- 1. **Entries:** Entries must be pre-registered online by the day before the first day of the contest. Link for the online entry can be found at <u>www.hotfair.com/academicrodeo</u>
- 2. **Refunds:** No refunds will be issued for any reason. No exceptions.
- 3. **Passes:** Each contestant will receive two (2) single-day passes to the fair and one (1) single-day parking pass at check-in.

No passes are required for the first day of the contest

- 4. **Interpretation and Violation of Rules:** The HOTFR reserves the right to its Executive Committee. The final and absolute right to interpret these rules, regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard hereto or otherwise arising out of the right to amend or add to these rules as its judgment may determine. The HOTFR also reserves the right to change the schedule, delete classes or add classes at the discretion of the show officials. A contestant who violates any of the rules will forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such penalty as the Executive Committee may order.
- 5. Liability: The HOTFR will not be responsible for the loss, damage, theft, breakage or any other form of loss of your entry. It is distinctly understood that the HOTFR, its directors, officers, volunteers and/or employees will not be held responsible for any loss, damage or injury of any character, to any person, animal, vehicle or article while participating in the Academic Rodeo division of the HOTFR.
- 6. **Special Rules:** Special rules or conditions are published in each department when necessary and if there is a conflict between the special rules of any department and the General Rules and Regulations, the special rules will govern.
- 7. Eligibility of Exhibitors: Participation is limited to Texas resident students.
- 8. **Protests:** Protests against an award and/or eligibility must be made in writing to the Academic Rodeo Committee Chairman of the Heart O' Texas Fair & Rodeo. No protests will be accepted after the conclusion of the Fair. Such protests must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be delivered immediately after the occasion. All protests will be heard and determined by the Academic Rodeo Executive Committee. This committee's decision is final and may not be appealed.
- 9. **Premiums:** Awards will be paid by the HOTFR according to the amounts set in this catalog. 10. **Judges Rules:**
 - Selection of Judges: Judges will be selected by the HOTFR. In every case, the judges are selected with the utmost care and the highest concern.
 - **Decision of Judges:** The decisions of the judges will be final in all cases and may not be appealed.
 - **Interference with Judges:** If any contestant, in any way, whether in person, by agent or servants, interferes with the judges during their adjudication, or shows any disrespect to

them or the Contest, the management may demand a proper apology from such contestant. It may exclude him/her from the competition, or withhold from such contestant premiums that may have been awarded. This may cause contestant to be barred from future participation in the HOTFR

11. Accommodations: The Academic Rodeo is a contest sponsored by the Heart O' Texas Fair and Rodeo and is not associated with any public or private educational facility. Due to the nature of the contests, educational accommodations which alter the testing materials and/or the testing format will not be provided.

- 3. Entry Limits: The contest is limited to the first 40 entries per age division.
- 4. All grade levels will take the written test on the first day of the contest.
- 5. No electronic devices are allowed to be used. Judges are in control of the competition; their decision is final.
- 6. **Awards:** All grade level results will be posted on <u>www.hotfair.com</u> by the Friday after the contest. Only the top five (5) will be posted.
 - For 4th, 5th, and 6th grade, results will be listed in alphabetical order. These winners are considered finalists and are invited to participate in the oral bee on the second day of the contest.
- 7. Word Lists: Words used in the Spelling Bee shall be selected from a list of words approved by educators. Word lists will be posted on <u>www.hotfair.com</u> and must be spelled exactly as written (capitalization, hyphen, etc).
 - Words used for tiebreakers will be selected by the committee and may not be included on the provided word lists. Participants may be asked to use spelling words in a sentence for tie breaker purposes.

Oral Spelling Bee:

- In the oral competition, after the Pronouncer gives the contestant a word, the contestant will have 15 seconds to begin to spell the word. The judges may disqualify any contestant who ignores a request to start spelling.
- The contestant may have the word repeated once.
- The contestant is encouraged to pronounce the word before spelling it and after spelling it. However, no contestant will be eliminated for failing to pronounce a word.
- Words must be spelled exactly as written on the word list (capitalization, hyphen, etc.).
- Before they begin to spell the word, the contestant may request the pronouncer to repronounce the word, define it, or use it in a sentence. No other information about the etymology or history of a word will be given.
- Having started to spell a word, a contestant may stop and start over, retracing the spelling from the beginning, but in retracing there can be no change of letters and/or their sequence from those first pronounced. If letters and/or their sequence are changed in the respelling, the speller will be eliminated.
- Upon missing the spelling of a word, the contestant is immediately eliminated from the contest.
- Because of time constraints, the announcer and the judges have the right to move to higher grade level of words whenever they deem necessary. To prepare, study words up to two grade levels above your current grade level including bonus lists. If necessary, unlisted words may be used to determine a winner.
- If more than one spelling is listed for a word, any of these spellings will be accepted as correct if the word matches the pronunciation provided by the pronouncer, or if it is clearly identified as being a standard variant of the word that the contestant has been asked to spell.
- If a word has one or more homonyms, the pronouncer will indicate which of them is to be spelled by using the word in a sentence.
- Any question relating to the spelling of a word should be referred to the Academic Rodeo Chairman immediately before the next contestant is given the next word to spell.

Oral Spelling Bee Playoff Round:

- When the contestants are reduced to two, they will draw numbers to determine order.
- During the play-off round, when one contestant misspells a word, the other contestant shall be given the opportunity to spell the same word. When one of the last two spellers' misses, and the other spells correctly in the same round, the one who spells their word correctly will be declared the winner of the play-off round.
- If both spellers misspell the same word, both shall continue in the contest and the one who first misspelled the word shall be given a new word to spell.
- Because of time constraints, the announcer and the judges have the right to move to higher grade level of words whenever they deem necessary. To prepare, study words up to two

grade levels above your current grade level including bonus lists. If necessary, unlisted words may be used to determine a winner.

- If more than one spelling is listed for a word, any of these spellings will be accepted as correct if the word matches the pronunciation provided by the pronouncer, or if it is clearly identified as being a standard variant of the word that the contestant has been asked to spell.
- If a word has one or more homonyms, the pronouncer will indicate which of them is to be spelled by using the word in a sentence.
- Any question relating to the spelling of a word should be referred to the Academic Rodeo Chairman immediately; before the word has been given to the other speller.
- The Heart O' Texas Fair & Rodeo Academic Rodeo Chairman and the judges are in complete control of the Spelling Bee. Their decisions shall be final.
