Special Rules

- 1. See Junior Division General Rules (4-H & FFA).
- 2. Chapters to put booths in at the New Mexico State Fair shall be determined during the summer meeting of the New Mexico Agriculture Education Teachers' Association.
- 3. Each Chapter is entitled to only one entry.
- 4. Exhibits must be in place by noon Wednesday, September 4, 2024 before opening day of the fair and will be released and must be picked up by 6:00 PM, Sunday, September 15, 2024 day of fair close.
- 5. Each Chapter is required to maintain its booth exhibit in a clean and orderly manner.
- 6. Each booth will be 8' deep, 12' wide and 5' high in the back. No holes are to be cut out of the floor of the booths. If done so, the FFA Chapter responsible will be held responsible and will pay to have the booth fixed. Please bring supplies that fit in the booth from the dimensions given.
- 7. The following is the description of the produce requirements for the front half of the FFA booths at the State Fair. Booths should display a minimum of five of the following categories. The maximum number of samples that can be displayed is nine.

Fruit	5 items per plate
Vegetables	5 items per plate
Melons	1 item per plate
Eggs	1 dozen per plate
Grain	10 per plate (head, ear or sheaf grain)
Dried Grain	1 plate
Potted Plant	1 per plate

Special Rules -

- 1. See Junior Division General Rules (4H & FFA)
- 2. Chapters to put in booths at the NM State Fair shall be determined at the summer meeting of the NMAETA.
- 3. Each chapter is entitled to only one entry.
- 4. Exhibits must be in place by noon on the first Saturday of the fair and will be released no later than 6:00pm on the last Sunday of the fair, at the discretion of the Superintendent.
- 5. Each chapter is required to maintain its booth exhibit in a clean and orderly manner.
- 6. Each booth will be 8' deep, 12' wide and 5' high in the back. No holes are to be made in the walls or floor of the booth. If done, the FFA chapter responsible for the booth will be expected to pay to have the booth repaired.
- 7. Nothing should be used to cover the walls.
- 8. Items used in the display should fit the dimensions of the booth.
- 9. Commodity/Natural Resource displays focus should be on NM grown commodities and resources displayed in the front 1/3 of the booth. Booths must have a minimum of 5 items or a maximum of 10 items. Items should be placed on a plate or tray to enhance the overall presentation, all samples should be clearly labelled.

Fruit 5 items per plate
Vegetables 5 items per plate
Melons/Pumpkins 1 item per plate
Eggs 1 dozen per plate

Grain 10 per plate (head, sheaf)

Dried Grain 1 per plate

Potted Plant 1 per plate
Nuts 1 plate
Beans 1 plate
Field Crops/Forage 1 plate

Forestry 1 plate (wood chips, shavings, lumber, firewood, pine cones)

Wool/Mohair or other animal fibers 1 plate

Dairy ½ gallon carton/container

Wildlife 1 item per plate (hide, antlers, skulls)

Honey 1 pint per plate

Natural Resources 1 item/sample per plate
