGREDIENTS MAY BE ENTERED (for example, no boxed cake mixes, frozen bread or pre-made pie crusts, etc.).

CLASSES:

Must submit required quantity to qualify for judging AND label name of recipe on top of the provided container. (no penalty for turning in a whole pie instead of ½)

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SECTION 4 | PHOTO EXHIBITION

PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST OBJECTIVES:

• To develop photography skills in composition, light, story line, posing, and awareness.

DISQUALIFICATIONS OF ENTRIES:

• Entries that do not follow the rules, division and class guidelines or any general guidelines will automatically be disqualified.

Rules:

- All 4-H, FFA or FCCLA members may enter four (4) CLASSES, BUT ONLY ONE (1) ENTRY PER CLASS.
- Photographs may only be entered into one class.
- Photos must have provided description tags attached BEFORE check in. They are provided here to print.
- Best In Show for each category and age group will be qualified to go to the District 4 H
 Photography Contest (except for Photo Story).

Eligibility of Photos:

- All photographs must have been taken within one year of the date of the photo contest.
- Recognizable pictures of any adult or youth under the age of 18 must include a "Model release" signature. If a minor is in the photo, the signature MUST come from their parent or guardian.

Presentation of Photos:

- Photos submitted must be 8x10 and mounted properly for an overall maximum size of 8x10.
- All prints must be securely and permanently mounted on a non-frame board that may be of 5mm foam board or mat board no larger than photo and trimmed neatly (no rough or uneven edges).
 - No framing (of any kind) is allowed.

Alterations of Photos:

 Although slightly computer enhanced photos are allowed, such as cropping, trimming, adjusting lighting, and red eye reduction; substantially altered photography, such as changing colors, applying design styles or using computer graphics will disqualify entry.

Refusal Rights:

- KVLS reserves the right to refuse inappropriate or unsuitable entries.
- Photograph must NOT be offensive, degrading, racists, or contain pornography of any form.

Any photo where the main subject(s) is a person or people. Still shots or active. **If the person's face is identifiable a photo release MUST be signed and attached to the entry for EACH person pictured. Photo release is available on fair website or on next page.

06. Junior (8-10) | 16. Intermediate (11-13) | 26. Senior (14-18)

- A minimum of 3 photos to a maximum of 4 photos must be submitted individually in this class. Each
 photo must be 8x10 and no larger and individually mounted properly with at least one rope, cord or
 ribbon holding the photos in sequence. (May use two, ropes, cords, etc. for better mounting.)
 - All photos must be taken and mounted in the same direction. (All horizontal or all vertical).

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• On the back of the photo on the label/ID tag, please outline the sequence of the photos and provide an explanation about your "Photo Story".

SECTION 5 | POSTER ART

RULES:

- Each Osceola County 4-H, FFA or FCCLA member may enter ONE (1) entry.
- The Poster Art Program gives exhibitors an opportunity to use the visual medium of poster fine art to promote public understanding and support of the 4H, FFA, or FCCLA programs.
- Individuals are encouraged to develop their visual communication skills by also identifying locations to display posters to communicate to external audiences about 4H, FFA, or FCCLA programs.
- Poster size should be no larger than 11 x 14 (half of a poster board). Larger boards will be disqualified.)

DESCRIPTION OF MEDIUMS:

Apply any one of the 4-H mission themes to their poster art design.

The primary art medium for creating the poster art must fall into one of the following mediums descriptions:

WATERCOLOR | this class includes paints and pencils that use water as a solvent.

PEN & INK | Ink pens, including gel and ink paints, come in an array of colors including metallic, fluorescent, glow-in-the-dark, and more.

PENCIL | this class includes both colored and graphite pencils.

MARKER | Markers contain a reservoir of soluble ink that is wicked onto a drawing or writing surface through a felt or nylon tip.

CRAYON | this class includes chalk, conté crayons, grease crayon, charcoal, wax crayon, pastels, and litho.

ACRYLIC | this class includes all techniques applied to acrylic paints.

SPECIAL EFFECTS | this class includes collages, varnishes, gouache paint, oil paints, and other fine art mediums.

COMPUTER ENHANCED | this class includes computer or machine drawn images, scrapbooking, stencil letters, and foam letters.

Examples on how to apply one of the themes to a poster include: Illustrations of youth preparing healthy meals, curriculum icons, people speaking about programs at a county commission meeting, individuals working with the rocketry curriculum, anti-smoking themes, youth in a leadership role, or exploring beekeeping as a hobby.

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SECTION 9 | HORTICULTURE

HORTICULTURE CHECK-IN DAY – THURSDAY PRIOR TO FAIR

RULES:

- Each Osceola County 4-H, FFA or FCCLA member may enter SIX (6) CLASSES, BUT ONLY ONE (1) ENTRY PER CLASS.
- The **exhibitor must grow plants** at least sixty (60) days prior to the fair and all entries must be **clean, insect free, disease free.** Plants will be inspected for insects and disease at check in.
- Exhibitor is responsible for watering plant during fair hours. **NOTE: Final judging may occur** after fair opens
- Citrus Trees should be entered in the Citrus Tree Contest (Department CTC).
- Plants will be on display indoors for ten (10) days; it is recommended that only plants suited to low light conditions be entered.
- Exhibitors are responsible for labeling all plants with common botanical names. Plants without proper plant identification may be disqualified. Exhibiting member are Responsible for providing their own labels.
- An interview with the Horticulture agent or a

<u>a representative on check in day may be required</u> to all exhibiting members and must be present during check in to answer a few questions. Watch for email from Horticulture for more details. If there is a conflict that makes it so an exhibitor is unavailable during the interview time the horticulture agent will set a time on Friday for the interview.

WORKSHOPS:

Osceola County Extension Services often provides horticulture workshops prior to Fair. These workshops are open to individuals actively enrolled in the program, and more information can be obtained by calling the Extensions Services Office (321-697-3000) or via their website http://osceola.ifas.ufl.edu/.  - You must include at least 3 photos of exhibitor working on project. Photos can be printed or project tag must be signed off by volunteer at check in after viewing your cell phone photos.
- Items must be made after end of Fair of previous year and must be constructed by exhibitor.
- NO WOOD KITS. Submissions will be disqualified.
- Objects must be made with use of tools.
 - o Example: Birdhouse: Saw, nails, hammer, etc.

CLASSES:

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Section 11 | SMALL ANIMALS

RULES:

- Each Osceola County 4-H, FFA or FCCLA member may enter TWO (2) CLASSES, BUT ONLY ONE

- Any animal that is required by law to have rabies shots, must bring proof of current shots to check in. i.e. ferrets
- Animals must be brought to the Thursday Youth Exhibit check-in from 5-7 pm.
- Exhibitor is responsible for feeding/watering their pet and keeping habitat and area around habitat clean during the time that it is at the fair.
- In addition to the show, exhibitor will also be judged on the following:
 - Cleanliness of habitat, care received during the fair, and questionnaire sheet form found on the fair website UNDER YOUTH EXHIBITS and must-included with your entry.
- Feeding hours must coincide with fair hours.
- All small animals may be taken home the last day of fair, Sunday. Please clean up your area before you leave.
- It is REQUIRED that all cages have a lock and all aquariums have a secure cover or ratchet lock for the security of your animal. (A lock is not required for vases used for Beta Fish.)
- Date and time of showmanship will be posted on a fair schedule.

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Section 12 | GAME BOARDS

RULES:

- Each exhibitor may enter only one (1) board in the appropriate age division.
- Game boards must be 15"x20" or they will be disqualified, and WILL NOT be displayed. Boards may NOT be cut into shapes.
- Game boards must be designed to run on no larger than a 9-volt battery and you must supply the battery. It must be secured to back of gameboard. (No freestanding batteries will be accepted.)
- Boards may be painted, drawn on or utilize any other craft technique. Fresh materials that will not hold up for the duration of the Fair should not be used.
- Each board must contain only one game and not be a part of a series of boards.
- Boards may be 3 dimensional, however, they must not have sharp objects sticking out, or pieces attached that may be removed or fall off. Chairpersons have a final say over safety.
- If constructed of brown cardboard, the front of the game board must be covered with poster board, wall paper, contact paper or other similar material.
- All game boards must meet the following criteria:
 - Made from cardboard, foam core or coroplast.
 - All electric joints soldered or taped to back of board. The back of the board must be visible to judges. Any boards with paper coverings concealing wiring will not be accepted.
 - Uses simple or advanced wiring (circuits).
 - Brads or small screws with nuts may be used to secure your wiring. If using brads, be sure to use uncoated brads. Back of game board wiring must be neatly secured.
 - Board must have covered light, buzzer or other advanced electric technology such as LED's, selector switches, etc. If LED lights are used, they must be flat on back of board.
 - Contest entries must have their name, club name & age written on back of board. Holes must be punched in the top corners to be displayed.

GENERAL RULES:

- Fashion Revue is open to all Osceola County 4-H, FFA, and FCCLA members.
- Youth may enter in a maximum of 3 classes.
- Classes will be divided into Jr. (age 8-10), Int. (age 11-13), and Sr. (age 14-18). Age is based on age as of September 1st of the current year.
- Youth participating in the Fashion Revue are encouraged to complete the appropriate project for their age.
- Outfits are subject to review for modesty and appropriate attire. Formalwear may be strapless or have spaghetti straps.
- An entry may consist of an outfit of one or more coordinated pieces.
- Garments must have been sewn/constructed since March 1st of the previous year.
- Entries will be judged for construction, accessory selection and modeling.
- Contestants will be required to model their outfit during judging to complete this contest. If
 entering the Sewing for Others: Construction category, the person the garment was sewn for
 must model this garment. Modeling practice will occur right before the contest begins.
- Osceola County Extension Services and the 4-H Program require additional data sheets be completed for project completion. Forms are located on the fair website.
 - NOTE: Data sheets must be obtained from the Fair website. Data sheets are different for Construction and Selection. Fashion Revue garments CAN be entered under SECTION 2
 — SEWING
- Construction Categories:
 - A sewing machine must be used for a majority of construction, unless entering Needle art: Construction.
 - The exhibitor must do all construction.
- Clothing Selection Category:
 - The exhibitor must do all selection.
- Wearable Art/Embellished Category:
 - The exhibitor must do all creation/construction.

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CATEGORIES

• Personally Sewn: Construction

- This category is to showcase the member's sewing skills and their ability to coordinate an outfit for themselves.
- As skill levels range from beginning to advance, entries in the Personally Sewn category will also vary. The entry might be a one- piece dress or it might be three coordinated pieces.
- A sewn costume would be considered Personally Sewn category.
- o Examples: dress, apron, shorts, pajamas, pants, skirt

• Sewing for Others: Construction

- This category is to showcase the member's sewing skills and their ability to coordinate an outfit for another person.
- As skill levels range from beginning to advance, entries in the Sewing for Others category will also vary. The entry might be a one- piece dress or it might be three coordinated pieces.
- Both sewer and model must be available for modeling and judging.
- Examples: skirt, dress, vest, top, sweater, pajamas, pants, shorts, apron

• Needle Arts: Construction

- This category is to showcase the member's ability to knit, crochet, or weave a garment and coordinate an outfit around the garment.
- Garment can be for the member or another person.
- Examples: skirt, dress, vest, top, sweater

• Clothing Selection

- This category is to showcase the member's ability to coordinate an outfit exhibiting positive consumer and fashion skills.
- Garment can be chosen from previously purchased items as long as they are neat and clean, free from stains and/or tears, or can be purchased since the last year's Fashion Revue.
- Clothing Selection is a contest designed to encourage youth to use the clothing in their wardrobe to achieve a fashion look that is complementary to their age and body type.
- A selection entry can consist of an outfit of one or more pieces.
- Contestants will be required to tell the judges why they have selected the outfit, why the
 accessories were used and their part in achieving the fashion look.
- Participants will be required to model their outfits during judging to complete this contest.

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• Wearable Art/Embellished

- This category is to showcase the member's ability to decorate a garment using arts and crafts techniques.
- o Participants may start with an existing garment.
- o Examples: iron-on vinyl, sublimation, iron-on patches, applique, tie-dye, painting
