- Each member must have sewn, knitted or crocheted the garment(s) and/or article(s) he/she models. Shoes, hose and other accessories must be chosen by the exhibitor.
- 4. Any member enrolled in a Clothing and/or Knitting & Crocheting Project may model a garment in the Revue.
- **2025 UPDATE** A member can enter two garments made for him/herself and a third garment made for another person. The other person must be present with the exhibitor at judging on Thursday.

6. Judging Criteria

<u>Clothing Revue</u>: based on total appearance (creative selection, color and style, fit, grooming, posture, accessories and construction as it affects total appearance).

Knitting & Crocheting Revue: Emphasis will be on the "total look" so all parts of the member's outfit must coordinate and look well together. Judging will be based on workmanship as it affects total appearance.

- 7. Garments entered in Department 26 Clothing Revue may also be entered under Department 26 Clothing. The same article(s) modeled in Department 27 Knitting & Crocheting Revue may be exhibited in Department 27 Knitting & Crocheting.
- All Clothing and Knitting & Crocheting Revue garments must be on display during the entire Fair. Bring them as indicated for check-in above.
