A. Ingram Historical Murals – Mural

Tom Moore Lumber, 112 TX-39

Original Artist: Jack Feagan, 1989

Sixteen mural 'snapshots' of local history of the West Kerr area. Fifteen 12ft by 12ft murals are mounted along the Hwy. 39 side of the building, while the large piece, 76ft by 8ft faces Hwy. 27.

B. Sculpture Stonehenge II and Easter Island Replicas – Sculptures

Hill Country Arts Foundation Campus, 120 Point Theatre Rd S

Artists: Al Shepperd & Doug Hill, 1990

An art project erected by Al Shepperd and his neighbor Doug Hill, the finished Stonehenge project is 90% as wide and 60% the height of the original. The Easter Island heads are 13ft tall.

C. "Miss Forest" – Sculpture

Center Point Art, 313 Ranch to Market Rd 480

Artist: Yoshimoto Nara

Yoshimoto Nara is among the most beloved Japanese artists of his generation. His sculpture Miss Forest, a 26ft 4,500 pound outdoor painted urethane on bronze sculpture is installed on the Center Point Art campus. Elegantly standing like a sleeping forest spirit, the sculpture evokes the Shinto tradition and the artist's upbringing in Hiroasaki.

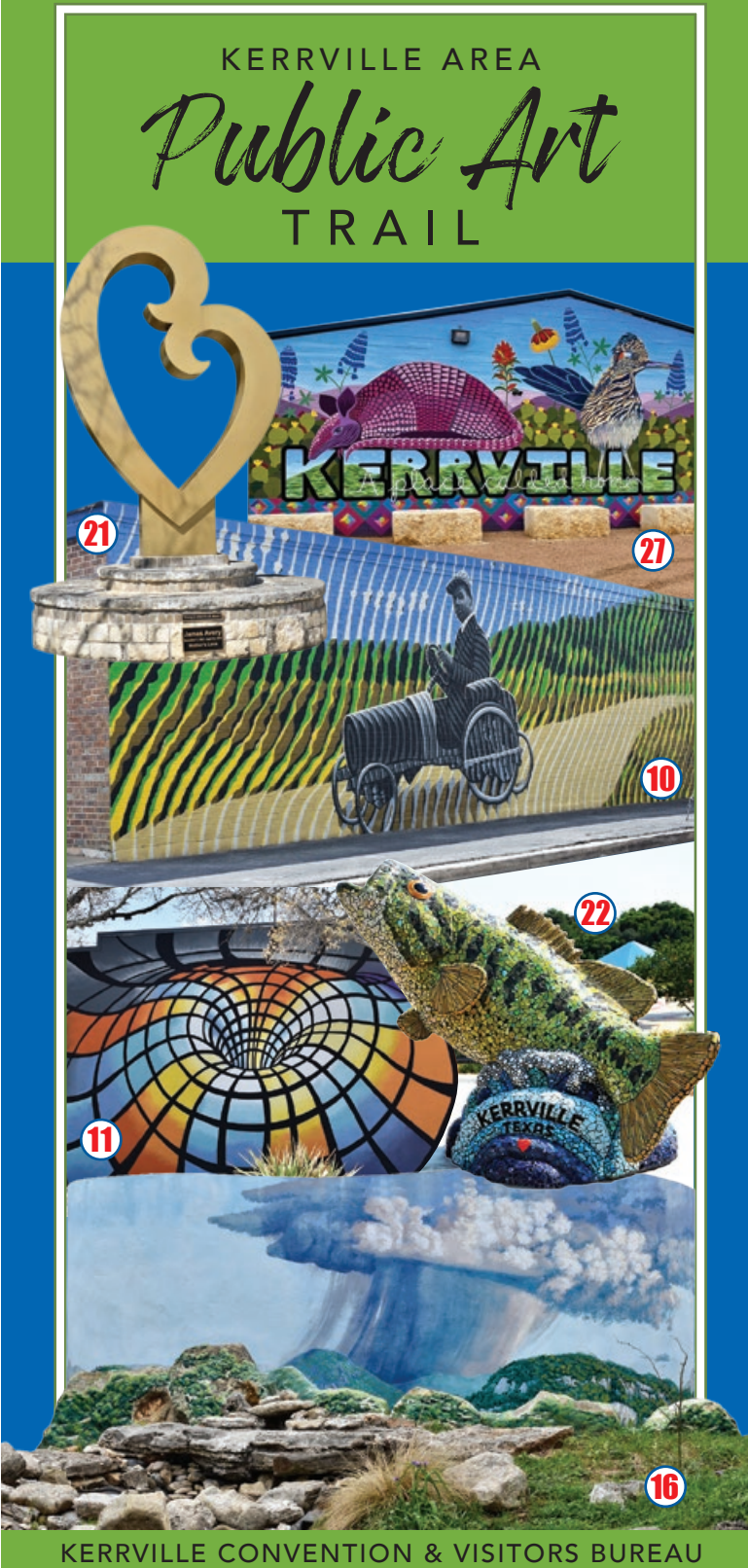

Camp Verde Store, 285 Camp Verde Rd E

In 1856 the United State Army at Camp Verde experimented using camels for military transport. This statue is a tribute to this project. The Fort was deactivated in 1869.

2. The Coming King Sculpture & Prayer Garden – Sculpture

Multiple sculptures throughout the grounds with exceptional hilltop views.

Explore the art on the back of this daytime lounge that serves both coffee and mixed drinks.

8. "Landprint" – Mural

9. "Hobo Code" – Mural

Pint and Plow, 332 Clay St

Artist: Bill Tavis, 2020

Located at the brewery, this unique black-and-white mural was inspired by symbols from the National Cryptologic Museum.

10. "Harry Dietert" – Mural

Napa Auto Parts, 601 Jefferson St

Artist: Bill Tavis, 2020

This modern mural was influenced by a photo of Harry Dietert in his small home-built car that was taken around 1914 when he was a student at Tivy High School. Harry, an engineer, would go on to play a role in automobile manufacturing before returning to Kerrville in the 1950s.

11. Pop Art – Mural

Artists: Marty Garcia & Tivy High School Art Dept., 2019

This mural depicts a vibrant vortex of bright red, orange and blue.

12. "Restore & Recharge" – Mural

Public Downtown Parking Garage, 201 Clay St

Artists: Ren Wright-Trapino & Notre Dame Catholic School, 2021

This mural promotes environmental awareness and clean energy.

13. "Juan Carlos" the Green Anole with Native Lantana – Mural

Public Downtown Parking Garage, 201 Clay St

Artist: Anat Ronen, 2023

The massive mural stretches across 100ft of concrete and transforms a utilitarian parking garage wall into a work of art.

14. “Regenerate” – Mural
 Voekel Engineering, 212 Clay St
 Artists: Andrew & Sarah McWilson, 2021
 The mural represents two worlds: nature and man. It celebrates the process of growth, shedding and renewal.

15. Storybook Mosaics – Mosaics
 Butt-Holdsworth Memorial Library, 505 Water St
 Artist: Unknown

16. Riverside Nature Center – Sculpture & Mural
 150 Francisco Lemos St
 Artists: “The Promise” -Dean Mitchell, 2000 and “Hill Country Thunderstorm”- Russell Cushman
 The Riverside Nature Center offers both sculpture and mural art throughout their beautiful native garden as well as educational opportunities and direct access to the Kerrville River Trail.

17. Patriotic Mural
 Mamacita’s Restaurant, 215 Junction Hwy
 A patriotic mural commissioned by a local business owner.

18. “Kerrville – Live Happy” – Mural
 The Arcadia Live Theater, 717 Water St
 Artist: Brent Hale, 2021

19. The Star at Water St
 Water St/Earl Garrett St, 798 Water St
 The downtown “star” at the intersection of Water and Earl Garrett Streets was created to recognize Kerrville’s beginnings and the history of cattle drives that stopped here along the bluffs of the Guadalupe River.

20. Kerr Arts & Cultural Center – Sculptures & Mural
 Kerr Arts & Cultural Center, 228 Earl Garrett St
 KACC showcases public art pieces in front of their building as well as a mural painted on one of their walls.

21. “Mother’s Love” – Bronze
 Downtown Kerrville, 228 Earl Garrett St, by Kerr Arts & Cultural Center
 Artist: James Avery, 2012
 The Mother’s Love sculpture was erected in 2012 and dedicated as the James Avery Memorial in 2018. James Avery started his jewelry company in Kerrville over 70 years ago and was a great supporter of the community.

22. “Lupe” the Guadalupe Bass – Sculpture
 Louise Hays Park, 202 Thompson Dr, by Children’s Splash Pad
 Artist: Gigi Miller, 2017
 Lupe the Guadalupe Bass was sculpted by thousands of mosaic pieces and modeled after the official state fish, the Guadalupe Bass. Some of the mosaic tiles used were created by local residents.

23. “Kerrville Kindness” and “Hill Country Strong” – Murals

26. “Riparian” – Mural
 Hwy. 27 and the Kerrville River Trail

 This mural promotes environmental awareness, and beautifies a portion of the Kerrville River Trail as it connects to the Schreiner University campus.

27. “Love Letter to Kerrville” – Mural

 This mural pays homage to local wildlife and the Kerrville area’s abundance of natural beauty.

 “Ocean”: Samantha Bass with guidance from Kristin LaRue, 2021
 “Barn Swallows” celebrates the birds that call the municipal pool home each summer, and “Ocean” celebrates the backbone of life on Earth.

29. “Game Changerz” & “Eagles Fly with Eagles”
 Carver Park, 820 Webster St
 Artist: George Waring with support from Marty Garcia & Kristin LaRue, 2023
 This mural celebrates Annie Doyle and B.T. Wilson, two individuals integral to educating the city’s African-American youth.

 The twin sister artist duo was inspired by the importance of creating mental, physical, and emotional space in our lives in order to thrive. This mural was created to foster mental health awareness.
