

ANIMAL HEALTH REGULATIONS

The following rules and regulations were provided to the Tulsa State Fair by the Oklahoma State Board of Agriculture. These rules will govern admission of livestock to the Tulsa State Fair. **ALL INCOMING LIVESTOCK MUST ENTER THROUGH GATE 7 OFF 15th STREET. ALL LIVESTOCK MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A CERTIFICATE OF VETERINARY INSPECTION (HEALTH CERTIFICATES), WHICH MUST BE CHECKED BEFORE UNLOADING.** An official CVI issued within thirty (30) days prior to the Fair must accompany all animals and shall be available at all times to the representatives of the Animal Industry Services of the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture. All CVIs must be validated by Animal Industry Services before animals are given stall or pen space in the barns. All animals must be free of any infectious, communicable or contagious disease and if such a disease is found, it will be cause for removal of the animal(s) from the exhibition.

Out of state livestock, including domesticated poultry, birds, and rabbits, must meet Oklahoma's import requirements. Official Identification is required for all exhibition livestock imported into Oklahoma. Official Identification for most species is defined as an identification device with the USDA shield, an 840 prefix ear tag, or a registration tattoo or brand if accompanied by a copy of the registration certificate. CATTLE

The CVI must list individual identification such as tattoo or ear tag, and complete description of livestock as to age, sex, and breed. Out of state dairy breeds 6 months of age and older must originate from a TB Free Herd or must be TB test negative within 60 days prior to arrival at the show. In the case of a TB Free Herd, the TB Accredited herd number and last herd test date must be indicated on the CVI. Any sexually intact dairy animal 6 months of age or older changing ownership within the state of Oklahoma is required to have a negative TB test within 60 days before change of ownership. Must be free from external parasites.



DAIRY CATTLE

Due to the ongoing outbreak of Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza in dairy cattle in the United States, Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry has instituted requirements for lactating dairy cattle at dairy exhibitions.

Owners of lactating dairy cattle who are planning to exhibit their animals to their County or State Fair should contact their veterinarian, who must collect a sample and submit it to Oklahoma Animal Disease Diagnostic Laboratory to be tested for Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza. Negative results must be listed on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with official identification. The CVI must be completed within 7 days of entry to the exhibition.

These requirements are in addition to the usual health requirements for dairy cattle at County and State Fairs in Oklahoma.

SWINE

Must be accompanied by an official CVI that shows individual identification. OK swine must be identified with an electronic 840 ID tag. Other ID may be an ear notch or ear tag. Complete description as to age, sex, breed, and that they are free of external parasites, ringworm, or warts, or any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease is also required. **A State or Federal Premise Identification Number is required for all swine and must be listed on the CVI.** All OK swine must have a negative test for pseudorabies and brucellosis after May 15, 2024 or originate from a Validated Brucellosis/Qualified Pseudorabies Free Herd and be exhibited by owners and/or immediate family members only. The CVI must indicate the negative test results for both brucellosis and pseudorabies or indicate that animals are from Validated/Qualified Free Herds with the V/Q number and date of last quarterly test. **Out of state swine must obtain an import permit** by calling 405-522-6141 and must have a negative test for pseudorabies and brucellosis within 30 days before the date of entry or originate from a Validated Brucellosis/Qualified Pseudorabies Free Herd.

SHEEP AND GOATS

Must be accompanied by an official CVI that indicates animals are free of external parasites, fungal infections, and any infectious, contagious, or communicable disease. All sheep and goats must be individually identified with one of the following: 1. USDA ear tag; 2. Official breed registry tattoo (only if animal is accompanied by a registration certificate); 3. For animals not suitable for ear tagging, legible flank or tail-web tattoo (must contain premise ID and individual animal number.) **ILLEGIBLE TATTOOS WILL BE CONSIDERED AS NO IDENTIFICATION.**

HORSES AND OTHER EQUINE

Must be accompanied by an official CVI or official Extended Equine CVI showing age, breed, sex, and all markings to positively identify animals, including all vaccinations, and date and result of required tests. **All** equine must be tested negative for Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) within twelve (12) months prior to exhibition. Foals less than six (6) months of age accompanied by their negative tested dam are exempt from test requirements. The Lab name, accession number, date, and results of the test must be clearly shown on the CVI.

 **POULTRY**

Out-of-State Poultry

1. Either be NPIP certified and have a Form 9-3 less than 30 days prior to the show OR
2. Have a negative PT test with Form 9-1 less than 90 days prior to the show and have a permanent leg or wing band and a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) less than 30 days prior to the show date.

In-State Poultry

1. Either be NPIP Certified OR
2. Have a Negative PT Test (9-2 Form) less than 90 days prior to the show date and have a permanent leg or wing band.
