

LIVESTOCK EXHIBITOR BARN ETIQUETTE POLICY

Tulsa State Fair Open Show and Junior Show Exhibitors:

Listed below are the expectations of exhibitors and the care they provide to their animals in the barns during the duration of the Tulsa State Fair. Please remember, the barns are a window to the public, allowing us the opportunity to educate and promote the importance of the agriculture industry. Safe, Clean, Friendly, and Fun are our priority to provide the best experience possible for our exhibitors and visitors while at the Tulsa State Fair.

Barn/Stall Cleanliness

- Barns should look welcoming and appealing to the public at ALL times.
- Properly dispose animal waste in the manure pits outside of the barns. **DO NOT** put manure in trash cans. Yellow trash cans are for trash only.
- Properly dispose trash in the yellow trash cans.
- Keep aisles clean and neat with adequate width for visitors.
- Keep feed, tack, equipment, and personal items stored neatly.

Animal Care

- Keep animals clean, well groomed, and properly spaced.
- Provide adequate, clean bedding for animals.
- Keep your animals cool and hydrated. Make sure they have constant access to fresh water. Happy, healthy animals perform their best!
- Report any animal health concerns to the Livestock Superintendent.

Share Your Story

- Attitude of exhibitors must be knowledgeable, courteous and friendly.
- Remember, you are more than just a competitor, you're an ambassador for agriculture. Take time to share your story, talk about your animal, and educate consumers visiting the Fair.

Stay Alert

- Stay aware of your surroundings.
- Keep a watchful eye on your animals, family, and friends.
- If you see anything unusual like someone acting oddly or taking photos or videos in the barns or show ring without permission, report it to a Livestock Superintendent or the Livestock Office immediately.
- Don't hesitate to speak up if something seems off or wrong.
