SHEEP RULES - 4-H and FFA

a) All ovine (sheep) health records must accompany animals to the Fair.

- a. All sheep must have a scrapie tag which is to be used as positive identification on the official sheep entry form and health papers.
- b. All sheep must have been administered a rabies vaccine on or before July 19, 2025 to adhere to the 21 days withholding period.
- c. All market lambs must be shorn prior to the Fair and show in short fleece (maximum fleece length of ¼" on entire body).
- d. All animals must have docked tails.
- b) All market lamb participants must submit a Market Lamb Registration form by May 2, 2025, submitted to Tammi Kron, CCE Erie, 21 S. Grove Street, Suite 300, East Aurora, NY 14052.
- c) All breeding sheep participants must submit provide proof of ownership as of May 1, 2025 (Registration paper of Lease Agreement) registration paper will be reviewed at the conclusion of the exhibitor meeting on August 9, 2025 to verify ownership date.
- d) Market Lambs must weigh at least 100 lbs. at time of Fair weigh-in or they will not be eligible for the market show or sale. All lambs will be weighed **ONE TIME ONLY.**
- e) If a member identified a second lamb on May 2, 2025, the first lamb weighed in will be the market project animal. If the first lamb does not make weight the second lamb may be weighed and used for the sale.
 - a. Members may not post "for sale" signs on pens of non-sale market lambs.
- f) Market Lambs will be sold on Saturday, August 16, 2025. ALL exhibitors are responsible for maintaining their exhibit until released by the 4-H program on Sunday, August 17, 2025, at 8:00PM. Failure to do so will result in not being able to participate at the Erie County Fair in the future and forfeit of premium checks.
- g) Lambs that are non-sale animals or those that are not shown in the sheep show (animals pulled from the show at the owners discretion) are not permitted on a 4-H hired trailer.

4-H Specific Requirements – FFA participants please refer to FFA General Rules

- a) CLOVERBUDS (5-7 years old) are eligible for showmanship and breeding classes, are not eligible to compete in any champion classes and may show only a single entry, Junior Ewe Lamb. Older ewes may be shown with prior approval from the 4-H Sheep Advisory Committee. Cloverbuds are required to have an adult with them in the show ring. Cloverbuds may exhibit a non-sale market lamb no minimum weight requirements.
- b) All exhibitors selling market animal in the auction, a non-sale lamb and or breeding animals are required to complete the following:
 - a. Attend at least 2 Marketing Workshops (held January-March)
 - b. Attend 2 Erie County 4-H meetings, one being species specific.
 - c. Complete a public presentation prior to May 2025.
 - d. Participate in a livestock interview in July 2025.
- c) Youth exhibiting sheep or a non-sale lamb must be 8 as of January 1, 2025.
- d) Youth exhibiting a sale Market Lamb must be 9 as of January 1, 2025.

Sheep showing in the open show and staying for the 4-H show will stay in Barn 11 in the same pens. Members may take animals exhibited in the open show home and bring back for the 4-H show if you wish, however all stall decorations must be removed. All exhibitors staying are required to clean each of your pens entirely and re-bed on the changeover.

- b) Classes may be split or combined at the discretion of the sheep advisory committee and Livestock Educator.
- c) Breeding sheep are released from the Fairgrounds on Sunday, August 17, 2025 at 6:00 PM exhibitors will receive a release ticket with specific release time.
- Champion Ram and Champion Ewe of each breed will compete for Best of Breed.
- e) Exhibitors must be 5 years old as of January 1, 2025.
- f) Only one entry for group class
- g) Sheep will be shown by alternating breeds with classes if it is warranted.
- h) Animals in group classes must be owned by the one exhibitor, no combining of animals for the class. (Classes 15, 17, 21, 25, 26, 27)
- i) Cloverbuds are <u>only</u> eligible to show one (1) Junior ewe lamb Class #12.
- j) Cloverbuds are not eligible for champion classes.

OTHER SHEEP COMPETITIONS

Class #47 – Sheep Educational Poster – Participants shall construct an educational poster to educate the general public about an aspect of the sheep industry. Exhibitors may use any suitable materials or photographs on their posters with accurate information. Posters will be evaluated on content, illustration, organization, clarity, visual appeal, and readability.

Class #41 – New York Bred, Born and Raised Sheep (sale animal only)

This class is for 4-H & FFA members that have purchased and raised a market animal from a sheep producer within New York State. Exhibitors must list name and address of the New York producer on the sheep identification card due in the 4-H office on May 2, 2025. All receipts must have been presented with the animal identification card with a statement from the producer verifying that the lamb was born after January 1, 2025, and that the dam was bred in New York (either natural or AI) and lambed in New York. These animals will be recognized during our market lamb show and placed accordingly. The selection of our Grand and Reserve Champion NYBBR Market Lambs will take place prior to the selection of the top 4 overall market lambs.

Leadline Contest – The Lead Line contest is a show intended to demonstrate the relationship between the shepherd and the wool products made from sheep (clothing products). The competitor leads a sheep on halter while wearing an outfit made from wool, either sewn, knitted, crocheted, felted or repurposed. Garments should contain a fiber of 100% wool or wool blend (minimum 60% wool or specialty fiber). The contestant is judged on the handling of the sheep, as well as the outfit and poise. Each participant will complete a short biography that is read while leading the sheep and modeling the garment. Open to both sheep and market lamb exhibitors. Prizes will be awarded.

- a. This contest is open to all 4-H Sheep participants ages 8 and over as of 01/01/2025. All fleeces need to be checked in by 12:00 noon on Saturday, August 9, 2025. Entries will be judged Monday after the 4-H Sheep Show.
- b. A member may enter one fleece which was clipped from his/her 4-H Animal.
- c. Fleeces will be judged on the Danish system, taking into consideration such qualities as fineness, length, soundness, purity, character, color and condition.
- d. Fleeces must be from sheep shorn since October 1, 2024, owned by the exhibitor or leased by exhibitor.
- e. Fleeces should be rolled with the fresh cut side facing out and loosely stored in a clear plastic bag
- f. Each fleece should be tagged with the following information:
 - a. Name of exhibitor
 - b. Breed of Sheep
 - c. Date the sheep was shorn
 - d. Class number
