

More than one entry can be made per class; however, they must be different fermentations or ingredients. Wines entered in the wrong class will be reclassified if correct class has not yet been judged.
- 9. Judging will begin at noon, Saturday. Judges will be asked to give reasons for their decision on the quality of the wine. Wines will be judged on a 20 point system. Some of the criteria will be: clarity, color, aroma, bouquet, body, flavor and balance. Judges may enter wine but cannot judge in that class. Judges' decisions to be final.
- 10. Ribbons will be awarded in each class (if scored high enough).
- 11. **Best of Show, 1**st **Runner-up,** and **2**nd **Runner-up** will be <u>awarded for BOTH Scratch & Kit wines</u>. Ribbons not picked up at judging will be mailed.
