4-H Beef General Rules:

- Each 4-H member will be allowed a maximum of four animals. In case of shortage in stall space, 4-H members with the most entries will be cut first.
- All animals must have a double tie at night. No baling twine or wire.
- Beef ownership must be established, or contract written and dated by May 1.
- A respiratory complex vaccine is strongly recommended 4 weeks prior to the fair.
- Herdsmanship must be performed by 4-H Members. Fitting must be done by the exhibitor.
- No animal will be allowed to compete for more than one premium, nor shall be entered in more than one class, except as one
 of a group class.
- The same animal cannot be shown in 4-H and FFA.
- The Bovine Veterinary Checklist should be presented at Vet Check.

Keep in mind Herdsmanship judging may occur during a show. **Each club is required to do Herdsmanship.** Smaller clubs may join together for herdsmanship with permission from Superintendent.
