RELEASE TIME: After done showing

- 1. All entries must meet the Kansas State Fair General Rules and Health Requirements.
- 2. Dairy Goats will not be admitted into reserved pen area in the Dairy Goat barn before 9:00 am, Friday, September 16, and must be in place and checked in no later than 6:00 pm, Friday, September 16.
- 3. Show sanctioned by American Dairy Goat Association. Only ADGA, AGS or CGS registered or recorded animals may be shown. Junior and senior doe shows are separately sanctioned. Breeds sanctioned: Alpine, LaMancha, Nigerian Dwarf, Nubian, Oberhasli, Saanen, Sable, Toggenburg, and Recorded Grades and will be shown in that order, not subject to change. ADGA, AGS and Kansas State Fair rules shall govern the show.
- 4. The date for computing age will be the day of check-in.
- 5. The original Registration Certificate MUST be presented to the Show Secretary for examination at check in time. The original Registration Certificate, a stamped duplicate application or a stamped faxed duplicate application showing date received by ADGA or AGS office will be accepted for animals under six months of age.

- 6. Animal must be entered in owner's name as it appears on the registration certificate. Exhibitor will show as the agent if different
- 7. Youth exhibitors may combine their does with their parents to show in group classes. Please enter each group class only once, not each animal in the group.
- 8. Group classes are limited to 2 entries per farm / per class. If you think you will want to do the group classes, enter them. If decide to scratch, it is easier to remove than add the day of check in and there is not charge for the classes. Entries will not be added ringside.
- 9. Every Dairy Goat must be properly fitted for show and be provided with a collar, or a chain. All exhibitors must be neatly and properly dressed (preferably in white) while in the show ring.
- 10. Pens will be assigned by the Dairy Goat Superintendent. The pens are 5 feet by 5 feet in size. No more than two senior does or four junior does are allowed to be stalled in one pen.
- 11. FEED AND BEDDING: Initial straw bedding is provided by the Kansas State Fair. Any change of bedding is at the expense of the exhibitor. Any exhibitor may bring in feed and forage for their use during the Fair. Space in the barns is for livestock exhibit purposes and may not be used for storage of feed or bedding. All aisles shall be kept open at all times.

JUNIOR DOE SHOW: The Junior Doe Show consists of does fewer than 24 months of age that are not in milk and have never freshened.

SENIOR DOE SHOW: The Senior Doe Show consists of does that have never freshened or in milk. A Best Udder will be judged in each class.

Do NOT enter classes: Jr. Champion or Reserve, Sr. Champion or Reserve or Best Udder. These are selected by the judge
