Rules and Regulations

Entries Open: July 29, 2024

Deadline: September 13, 2024

- 1. Entries: Entries must be pre-registered online by the above deadline. Link for the online entry can be found at <u>www.hotfair.com/hearts</u>
 - Educators and 4-H club sponsors with multiple entries, must print out their list of entries and exhibitors for ShoWorks (online registration system) and present such list at the submission drop off.
 - Entries can be paid with a credit card or with a check. Checks must be made out to HOTFR and sent to the address below within a week of online entry.

- 2. Refunds: No refunds will be issued for any reason. No exceptions.
- 3. **Passes:** Each exhibitor will receive two (2) single-day passes to the fair and one (1) single-day parking pass at check-in.
 - No passes are required for submission drop off.
- 4. **Interpretation and Violation of Rules:** The HOTFR reserves the right to its Board of Directors. The final and absolute right to interpret these rules, regulations and arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions and differences in regard hereto or otherwise arising out of the right to amend or add to these rules as its judgment may determine. The HOTFR also reserves the right to change the schedule, delete classes or add classes at the discretion of the show officials. An exhibitor who violates any of the rules will forfeit all privileges and premiums and be subject to such penalty as the Board of Directors may order.
- 5. Liability: The HOTFR will not be responsible for the loss, damage, theft, breakage or any other form of loss of your entry. It is distinctly understood that the HOTFR, its directors, volunteers and/or employees will not be held responsible for any loss, damage or injury of any character, to any person, vehicle or article while participating in the HEARTS division of the HOTFR.
- 6. **Special Rules:** Special rules or conditions are published in each Division when necessary and if there is a conflict between the special rules of any Division and the Rules and Regulations, the special rules will govern.
- 7. Eligibility of Exhibitors: Participation is limited to Texas resident students. Senior-level exhibitors from either a public, private, charter, or home school must be enrolled in an official art, photography, or CTE course (related to a specific division) in order to participate. Exhibitors can be registered members of a Texas 4H chapter. Students must not be older than nineteen (19) as of September 1st of the contest year.
- 8. Eligibility of Entries: All entries must be executed solely by the exhibitor submitting the entry, and be an original work by the exhibitor. All entries must be created after the start of the current school year, no sooner than August 1st of the contest year.
- 9. **Protests:** All protests must be made in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$50 cash, which will be refunded if the protest is sustained. All protests must be made at least 24 hours before





the awards presentation. Such protests and fees must be submitted in writing to the HEARTS Committee Chairman of the Heart O' Texas Fair & Rodeo. Such protests must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be delivered immediately after the occasion. All protests will be heard and determined by the HEARTS Committee. This committee's decision is final and may not be appealed.

10. Premiums: Awards will be paid by the HOTFR according to the amounts set in this catalog.

11. Judges Rules:

- Selection of Judges: Judges will be selected by the HOTFR. In every case, the judges are selected with the utmost care and the highest concern.
- **Decision of Judges:** The judge's decisions will be final in all cases and cannot be appealed.
- **Interference with Judges:** If any exhibitor, in any way, whether in person, by agent or servants, interferes with the judges during their adjudication, or shows any disrespect to them or the Contest, the management may demand a proper apology from such contestant. It may exclude him/her from the competition or withhold from such contestant premiums that may have been awarded. This may cause the exhibitor to be barred from future participation in the HOTFR.
- 12. Entry Limits: Only one entry per division per exhibitor. Students can participate in no more than two divisions. Example: Jane submits one entry in the Art Division. She also submits an entry in the Fashion Design Division.
- 13. **Objectionable Exhibits:** The HOTFR Management reserves the right to remove from the grounds any article/item/exhibit that may be falsely entered or may be deemed unsuitable or objectionable without assigning a reason.
- 14. **Anonymity of Exhibitor:** During the judging, neither the exhibitor's name nor school/4H chapter will be displayed. Each entry will be given a number. The name and school/4H chapter will be displayed after judging.
- 15. Entry Display: Entries and awards will be displayed in the BASE building during the HOTFR. Entries and awards must remain on display until the conclusion of the HOTFR. Removal of such items during the HOTFR will forfeit the exhibitor or school/4H chapter from participating in future contests.
 - Entry Display Limitations: Display of entries will be at the discretion of the HEARTS committee and HOTFR staff. Entry display may be limited to the top three in each category or division. Exception: Special Needs Division and Coloring Divisions.
- 16. Art Release: Entries will be available for pick up at the HOTFR office after the conclusion of the HOTFR. Exhibitors will have until November 1st to claim their entry. Any art not claimed will become the property of the HOTFR.

17. Unacceptable subject matter for entry:

- Satanic art

- Gang symbols or themes
- Wet paintings

- 5. Only one entry per exhibitor, limited to the first 25 exhibitors.
- 6. **Theme:** Open. Exhibitor must use their best judgment in exemplifying the mission of HOTFR and the purpose of HEARTS. The purpose is Heritage. The Arts. Technical Skills; To encourage youth participation in cultural, artistic, and technical endeavors.





7. Presentation:

- Exhibitors can use a medium of their choice; applied by brush or hand-drawn.
- 8. **Judging:** All entries will be judged by a panel of art professionals from the community and academia. All entries will be judged based on the appropriate score sheet. See score sheet. Under no conditions may parents/guardians, instructors, or exhibitors contact the judges to dispute the status of an entry. **The judges' decision is final.**
- 9. Sizes: Dimensions may be horizontal or vertical, but cannot exceed the specified size below. Incorrect sizes are subject to disqualification.
- Mandatory Size: 8" x 10" (may also include up to 3¹/₂" mat in addition

10. Matting and Mounting:

- Non-canvas illustrations must be matted and backed with material such as poster board, foam board, or heavy construction paper and must be of firm enough construction to prevent sagging.
- "Professional" mats are recommended but are not required. Frames are not allowed.
