Entry Drop-Off Times & locations

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Before entering, please refer to Entry instructions for Rules and Regulations.

- 1. Entries to be dropped off Sun., Aug. 18, 2024, between 10 a.m.—1 p.m. in Building 1.
- 2. All exhibits will be released Sun., Aug 25, 2024, from 8 a.m.–10. a.m. Fair personnel and Superintendents are not responsible for items remaining after 10 a.m.
- 3. All entries must be hand-woven or crafted by the exhibitor. Commercial or handspun yarn may be used for weaving. Knitted or crocheted items must be made with handspun yarn except for items in Division H.
- 4. Items must be labeled as to fiber content, commercial or handspun yarn, commercial or natural dye stuff, original design, or pattern, commercial or hand prepared fiber and intended use on a <u>3 by 5-inch</u> <u>card</u>. Handspun yarn skeins must be a minimum of 25 yards and maximum of 100 yards, secured with figure eight ties.
- 5. All entries must be display-ready and must have been completed within the last year.
- 6. Limit of 10 items per class
- 7. Items may be moved from one class to another at the superintendent's discretion.
