Late entries will be charged a fee of \$25.00 per head through July 12. After July 12th late entries will not be accepted.

1. Entries in FFA Beef class are open to registered and grade animals cared for and fitted by FFA Chapter members.
2. **The same cattle cannot be shown in 4-H and FFA.**
3. All animals must have a double tie at night. No baling twine or wire.
4. A respiratory complex vaccine is strongly recommended four weeks prior to the fair.
5. Bovine Veterinary Checklist should be completed and presented at Vet Check.

DIVISION A - FITTING AND SHOWING

All FFA exhibitors must participate in showmanship. Overall showman will compete in the FFA Round Robin Competition.

5. Late Summer Yearling Bull, July, 1 – August 31 of previous year
6. Early Summer Yearling Bull May, 1 – June, 30 of previous year
7. Spring Yearling Bull, March, 1 – April, 30 of previous year
8. Early Junior Yearling Bull, January, 1 – February, 29 of previous year
9. Pair of Bulls, owned by exhibitor and shown in individual classes

10. Spring Heifer Calf, born after March 1 of the present year
11. Junior Heifer Calf, born between January 1 – February 29, of the present year
12. Winter Heifer Calf, born between November 1 – December 31, of the previous year
13. Senior Heifer Calf, born between September 1 – October 31, of the previous year
14. Late Summer Yearling Heifer, born between July 1 – August 30, of the previous year
15. Early Summer Heifer born May 1 – June 30, of the previous year
16. Spring Yearling Heifer born March 1 – April 30, of the previous year
17. Early Junior Yearling Heifer born January 1 – February 29, of the previous year
18. Pair of Heifers, owned by exhibitor and shown in individual classes
19. Pair of calves, one bull calf and one heifer calf, must be a spring, junior, or senior

CLASS NUMBER

20. Senior Yearling Bull, born between September 1 – December 31, two years previous
21. 2 year old Bull, born between January 1 – August 31, two years previous
22. Senior Yearling Heifer, born between September 1 – December 31, two years previous
23. Cow, 2 years and over, born prior to September 1 two years previous with a calf at side. Calf born after January 1 of the current year. (Judged as cow/calf 50/50). Not eligible for Grand and Reserve Champion. Cow/Calf Champion
24. Pair of females owned by exhibitor and shown in individual classes
25. Produce of dam, 2 animals, either sex from one dam, may be owned by more than one exhibitor. Limit one (1) entry per exhibitor. To be eligible each animal must be shown in individual classes.
26. Get of sire, 3 animals with both sexes represented, all sired by one bull, all owned by exhibitor. To be eligible each animal must be shown in individual classes.

ID Prior to arrival:

- REQUIRED: Legible Bangs Tattoo on females over 12 months of age.
- RECOMMENDED: USDA Metal ID or Brucellosis Tag & USDA NAIS ID & RFID Tag

The goal of the Veterinary Inspection is to minimize the potential for contagious and infectious diseases (including parasites). Examples of Infectious Disease and Parasites include:

- Infectious Foot Rot
- Snotty Nose/Respiratory
- Ring Worm
- Pinkeye
- Coarse, Dry Cough
- Evidence of Diarrhea
- Warts
- High Fever

No Visible External Parasite Burden (or related clinical signs):

- Mange
- Lice

Adequate Body Condition – Minimum BCS of 2.5

- 1: Emaciated
- 2: Thin
- 3: Good Condition
- 4: Overweight
- 5: Obese

- Feed and water should be available at the Fair at all times
