RULES GOVERNING GOAT EXHIBITS

- 1. Breeding Stock (females) must have USDA scrapie letter.
- 2. Each exhibitor must be YQCA certified and meet mandatory meeting requirements in order to exhibit at the Walworth County Fair
- 2. All goats must be in place by 8:00 pm Tuesday. No tying of animals in pens.
- 3. Market Goats, male (whether) or female must be born after Jan. 1st of current year. Both will be shown in the same classes based on weight. All market goats will be weighed on Wednesday at 9 a.m. in the show ring of the goat barn. Minimum weight for a market goat to sell is 50 pounds unless a miniature breed. All exhibitors must bring their market goats to our Goat Fun Day meeting at the fairgrounds to identify tattoos prior to fair.
- 4. Market classes will be determined after weigh in on Wednesday once the numbers and weights have been established be the Goat Project Committees.
- 5. Bracing is allowed. However, all goats must have four feet on the floor of the show ring at all times. Lifting feet off the ground or placing them on any support or altered ring surface is not acceptable. Exhibitors will receive one warning if they are found lifting or slapping goats. Second offense will result in automatic exhibitor disqualification from the Goat Show.
- 6. Identification of Goat form must be turned in to the Superintendent by June 30 or you will not be allowed to show.
- 7. No animal with natural horns may be exhibited except Meat Goat Classes.
- 8. Every goat must be provided with a collar.
- 9. An exhibitor will be allowed to identify 10 animals of breeding stock, **of which 6 may be shown**, along with 4 market of which 2 may be shown for a total of 8 animals to be shown.
- 10. An exhibitor may sell no more than a total of four (4) entries from market goat, poultry, or rabbit projects, at the Fur & Feather Sale.

 All animals sold at the sale must be commercial grade and blue-ribbon winners.
- 11. No exhibitor in the Junior Department will be allowed to compete in a Showmanship Contest which he or she has won the previous year except in the Senior Division. Members who have won the Senior Division, regardless of age, must continue in Senior Division. Seniors will be able to compete again if they win, unless they have won the Master Showman Contest. Winners can sit one year to regain eligibility within the age group where the award took place, or must advance to the next age group. SHOWMANSHIP MUST BE PRE-REGISTERED in the class eligible to compete, to receive premiums. Exhibitor age will be determined as of Jan. 1 of the current year. Master Showman winners are not eligible to compete again.
- 12. Barn duty is required of all exhibitors. Exhibitors must attend three county project meetings. Failure to comply with either portion of this rule will be cause for disqualification from the goat show and goat portion of the Fur & Feather Sale.
- 13. Any goat deemed unmanageable will be asked to be removed by order of superintendent.
- 14. All show corrections due to superintendent by Wednesday at 6 p.m.
- 15. You must show an animal in a Breed class to show it in the costume class.
- 16. "The Goat Project Committee has the right to break a wether class, larger than 6 entries, by weight."
