ABGA MEAT GOAT RULES

- 1) Please read all Fair Rules & Regulations, IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and the NYS Animal Health Requirements.
- Early entries in all divisions of this Department close on MONDAY JULY 14, 2025. Entries must be paid online for the total amount of entry fees (\$5 per class/\$15 per class after 7/14) and \$20.00 to cover the Exhibitor's wristband OR \$100.00 for Erie County Agricultural Society Membership.
- 3) If more passes are needed for your help, \$12.00 one-day workers pass can be purchased (quantity may be limited).
- 4) All New York State Veterinarian decisions are final and supported by Erie County Fair Staff inappropriate conduct will not be tolerated and can result in forfeit of premiums and removal from fair.
- 5) Youth exhibitors may enter any animal in the ABGA breeding show. However, when entering in the open class the youth must pay ALL appropriate fees; this includes the exhibitor wristband, entry fees, and late fees.
- 6) ABGA rules shall govern. This show is sanctioned by the American Boer Goat Association.
- 7) An official Registration Certificate from one of the following associations must be shown on each animal (American Boer Goat Assoc., International Boer Goat Assoc., U.S. Boer Goat Assoc. or the Canadian Boer Goat Assoc.). These will be checked for identification, ownership, and birth date.
- 8) All animals must be entered in an individual class in order to be at the Fair.
- 9) Only goats entered under their ABGA registration number and presenting their ABGA Certificate of Registration will be eligible to earn points for their actual placing in the shows as described in the ABGA Criteria for Ennoblement of a Boer Goat.
- 10) Show Management may add additional classes if warranted.
- 11) Initial sawdust bedding will be supplied to exhibitors. However, if the exhibitor wishes to have shavings or straw they must bring it or buy it from a purveyor on the grounds. The Fair will not be providing straw or shavings.
- 12) Entry fees do not guarantee "tack space/pens". In divisions where entries do not exceed available space "tack pens" will be assigned by the superintendent.
- 13) Stall space assignments are based upon 2 adult does per pen, 1 adult buck per pen or 2-3 kids per pen.
- 14) All animals must be appropriately identified and comply with USDA Scrapie Eradication Program Guidelines, as well as a legible tattoo consistent with the registration certificate.
- 15) Rules of the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets Standards for the Conduct of Agriculture and Markets for Fairs and Summary of Livestock Health Requirements shall apply.
- 16) Base date for ages is the date of the show.
- 17) Animals will be posed with all 4 feet on the ground at all times. Exhibitors unable to comply will be excused from the ring.
- 18) No sale pens, all animals must be entered in the show.
- 19) The decision of the judge shall be final in all cases, except where error, mistake, fraud, misrepresentation, or collusion, not discovered at the time of the award, is proven. In such cases, the decision of Show Management, or such referee appointed shall be final.

Protest:

- a. Protests regarding any livestock competitions and events held by the Erie County Agricultural Society, during the Erie County Fair, in Hamburg, NY (Youth Livestock Expo & Open Class Livestock Shows) must be made in writing on the appropriate form (link here), plainly stating the reason for the complaint or appeal. This form along with a \$300 cash deposit must be submitted to the CEO of the Erie County Agricultural Society The deposit shall be refunded <u>only</u> if the protest is sustained by the Erie County Agricultural Society CEO. If the protest is not sustained, the \$300 will be donated to the Erie County Agricultural Society scholarship fund.
- b. Classification and Judges opinion are not eligible for protest.
- c. Protests against the exhibition of animals shall be filed at least 3 hours before the start of the show that the animal/ exhibitor is being made against will show in.
- d. The CEO of the Erie County Agricultural Society may hold a meeting regarding the protest at which time the party making the protest may present evidence or argument in support of the protest.
- e. The written decision of the CEO of the Erie County Agricultural Society shall be final and shall be served by certified mail to the party making the protest within five days of the date on which the protest was heard.
- f. Exhibitors of animals at livestock competitions shall at all times deport themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. Their conduct in this competitive environment shall always reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education. This code applies to junior as well as open class exhibitors who compete in structured classes of competition. This code applies to all livestock offered in any event at a livestock show.

RELEASE SCHEDULE:

For your safety and the safety of the public the Erie County Fair has a release schedule. This program was designed to eliminate the congestion of trucks and trailers on the Fairgrounds during release times. Each exhibitor will receive a time slot. Each time slot will be 30 minutes. You will only be allowed into the Fairgrounds with your truck and trailer for that time slot assigned. The exhibitor's that have the longest travel time will receive the earliest time slot. Multiple trips will also be considered. It is in each exhibitor's best interest to help each other load animals and tack.

Exhibitors can sign up at the Fair for the Showmanship Show. There will be no entry fee charged on premiums awarded. Grand & Reserve Champion will be chosen & given awards. The class breakdown is as follows:

- Senior Showman 17-21 years old
- Intermediate Showman 13-16 years old
- Junior Showman 9-12 years old
- Pee Wee Showman 4-8 years old
- Novice Showman (first time showman) 4-21 years old

GROUP CLASSES

HERDSMANSHIP

Three Herdsmanship awards will be given out to goat exhibitors.

1st place: \$62.50 and a banner

2nd place: \$37.50

3rd place: \$18.75

Fair & Show Management will judge the exhibitors daily on the following criteria:

- 1. Stall decorations should tie to the theme. This year's theme will be "Sights, Sounds, Tastes, and Feels of the Fair"
- 2. Cleanliness & neatness of aisles, pens, bedding and animals.
- 3. Promptness in getting animals into the show ring and competence in show ring.
- 4. Courtesy to fellow breeders, spectators and others during the exhibit.
- 5. Personal appearance, including neatness and cleanliness of clothing in and out of the show ring.
- 6. Systematic and neat arrangement of feed, feed pans, bedding, tack, etc.
