The **Microgrant Program** enables and supports artistic projects across distinct areas, such as the performing arts, art educators and organizations, and individual artists or groups looking for growth and education.

**Exhibitions & Workshops** We organize art exhibitions and a range of workshops in our office gathering space, allowing the community to experience and appreciate art in its many forms while connecting with other art enthusiasts.




