RULES GOVERNING VETERINARY SCIENCE EXHIBITS

1. Champion & Reserve Champion Awards will be given per judges' discretion per department, division or class.
2. Age classification is as of January 1, of the current year.
3. For safety reasons, exhibits cannot include glass, syringes with needles, or any other sharp object.
4. No live animals can be used in exhibits in this department unless otherwise specified within a division.

Division Letter B. Vet Science – Age 8-13

Class #

1. Poster showing sanitation measures studied and practiced as a part of the project.
2. Original drawing of a body organ or tissue with an explanation of the specific diseases which affect it.
3. Poster showing characteristics of the normal animal. May include such items as pulse, temperature, respiration rate, etc.
4. Health record for 1 or more animals (In a folder or notebook)
5. Management record for the year (In a folder or notebook)
6. Any other vet science display or experiment

Division Letter: C. Vet Science – Age 14 & up

Class #

1. Poster or display showing the life cycle of an infectious organism with explanation of each cycle
2. Poster or display related to the study of external parasites
3. Poster or display related to the study of internal parasites
4. Poster or display showing a phase of immunology
5. Poster or display on an area of zoonosis
6. Poster or display on public health
7. Any other vet science display or experiment

HORSELESS HORSE/PONYLESS PONY & EQUINE EDUCATION

Equine Education Supreme Champion will be awarded on cumulative points from divisions E and Q.

Division Letter: E. Equine Education & Horseless Horse – All Ages

Class #

1. Booklet, poster or display showing safety habits or safety procedures with horse or pony
2. Any type of display or exhibit identifying the parts of the horse or pony
3. Booklet or poster showing different breeds of horses or ponies
4. Booklet or poster showing different styles and/or uses of horses or ponies
5. Booklet or Poster identifying driving vehicles, parts of the driving vehicle or harness
6. Booklet, poster or series of labeled and mounted photographs explaining things you have done in the Horseless Horse/Ponyless Pony project
7. Booklet or Poster or display showing a safe environment for a horse or pony (barn/stable/pasture/etc.)
8. Booklet or Poster showing the equipment used for Western or English riding
9. Booklet or Poster describing a Pony Project activity to be used at a meeting.
10. Booklet or Poster showing activities in the Equine Education Program
11. Equine Education promotional booklet or poster
12. Any other exhibit relating to Horseless Horse/Ponyless Pony or Equine Education
13. Set of flash cards (no larger than 5" X 7") depicting any equine science subject matter, with question(s) on one side and answer(s) on the opposite side. Must include reference to resource material used. Minimum of 20 flash cards **age 8-10**; 30 flash cards **age 11-13**; and 40 flash cards **age 14 & up**.
14. Poster or display that describes an equine related problem and your solution to the problem

Division Letter: Q. Model Horse – All Ages

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RULES GOVERNING MODEL HORSE EXHIBITS

1. Age classification is as of January 1, of the current year.
2. Champion & Reserve Champion Awards will be given per judges' discretion per department, division, or class.
3. Displays are not to exceed 24" x 18" (exceptions made for draft horse hitches)

Class#

1. A display showing the history and origin of a particular breed of horse; include written explanation of display.
2. A display accurately depicting an actual arena horse judged event (driving, saddle seat, western pleasure, trail class, or costume); include written explanation of display.
3. A display depicting the quality daily care of a horse on home grounds; scene should provide evidence of animal grooming, barn maintenance, and animal welfare considerations. Include written summary of horse care research as it pertains to the display.
4. Any display depicting horse fantasy. Include a written summary of the scene and what is taking place.

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Division Letter: S. Animal Science, Age 8-13

Division Letter: T. Animal Science, Age 14 & up

Class #

1. Create an exhibit focused on a body system or physical characteristics of one or more animal species.
2. Create an exhibit focused on one or more diseases that affect animal species of your choosing.
3. Create an exhibit focused on proper care and/or grooming for one or more animal species.
4. Create an exhibit focused on animal reproduction or care of young.
5. Create an exhibit focused on behavior, intelligence, or fascinating facts related to one or more specific animal species.
6. Create an exhibit focused on animal selection for breeding or show.
7. Create an exhibit focused on your efforts to educate others about one or more specific animal species.
8. Any other animal science exhibit.
