Late entries will be charged a fee of \$25.00 per head through July 12. After July 12th late entries will not be accepted.

- 1. Entries in FFA Dairy are open to registered and grade animals cared for and fitted by FFA Chapter members.
- 2. The same cattle cannot be shown in 4-H and FFA.
- Open Class Dairy shows the first 5 days meaning dairy shown in Open and FFA will be at Fair all 10 days.
- 4. All animals must have a double tie at night. No baling twine or wire.
- 5. No dairy animal with horns will be permitted to exhibit except those entered in the Junior Heifer calf class. Horns, as defined for all other age classes, shall include "scurs", "nubbins," or "stubs", which extend beyond the skin more than one inch.
- 6. All milk must be put into tank and will become property of the fair. All medicated animals must be milked last if using the parlor.
- 7. A respiratory complex vaccine is strongly recommended four weeks prior to the fair.
- 8. Bovine Veterinary Checklist should be completed and presented at Vet Check.

DIVISION A - FITTING AND SHOWING

All FFA exhibitors must participate in showmanship. Overall showman will compete in the FFA Round Robin Competition.

- 2. Intermediate heifer calf, born after December 1, of the previous year and before February 28, of the present year
- 3. Senior heifer calf, born after September 1, of the previous year and before November 30, of the previous year
- 4. Summer yearling heifer, born after June 1, of the previous year and before August 31, of the previous year
- 5. Junior yearling heifer, born after March 1, of the previous year and before May 31, of the previous year
- 6. Winter yearling heifer, born after December 1, of 2 years previous and before February 28, of the previous year
- 7. Senior yearling heifer, born after September 1, of 2 years previous and before November 30, 3 years previous

- 11. Senior 3 year old cow, born September 1, of 4 years previous through February 28, of 3 years previous
- 12.4 year old cow, born September 1, of 5 years previous through August 31, of 4 years previous
- 13.5 year old cow, born September 1, of 6 years previous through August 31, of 5 years previous
- 14. Aged cow, 5 years and over, born before September 1, of 6 years previous

- 17. Junior best 3 females. Group of consist of 3 junior females from senior yearling heifers or younger. None of which has freshened, all bred and owned by exhibitor
- 18. Senior best 3 females, group to consist of 3 females over 2 years of age which have freshened, all bred and owned by exhibitor
- 19. Chapter Herd 5 or more animals, 2 or more exhibitors.
