RULES & REGULATIONS

1. **ELIGIBILITY:** Any Adult (18 years of age or older), who lives or works in Putnam and St. Johns Counties.

- 2. Professionals will be judged separately. A professional is someone who is paid to instruct or sells their items to the general public.
- 3. All exhibits must have been made by the exhibitor and not previously been exhibited in the Putnam County Fair.
- 4. Entries will be received at the designated time and place only. Last day to enter for TABLE SETTINGS is Friday March
- 5. Each exhibit will be labeled with a claim check provided by the Home Division when entered. Please keep your copy of the claim check and present it when you claim your exhibit. If someone else is picking up your exhibits, they must present the claim check(s).
- 6. Articles must remain on exhibit until Sunday after the fair. No articles will be released Saturday night. All articles must be picked up by 5:00 p.m. on pickup day.
- 7. The Fair Authority will take every reasonable effort for the protection and safeguard of exhibits. Glass cabinets will be used to display small exhibits. Large items will be displayed in a protected area. Security will patrol the building as a part of their normal routines. In no event will the Fair Authority, its directors or volunteers be responsible for any damages, accidents or losses; owner assumes all responsibility.
- 8. Entries may receive a blue, red, white, or participant ribbon. From the Blue Ribbon winners, a First place winner in each Class will be awarded. If there are no Blue ribbon winners in any lot in a particular class, there will not be a best of Class premium. A First place OVERALL winner will be selected from the Blue Rosettes winners. Premiums will be awarded according to the Judges' records only, and may be picked up when articles are claimed on pickup day.
- 9. Exhibits entered in the Home Division are for competition and are not to be for sale by the exhibitor.
- 10. Exhibitors will be limited to five (5) articles in each class. Each article must be a different technique (a knitted afghan and a crocheted afghan, but not two crocheted Afghans).

11. All Home Arts and Crafts will be judged according to beauty and originality of design, harmony of color and materials, suitability of articles to purpose, and workmanship.

QUILT DIVISION

- Quilts must be clean.
- The quilts should be neat; no unsightly thread showing on back or under top and knots in thread should be unnoticeable.
- Borders, binding, or other edge treatments should enhance overall appearance. (e.g. mitered corners should be neat and square.)
- · Prints and solid colors used should complement, repeat, or harmonize with the other colors in the quilt.
- All the points and corners should meet precisely in the patchwork.
- All seams should be complete and edges sufficiently fastened in place.
- Quilting stitches should be evenly spaced and uniform in length over the entire quilt.
- Binding should be sewn on securely so it will wear well.
- For a tied comforter, the knots should be secure and evenly spaced.
- For appliquéd quilts, use thread to match fabric and use blind stitching.

- Standard square card tables will be provided. Participants can take as long as necessary to set up their tables as long as it is finished by 2pm. Help is allowed to bring items into Expo Hall but not set up. You will have 30 minutes to bring your items to the table. Once you start setting your table, you may not leave until you are finished. If you leave the table, you may not return to bring additional items or adjust anything. Your table will remain set up for the duration of the fair. Pick up will be Sunday March 30 from 2pm-4pm.
- The participant must bring linens, dishes, utensils, glassware, decorations, and centerpieces appropriate for their chosen theme. Each table must be covered with a tablecloth or other decorative covering. No Candles may be lit. Battery operated LED lighting only permitted. No perishable food or plants are allowed as décor. The participant must use the correct place settings for two (2) places only. All items must be clean. Chairs are not to be included in the display. All items for the display must be on the table.
- Participants will bring a written plan of the occasion and a menu that is printed and framed and styled for the table. Menu must be part of the Table Setting Display. Food and drinks on the menu should fit with the chosen theme. Use only dishes, utensils and glassware that is needed for your menu. Example: If your menu does not include wine-do not use wine glasses. All carrying containers and packing materials must be taken with you at the end of set up.
- The Fair reserves the right to reject any table setting that is objectionable or unsuitable.
- Table Settings Fair Arrival day is March 14th from 11am-2pm.
- Judging criteria will include the following: 1. Total visual impact 2. Creativity and originality as related to the theme chosen. 3. Correct placement of tableware and dishes. 4. Menu appropriate for the theme and dishes used.

- Label all canned foods with name of product and date when canned. DO NOT LABEL WITH YOUR NAME.
- Exhibits not presented or labeled according to these rules will be excluded from judging.
- Canned foods will be judged on color, condition, clearness, uniformity, and pack. All food except jellies should have ½" headspace. Jellies should have ½" headspace.
- NO meat will be judged.

AWARDS for BAKERY, CANDY & CANNING

All entries will be judged on their own merit and may be awarded a **Blue**, **Red**, **White or Participant Ribbon**. The following premiums will also be awarded:

- 3. Matted only (without frame) pictures should have a protective clear covering and hanging device attached.
- 4. Exhibitors must live or work in Putnam or St. Johns Counties or live within a 10-mile radius of the county line.
- 5. Claim check(s) will be issued when Art is entered and MUST be presented before it is released.
- 6. Limit of three (3) items per Adult, per Category. Limit of three (3) items per Youth.
- 7. Exhibitor must securely attach to the back of the of the entry a typewritten or legibly written form/label stating their name, age at time of the entry (if a youth artist), address, telephone number, title and medium to be judged. All exhibits are for competition and are not for sale by the exhibitor during the fair.
- 8. The Fair Authority will take every reasonable precaution for the safeguard of all exhibits. The Fair Authority is not liable for any loss or damaged property. **Entries may not be removed before conclusion of the fair.**
- 9. No winner will be allowed more than one (1) monetary premium in connection with the same article / item. Highest award premium will be paid.
- 10. All Premium money will be paid in cash and may be picked up when the exhibitor brings in their claim check on pickup date.
