Farm Products Rules:

- 1. Please read and abide by all The Erie County Fair and Ag-Grange Department rules and regulations.
- 2. All entries must be registered by Tuesday, July 29, 2025. Entries not registered will not be accepted. For more information see the Important Entry Information page at www.ecfair.org.
- 3. When and where possible the variety name should be included to help educate the consumer.
- 4. Upon arrival, **ANY** class changes to the entry tags need to be made at the front table by officials. Changes not officially recorded will result in a loss of placing and premium.
- 5. To minimize errors, exhibitors must affix the correct entry tag with the exact variety name written on the front, securely to every entry.
- 6. If an article is not brought in, the entry tag for that article must be returned to the Superintendent.
- 7. Upon arrival, **ANY** class changes to the entry tags need to be made by the superintendent at the table where it is received.
- 8. All articles for exhibition must remain on the grounds according to the rules of each department or forfeit their premium unless excused by the Fair Manager of the Society
- 9. Any item receiving a placing can pick up ribbons at the Main Office with their premium check beginning August 16, 2025.
- 10. Honey and Maple products may be picked up on Monday, August 1, 2025 between 7:30 AM 9:00 AM. All honey & maple products not picked up between those times will be available for pick up at the Competitive Exhibits Office Monday through Friday between the hours of 9:00 AM 4:00 PM. All exhibits must be picked up by September 1, 2025.
- 11. Exhibitors must own or be employed by the producing farm. The farm name must be noted in the description.



CLASSES

CORN SILAGE - 1

Two (2) Samples are needed to be displayed in a clear zip-lock bag. The first sample must be a good 3lbs. sample. The second sample should be in a quart-sized clear plastic bag. Samples will be from the previous year's harvest.

1. Corn Silage

HEMP/HOPS - 2

<u>General Rules</u>

- 1. Hemp displayed in sheaves, must be tied by 2 bands, and must measure at least 6 inches around and not more than 14 inches around at the bottom.
- 2. All hemp exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor during the current season.
- 3. All hemp sheaves must be well-cured, not moist.
- 4. There must be no roots left on any entry in this section.
- 5. Do not strip leaves from stalks.
- 6. The exact variety name must be written on the front of the entry tag

 Hemp, auto flower variety- must be a licensed grower, bring proof of license at drop off, and provide documentation of the product/variety.
 Hemp, full season variety- must be a licensed grower, bring proof of license at drop off, and provide documentation of the product/variety.
 Hops- cones displayed in quart basket

FIELD CROP SEEDS - 3

Any grains that have been treated with poisonous substances shall not be shown and, if offered in competition will be removed. All entries in this section must have been grown, harvested, selected, and prepared by the exhibitor during either the year exhibited or the preceding year. Exhibits known to be older will be disqualified. The variety and the year in which the exhibit was grown must be stated on the exhibitor's tag. The seed value of exhibits will be emphasized in the judging. In judging seed value, the following factors will be considered: A. Purity of the seed. Relative freedom from weed seeds, seeds of other crop plants, dirt, chaff,

sprouted kernels and broken kernels.

B. Relative freedom from obvious diseased seeds.C. Relative freedom from mixtures of other varieties.D. Probable viability of the seed, as indicated by its physical conditions.

E. Uniformity of the seed as to shape, size and color.
F. Trueness to type. All seed exhibits should be correctly named as to variety. Exhibits that are distinctly off-type or misnamed will be disqualified.
G. Containers for displaying samples in this section will be supplied by the Fair.

- 1. 1-quart Winter Barley, name variety
- 2. 1-quart Beans, White Kidney, name variety
- 3. 1-quart Beans, Red Kidney, name variety
- 4. 1-quart Soybeans, name variety
- 5. 1-quart Buckwheat, name variety
- 6. 1-quart Shelled Yellow, Dent Corn, name variety
- 7. 1-quart Oats, name variety
- 8. 1-quart Rye, name variety
- 9. 1-quart Sunflowers, name variety
- 10. 1-quart Wheat, White Winter, name variety
- 11. 1-quart Red Wheat
- 12. 1-quart Spring Barley

The classifications given here are only types of corn. You must name the exact variety of each type you enter: Hybrid or open-pollinated. Only ear corn grown in the previous year may be entered in the following classes: **Husks must be left on**.

- 13. Ten (10) Ears Dent Corn, Yellow
- 14. Ten (10) Ears Indian Corn
- 15. Ten (10) Ears Miniature Indian Corn
- 16. Ten (10) Ears Pop Corn, Hybrid Yellow
- 17. Ten (10) Ears Pop Corn, Strawberry Red Decorative
- 18. Ten (10) Ears Pop Corn, White Cloud



CLASSES

HAY EXHIBIT - 4

General Rules:

1. Hay entries shall consist of one whole bale of machine packed hay from this year's crop if entering for the Feed Value Award. If not entering for the Feed Value Award, please bring one machine packed slab of hay.

*Sample for feed value award will be taken from the bale by the building staff.

2. If NOT competing for the Cumberland Valley Award, Hay entries shall be exhibited in a CLEAR PLASTIC BAG

1. Second Cutting, Alfalfa, not over 10% grass

- 2. Third Cutting, Alfalfa, not over 10% grass
- 3. Second Cutting, Alfalfa, not over 50% grass
- 4. Third Cutting, Alfalfa, not over 50% grass
- 5. Grass Hay, not over 10% legume
- 6. Clover, not over 50% grass
- 7. Clover, not over 75% grass

HAYLAGE - 5

Two (2) Samples are needed. The first sample must be a good 3-pound sample displayed in a clear ziplock bag, 65% moisture or less. The second should be in a quart-sized clear plastic bag 1. 1st Cutting Haylage



TOTAL MIXED RATION (TMR) - 6

<u>Two Samples</u> are needed. The first sample must be a good 3-pound sample displayed in a clear zip-lock bag, 65% moisture or less. The second should be in a

APIARY PRODUCTS - 7

<u>General Rules:</u>

1. Label all products as if market ready. Product label, farm label, grade sticker. (No price sticker) 2. Judging will be blind. Samples of products will be taken from bottles and introduced to the judge anonymously.

3. Products in this section are to made/ produced by the exhibitor.

4. Products must be "market ready".

5. Containers must be first use (no reused fruit juice jars etc.)

6. If product is to be packed hot (sealed) container must show headspace and have a tight seal.

SILAGE CORN - 8

Entry must list variety, seed company, and days to maturity. **MAXIMUM of five (5) stalks**.

<u>Premiums for class 1: Blue - \$30, Red - \$20,</u> <u>Yellow - \$10</u>

1. Early variety Silage Corn, 75 - 85 Days to Maturity 2. Mid-Season variety Silage Corn, 86 - 100 Days to Maturity

3. Late Season variety Silage Corn, 101+ Days to Maturity

MAPLE PRODUCTS - 9

General Rules:

 Label all products as if market ready. Product label, farm label, grade sticker. (No price sticker)
 Judging will be blind. Samples of products will be taken from bottles and introduced to the judge anonymously.

3. Products in this section are to made/produced by the exhibitor.

4. Products must be "market ready".

5. Containers must be first use (no reused fruit juice jars etc.)

6. If product is to be packed hot (sealed) container must show headspace and have a tight seal.

7. Standard density will be checked.

8. Color grade standard (current NY & USDA will be checked)

<u>Premiums for classes 1-8: Blue-\$8, Red-\$6,</u> <u>Yellow-\$5</u>

1. Clear glass or jar of Grade A Golden Color, Syrup

2. Clear glass or jar of Grade A Amber Color, Syrup

3. Clear glass or jar of Grade A Dark Color, Syrup

4. Clear glass or jar of Grade A Very Dark Color, Syrup

5. Cake (not less than 1lbs.) maple sugar (should be wrapped in paraffin paper or cellophane)

6. 1/2 lbs. small-size Sugar Cake assortment

7. 1lbs. jar Maple Cream

8. ½ lbs. container of granulated maple sugar <u>Premiums for class 9: Blue - \$16, Red - \$14,</u> Yellow - \$12

SHEAVES OF GRAIN - 10

<u>General Rules:</u>

1. Sheaves must be tied by two (2) bands and must measure at least 6 inches around and not more than 14 inches around at the bottom.

2. All sheaf exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor during the current season.

All sheaves must be well cured, not moist.
 Sheaves of cereals will be judged on the same

basis as field crop seeds in Section A.

5. Grasses, legumes and silage crops will be judged based on their value as forage or silage. Samples of hay will be judged in accordance with the factors used in determining hay grades under the standards of the United States Department of Agriculture.

6. There must be no roots left on any entry in this section.

7. Do not strip leaves from stalks.

8. The exact variety name must be written on the front of the entry tag

TALLEST CORN COMPETITION - 11

<u>General Rules:</u>

1. All corn stalks will stay on display for the duration of the Fair.

2. No roots; cut the stalk at the ground.

3. Measurement will be taken from the very bottom

to the very top. Presence of an ear is irrelevant.

4. Each entry must consist of six (6) stalks only the tallest stalk will be measured. Exhibitors must clearly tag which stalk they want measured.

Premiums for class 1: Blue - \$50, Red - \$25.
