ADVANCED SPECIAL PROJECT RULES

- a) Recognizing that application and assimilation of life skills prepares a 4-H member for successful pursuits in their adult life, this section has been added to encourage teens (13 or older by January 1) to "tackle" long-term projects that incorporate:
 - (1) Organizational skills
 - (2) Independent study
 - (3) Research-based learning
 - (4) Implementation of appropriate life, citizenship, and/or leadership skills.
- b) The end product of this project must receive in writing the approval of the appropriate extension educator, no later than June 30, 2023.
- c) Documentation (journal, photographs, etc.) must accompany the project that shows how the project was approached; financial records (materials purchased, etc.), skills utilized, and resources (cite 4-H and other publications as well as persons who provided expertise).
- d) An essay (minimum 250 words) should describe the overall experience and reflect on why the project was undertaken.
- e) A minimum of 100 hours of work (document how time was utilized) may cover work over a 2-year period.

Age and experience will be taken into consideration.)
