# **DEPARTMENT F Poultry and Rabbits**

# Section 1 – Youth Poultry Superintendents: Dan & Corree Downing

1. This section is open class to youths and anyone still in high school.

2. Transportation cages shall be removed from the fairgrounds between time of entry and time of removal of the exhibits.

3. Only two entries will be permitted by each exhibitor in each class, per variety, except as stated otherwise.

4. Exhibitors will be limited to one crossbreed.

5. Entry fees shall be \$1.00 per entry.

6. Birds shown in a trio or pen cannot be shown as individuals. -- A trio is two females and one male; a pair is one male and one female of the same breed and variety. A pen is three birds of the same sex, age, breed and variety. The words "old", "hen", and "cock" mean birds over one year of age.

7. Poultry will be inspected for lice. Poultry having lice or showing signs of sickness or excessive dirt will be REFUSED entry by the superintendent and/or vet. To prevent the possibility of spreading infectious diseases, it is recommended that all poultry exhibited at the fair be examined and quarantined if necessary prior to returning to the farm.

8. The poultry exhibitors must present a certificate to the superintendent prior to check in that certifies the entries are Pullorum-Typhoid clean. (State Requirement)

9. All birds exhibited must show maturity.

Chickens must be at least 16 weeks old, with the exception of live meat birds.

10. Poultry injured after being checked in by the superintendent should not be disqualified for that year, but the bird cannot be exhibited at future fairs.

Birds will not be released until the close of fair.
 Exhibitors are required to clean barn and

equipment at the close of fair.

13. No decoration bigger than a 5 X 7 card on cages. Please keep everything contained to the 5 X 7 card. No balloons, strimmers or glitter. This will be done after showing and judging. Be mindful of all decorations due to the safety of all animals.
14. All exhibitors need to have pictures of their animals by July 19th. All exhibitors must perform 2 barn duty shifts of 2 hrs. each for fair. All children

under the age of 10 must have a parent there with them during barn duty.

15. Limit of species will be 15 unless room allows for more. All poultry must be washed with a three (3) bucket process.

16. All turkey's will be responsible to bring your own food in a container to put in your cage with your animals. Chicken will be supplied with all feed.

17. Limit of space one (1) turkey per entry unless room allows up to 3 turkeys.

18. Baby poultry can be put in as group. Contact Superintendent.

19. There will be no cross-exhibiting between 4-H, FFA, and open youth poultry. Primary exhibitors under 8 years old must have a parent present at all times. Entry Forms are due at the Fair Office no later than July 19th.

#### POULTRY EQUIPMENT

A copy of the building plans must be included for the judge's information. This plan may be a standard plan and need not be original.



Brooders should be equipped with some way to control temperature and to provide fire safety standards. The entry shall include containers for feed and water.

# POULTRY SCIENCE EXHIBITS

Judging will be based on: Scientific Thought - 40%; Creative Ability - 20%; Dramatic Value and Clarity - 20% and Presentation - 20%.

# EGGS



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# **OPEN YOUTH RABBITS & CAVIES**

# Superintendent: Mary Pederson

1. This section is open to all youth ages 4-18

2. Rabbits are exhibited in wire cages provided by the fair.

3. Entries are subject to space available.

4. No decoration bigger than a 5 X 7 card on cages. Please keep everything contained to the 5 X 7 card.

5. No balloons, streamers, or glitter. This will be done after showing and judging.

6. Be mindful of all decorations due to the safety of all animals.

7. Transportation cages shall be removed from the fairgrounds between the time of entry and the time of removal of exhibits.

8. Rabbits may be rejected by the superintendent and/or vet because of insects or disease.

9. All rabbits must have legible tattoo in left ear. All cavies must have ear tag in left ear.

10. All rabbit & cavy project exhibitors must enter fitting and showmanship and the judging contests.

11. Exhibitors must use their own animals to enter the fitting and showmanship class, except by ruling of the superintendent.

12. Exhibitors are responsible for carrying their animals to the judging table or the animal will be disqualified.

13. Feed and water will be provided by the fair.

14. Containers will be provided for the rabbits, but cavy exhibitors should bring their own containers. No other material will be allowed in cages.15. A rabbit may be entered in Type or Meat, but not both. A rabbit entered in Type or Meat may also be entered in Fur. *Please make all Fur entries in red ink.* 

16. Exhibitors may enter more than one entry per class, except for the cross breed or altered classes where only one entry is allowed.

- Entry fees shall be \$1.00 per entry.

17. All judging will follow ARBA standards, except for class 20 or 21, which will be judged on the general condition of the animal.

18. All exhibitors will be required to perform barn duty.

19. Check with the superintendent for days and time.

20. Rabbits injured after being checked in by the superintendent will not be disqualified for that year, but cannot be exhibited again.

21. There will be no cross exhibiting between 4-H, FFA, and Open Youth rabbits or cavies.

22. Primary exhibitors 8 years or younger must have a parent present at all times.

# Entry Forms are due to the Fair Office no later than July 19th.

23. No more than 25 of each species allowed per exhibitor, exception rabbit or bird with babies count as 1 entry.
