All entries are due to the Pavilion Annex on Saturday, July 27th, before the Fair, from 10 a.m. to noon or Sunday, July 28th, from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. All entries and awards will be released on Sunday, August 4th, following closing day of the Fair, between 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m.

- 1. All entries in this department must have been produced by the exhibitor and completed after last year's fair.
- 2. An exhibitor may enter two items in each class.
- 3. All items must be clean. Soiled items will not be accepted. The Department Superintendent will have the right to reject such items.

CREATIVE KIDS EXHIBIT Sewing

- 1. This contest is open to children, ages 6 to 16.
- 2. The child should sew an apron, pillow, placemat, potholder or other item of similar size using any or all of the fair colors: White, Red, Blue, and Brown.
- 3. Items must be sewn and may include other embellishments.
- 4. The Grays Harbor County Fair's general rules and contest policies will apply.
- 5. Judging will take place prior to the fair and will be closed to the public.
- 6. Entries must be brought to the Pavilion Annex at the fairgrounds on Saturday, prior to the fair from 10 am –noon or Sunday, between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.

CREATIVE KIDS PRIZES:

All entries will receive either a blue, red, or white ribbon. The 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners will receive rosette.




TABLE SETTING ACTIVITY SECTION 8

Points: Blue 6, Red 4

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- 1. Exhibitors must enter own Display
 - Theme place settings for breakfast, lunch, or dinner (i.e. Holiday, formal, children's party, etc.)
- 2. Exhibit must not have been entered in previous years.
 - Dishes and utensils may be repeated.
 - OPTIONAL Provide a menu to go with your setting

You should plan a coordinated, economical table setting around a selected culture or theme.

The objective is to coordinate a table setting for a particular meal: breakfast, lunch or dinner and/or theme.

The exhibit will consist of:

- 1. A covering (such as a place mat) and an optional centerpiece.
- 2. One complete place setting properly set.

The table setting will be judged on:

- a) Creativity of theme or enhancement of culture.
- b) Use of appropriate accessories.
- c) Eye-catching appeal.
- d) Accuracy of table setting.

Paper items are permissible. We encourage you to make your own covering and centerpiece. They are inexpensive and add an extra personal touch to your table.
