

POULTRY SHOW

OSCEOLA COUNTY FAIR & LIVESTOCK SHOW GUIDELINES FOR EXHIBITION

1. The Osceola County Fair & Livestock Show does not take responsibility for lost, damaged or misdirected forms, entries or articles of exhibit.
2. All rules are subject to the interpretation of the Board of Directors of the Fair. All decisions made by the Board are final. This Board reserves the right to deny or allow any entry to the Fair and Fairgrounds.
3. All non-commercial exhibits must check in according to committee guidelines as published. No exhibit may leave the grounds prior to the scheduled release dates & times as indicated in the various calendars and/or individual department or section rules.
4. In all events and exhibits being judged, the judge's decision shall be final.
5. All entries, if not claimed by close of check out time shall become the property of the Fair. All premiums will be paid, and checks mailed within 6 weeks after the fair ends. Premium checks MUST be cashed within 60 days of the issue date.
6. A \$30.00 fee or 5% of the face amount will be charged for any bad check received by the Fair for entries, animal sales, sponsorships, contracts, etc.
7. Any formal complaints shall be presented in writing within six (6) hours of the discrepancy to the Fair Office to be handled as they see fit.
8. Any exhibitor or vendor conducting or participating in any illegal or immoral activities on the Fairgrounds shall forfeit all rights to display at the Fair and will lose any monies owed or paid by/to the Fair for premiums, sales, privilege agreements, etc.
9. If these rules contradict any committee rule(s) the committee rule(s) shall prevail.
10. By signing any privilege agreement, license, entry form, etc., participant agrees to release and discharge the Kissimmee Valley Livestock Show & Fair, Inc. and the Board of Directors & staff thereof from all liabilities, claims, and demands of whatever kind or nature that may arise from or be connected with the participant's participation in any activity sponsored by Kissimmee Valley Livestock Show & Fair, Inc.

ELIGIBILITY:

- Exhibitor must be 8 years old by **September 1, prior to fair.**
- Exhibitor must be a current member of Osceola County 4-H, FFA, or FCCLA and may enter all open class shows.
- **Any 4-H, FFA or Open exhibitors conducting or participating in any illegal or illicit activities including tobacco, alcohol, vaping around the Fairgrounds shall forfeit all rights to show and / or sell at the Fair. Any monies owed by the Fair for sales, premiums, and awards will be withheld by KVLS for current year.**

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS:

- All animals will be required to meet the guidelines set by the State of Florida, Department of Agriculture.
- **DO NOT bathe any animals in the wash stations or use water for animals for drinking from the wash stations. For sanitary purposes DO NOT use the water or bathe any animals in the bathroom sink. Please use the designated water spicket/hose for water of all animals.**

TRANSPORTATION OF ANIMALS:

- All Poultry animals must be transported in an animal safe carrier or cage to and from the fair.

JUDGING:

- Only Blue-Ribbon exhibits will be eligible for Best in Class, Grand Champion and Reserve Champion places. Exhibitors must be present during judging or prior arrangements must be made with the committee, otherwise no premiums will be paid. An animal can only be shown in one class.
- Birds are judged according to the American Poultry Association (APA) Standard of Perfection and the American Bantam Association (ABA) of Perfection. Birds recognized by the ABA will be placed in classifications of the APA. Birds not currently recognized as a breed by these Associations can be still be shown in Grooming or Commercial Classes.
- Exhibitors are **NOT PERMITTED** to give **ANYTHING** to any judges or act as though they may give anything to any judges during any show.

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DRESS CODE:

- **FOR THE SHOW:**
 - All exhibitors must wear a white, sleeved, collared dress shirt or blouse, tucked in with dark blue or black western trousers or western jeans.
 - Boots or any closed toes shoes.
 - Exhibitors may wear a 4-H or FFA jacket. A 4-H or FFA tie may be worn if the exhibitor desires.
 - No other jackets, vests, or ties will be allowed.
- **FOR SHOWMANSHIP/SALE:**
 - All exhibitors must wear a long-sleeved shirt, collard dress shirt or blouse, tucked in with nice clean jeans or western dress trousers.
 - Boots or any closed toes shoes.
 - Jackets, ties, vests, will be allowed.
 - **THERE WILL BE NO EXCEPTIONS TO THIS RULE.**

AC/HEAT:

- There is no AC or Heat. **BLANKETS ON TOP OF CAGES** must be **REMOVED** by 10:00 AM or earlier if the fair opens before 10:00 AM. Blankets cannot be put on cages before 8:00 PM (this includes tarps). You may store them folded in the exhibitor feed area.

SIGNAGE:

- ONLY SIGNAGE APPROVED BY THE FAIR OFFICE AND/OR COMMITTEES ARE PERMITTED ON CAGES OR PENS. Please see a Poultry Committee Member if you have any questions.
- **FOR SALE signs may be placed on the cages the 2nd weekend of the fair, with pickup on Sunday at checkout time. Exhibitor must be present to release birds to the new owner(s)**

REGISTRATION:

- All animals must be registered **ONLINE**.
- **All Exhibitors are required to have an Ethics Number. Please register online at www.floridastatefairag.com/ethics. You may take the Ethics Class at any location offered listed on the Florida State Fair website. You must preregister for the ethics class online. Your Ethics Certificate will be valid for 3 Fair Seasons. (Not 3 calendar years). ALL ETHICS NUMBERS MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE FAIR OFFICE NO LATER THAN **12/30/2024**.**
- *** If unsure of breed/variety you may bring your bird to any of the workshops or contact the Chair or Co-Chair for assistance.

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- **MANDATORY PRE-FAIR WORKSHOP in January. All exhibitors are to attend to receive updated fair information and changes.** YOUTH MUST ATTEND THE HANDS-ON BATHING/PEST CONTROL PORTION OF THE WORKSHOP IN JANUARY, *if they have not previously done so* and is optional for those who have previously attended (see calendar for exact dates & times). **Hands on portion will begin right after the Pre-Fair portion.** Please bring one bird per family and any grooming materials for hands on workshop. **ANY QUESTIONS PLEASE CONTACT THE POULTRY CHAIR OR CO-CHAIR.**
- In the event, *you need to change your entry*, you must *email the chairperson no later than January 27, 2025 or at the workshop on January 25, 2025.*
- **Parent & youth will need to sign the acknowledgement form that will be provided at the January workshop.** Both the parent and the youth are to read, fill out and sign the form per exhibitor. **Bring filled out form to check-in.** If the form is not brought to check in, then the parent and exhibitor will be required to read and sign the acknowledgement form prior to your animal(s) checking in (a separate table will be set up to speed up check in)
- If at judging, birds are found to be in wrong class, they will be moved to grooming. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

ANIMAL CARE:

- Exhibitors will be required to feed and water their own animals and bring their **OWN feeders, waterers, and feed.** All animals must be cared for by the exhibitor. This includes feeding, watering, and cleaning beds and pens. Exhibitors will need to bring feed each day for their animals. ****Please DO NOT feed anyone else's bird. Not all birds are on same type of food or feeding schedule. * DO NOT use anyone else's food. They did not bring extra to feed yours.**
- **Any feed or equipment left in the feed area are at the owners' own risk. The Fair, the Fair Board, or Poultry Committee are not responsible for missing, broken, or left behind items.**
- All Poultry animals must be transported in an animal safe carrier or cage to and from the fair.
- The use of any unlabeled products is not permitted at the fair.
- The use of any sprays or chemicals are NOT PERMITTED to be used in or around the cages.
- It is not the responsibility of the KVLS Committee to feed and/or water animals.
- If an exhibitor fails to feed and/or water their animals for 24 hours the exhibitor will be asked to remove their animal.

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- Please clean out cages daily and rake under pens daily. **Please DO NOT put plastic down under the mulch. Completely remove the mulch as needed (does not need to be removed daily unless very messy, but at minimum of the both Saturdays and Wednesday). Please do not put clean mulch on top of the dirty mulch.** Be sure mulch is in good condition on show day. Remember these exhibits are for the public to view, let's show them something we can be proud of.
 - **USED MULCH IS TO BE TAKEN BEHIND THE BARN TO THE DESIGNATED AREA. DO NOT** put the used mulch with the new mulch that is located outside the tents.

COMMUNITY SERVICE:

- Both adults & youth are to sign in and out of tent each time you go into feed, water, clean, barn duty, or anytime you spend time in the tent. *Sign in sheet must be signed by the youth and parent on separate lines. Please DO NOT sign in a child/or child that is/are not present at the time. Youth will need to sign in for themselves or no credit will be given.*
- Show times **DO NOT** count towards community service hours.
- Other activities during the fair outside of the tent **DO NOT** count towards community service hours. These activities include other shows, food booth duty or walking around the fair.
- Certificates will be emailed to exhibitors after the fair.

HANDLING:

- No animal will be exhibited in competition that cannot be properly handled by the exhibitor.
- Animals that cannot be handled properly will be disqualified and premiums forfeited.

SHOW LIMITATION:

- There must be a minimum of five animals per species to have a show (unless otherwise stated **or approved by the Committee Chair**).

CHECK-IN:

- Youth and adults are not to move birds from the assigned cages.
- On Friday, early morning the Poultry Committee will move birds to be in the correct breed section and to condense cage space. If you wish to move your own bird, you will need to be present when we move the birds.
- Birds will be inspected by the Poultry Committee and Florida State Health Inspector.
- ALL Poultry will be NPIP tested unless a NPIP Card is presented.
- All sick birds or birds with external parasites will be isolated and are not eligible for competition or awards. Birds must be removed from the premises immediately.

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- *Eggs will be collected by the Poultry Committee at various times during the day and will be disposed of at the discretion of the fair. SORRY NO EGGS WILL BE LEFT IN THE CAGES.*
- **ALL carriers are to be taken home after Rabbit and/or Poultry check-in. Due to the size of carriers and storage space, carriers are not to be used as your supply/show box.**

CHECKOUT:

- Any **UNAUTHORIZED ANIMAL REMOVED** before checkout time and date will result in forfeiture of premium money.
- *Animals not picked up may be adopted out at the discretion of the Poultry Committee at no liability to the fair.*
- **ABSOLUTELY NO VEHICLE WILL BE ALLOWED IN THE FAIR AREA. THE FAIR IS STILL OPEN TO THE PUBLIC AND THEREFORE IS NOT ALLOWED.** Vehicles may be pulled into the extension parking lot. Once you are ready to load up only one vehicle at a time may pull up to the side gate for loading. Once loaded please move your vehicle to allow others to pull up.
- **ANY ITEMS LEFT BEHIND** become the property of the fair and will be used, disposed of, or donated at our choosing. No liability is assumed by the Fair, Fair Board, or Poultry Committee. **So be sure your name is on all of your equipment.**
- **ALL exhibitors are to check out at the back table with the committee member** to ensure all documents/items have been given to the youth (This does not take long). Failure to check out may result in items being disposed of at committee or fair discretion. Any certificates not picked up will not be reprinted or emailed.

PREMIUMS:

- All premiums will be mailed to the exhibitors after the fair. Please allow up to 6 weeks.
- **Your animal area must be always clean (inside/underneath/around), including checkout time. If not clean, premiums will be forfeited***

*****BIRDS REMOVED BEFORE OR NOT PICKED UP AT CHECKOUT TIME WILL FORFEIT PREMIUMS*****

SHOWS AND TENTS:

- All Shows – all tents are to be cleaned before, during and after.
- All trash & grooming items are to be properly put away or disposed of to the correct trash receptacles. – throughout the tent and under the bleachers.

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- Tents are to remain clean. All trash is to be disposed of to the correct trash receptacles. Exhibitor feed areas are to be in a clean organized condition at all times. DO NOT use another person's feed.
- **No parents, leaders, or advisors are to be around the youth or in the arena during the show without prior arrangement with the Poultry Chair or Co-Chair.**

POULTRY RULES AND REGULATIONS

Health Requirements:

- All poultry are required to be free of disease, parasites, and mites. Poultry not free may be disqualified. All poultry will be inspected and tested at check-in.
- **ANY BIRDS IN QUESTION WILL BE SENT HOME.**
- **MANDATORY PRE-FAIR WORKSHOP in January** (see calendar for exact dates & times). **All exhibitors are to attend to receive updated fair information and changes.** YOUTH MUST ATTEND THE HANDS- ON BATHING/PEST CONTROL PORTION OF THE WORKSHOP IN JANUARY, **if they have not previously done so and is optional for those who have previously attended** (see calendar for exact dates & times). **Hands on portion will begin right after the Pre-Fair portion.** *Please bring one bird per family and any grooming materials for hands on workshop.* **ANY QUESTIONS PLEASE CONTACT THE POULTRY CHAIR OR CO-CHAIR.**
- If a bird gets sick during the fair, please notify a committee member. They will notify the Chair or Co-Chair. Only persons authorized to send a bird home sick and not forfeit premiums are the Chair, Co-Chair, or a veterinarian (written proof to be provided to fair office). We do not want sick animals at the fair nor do we want you to lose your premiums.

Animal Eligibility:

- Birds need to be at least 6 months old or older by fair check-in date. **Exhibitors will need to be able to handle their birds.**
- **No classes are provided for Guineas or Peacocks.**

Entries Allowed:

- A total of six (6) birds allowed per exhibitor. May enter three (3) in addition if part of the Production Trio. May enter three (3) in addition if part of the Poultry Auction Hens Sale,

Judging:

- Poultry will be judged in the cages for the first part. Those who will be going to the next level of judging will be called into the arena.

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- Poultry will be judged on tables and is subject to change. (Please attend Poultry workshops offered through KVLS or your individual programs to learn how to properly show poultry on tables.)
- Exhibitors are NOT PERMITTED to give ANYTHING or act as though they may give anything to any judges to any Judge during any show.

- Red - \$3.00
- Best of Category (ie. American, Asiatic, SCCL, Feather Legged, etc) - \$5.00
- White - \$2.00
- Best of Class- \$5.00

Entry Forms:

- Entries will be accepted online ONLY. Be sure you are entering in the correct size - bantam or Standard/Large Fowl, duck/geese by weight size, turkeys, or Misc. (quail). Include the variety/color. ***If unsure you may bring bird(s) to any of the workshops or contact the Chair or Co-Chair for assistance.

Feeding:

- **Cups will be NOT provided for food or water.** Exhibitor must bring a large waterer and a heavy food dish (so they don't tip over easily. It is recommended the waterers be attached to the side of the pen using the Soda Pop Water Bottle Bird Drinker Cup or any bird container you can attach inside the cage, so they don't get knocked over. **ALL CONTAINERS BROUGHT IN MUST BE CLEAN AND HAVE NO RUST. Any questions please contact chair or co-chair for more information.**
- **TRIOS, Ducks, Geese and Turkeys containers must be provided by owner.** Be sure containers are secure or designed so will not tip over.
- **Please be sure your name is on all of your equipment.**
- NO HAY IS ALLOWED IN THE PENS.
- **No Foam Boards allowed to separate birds.** Please DO NOT remove the dividers from between cages.
- A roost or small carpet will be permitted as long as the pen is kept clean **DAILY.** If not done so, items will be removed & discarded
- **Both adults & youth are to sign in and out of tent each time you go into feed, water, clean, barn duty, or anytime you spend time in the tent. Sign in sheet must be signed by the youth and parent on separate lines. Please DO NOT sign in a child/or child that is/are not present at the time. Youth will need to sign in for themselves or no credit will be given.**

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- Show times **DO NOT** count towards community service hours.
- Other activities during the fair outside of the tent **DO NOT** count towards community service hours. These activities include other shows, food booth duty or walking around the fair.
- Certificates will be emailed to exhibitors after the fair.

Skill-a-thon & Showmanship contests are highly recommended. Showmanship will be on Sunday of the show starting at 2:30 PM for Juniors, 3:15 PM for Intermediate, and 4:00 PM for Seniors. The Skill-a-thon is on the 2nd Saturday of the fair at 9AM.

SECTION 1 | POULTRY SHOWMANSHIP

****Coaching is PROHIBITED by anyone during judging. No parents, leaders, or advisors are to be around the youth or in the arena during the show without prior arrangement with the Poultry Chair or Co-Chair.**

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Showmanship is open to all 4-H and FFA members. First place in each division receives a special award, second and third place receives medallions. NO Premiums paid.

SECTION 3 | POULTRY COSTUME CONTEST

1. Costume Contest is open to all 4-H, FFA, FCCLA members.
2. Bird must be entered in the poultry show and CAN ONLY BE SHOWN BY THE REGISTERED EXHIBITOR.
3. Youth must register online. (If you choose to withdrawal from the contest please do so at fair check-in).
4. Exhibitors are to dress in accordance with the bird's costume. Entry may be a fashioned outfit, either created or bought. Dress the bird in the best costume you can think up!
5. All costumes must be attached to the animal in a safe, non-binding way, and is non-harmful to the animal.
6. A costume may be creatively designed to allow the animal to be perched or free standing as part of the design of the costume. If an exhibitor feels that it is necessary for an additional person to be present for the overall safety of the animal, this is permitted.
7. EXHIBITORS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO GIVE ANYTHING OR ACT AS THOUGH THEY MAY GIVE ANYTHING TO ANY JUDGE DURING ANY SHOW.
8. Entries will be judged on creativity and style.
9. A 50 word or less narrative is to be turned into the Committee Member prior to the start of the event.
10. Participation Ribbons only 1st-5th place in each class.
11. Awards will be of a non-premium donation.
12. Premiums will not be awarded or paid in costume categories.
13. Master Exhibitor points will not be awarded in costume categories.
14. Judges' decisions are final.

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SECTION 11 | EGG SHOW SECTION

ENTRIES:

All exhibitors must be entered in the Poultry Show.

1. There is no entry fee.
2. There shall be no identification marks on the eggs, but an Egg Information Card must be attached to each carton. **EGG INFORMATION CARD WILL BE AVAILABLE AT the January Workshop and at check in.**
 - a. Eggs must be turned in at time of check-in with a completed Egg Information Card attached.
3. Limit One Dozen eggs per exhibitor.

EGG SPECIFICATIONS

1. All eggs shown must be **CHICKEN EGGS** and selected by the exhibitor. Exhibitor's flocks need not produce them.
2. Eggs are **NOT** to be purchased from a grocery store.
3. All eggs must be entered as a single dozen. An Egg Information Card must be filled out and attached to the carton.
4. Classes are Pee Wee (X-Small), Small, Medium, Large Extra Large and Jumbo.
5. A dozen eggs of minimum average weight for the class shall receive as many points, other things being equal as a dozen eggs of maximum average weight for the class.
6. Eggs will be judged on interior as well as exterior quality.
7. Eggs should be CLEAN, STAIN FREE, NO CRACKS or BLEMISHES.
8. Eggs should be as close as possible the same size and color to each other as possible.
9. **Large end should be facing up.**
10. Please attend workshop to learn about choosing, cleaning, and displaying eggs.

DISPLAY AND JUDGING:

1. The Poultry Committee will display the eggs by a photograph and the results will be posted in the poultry tent.
2. The eggs become the property of the Show.
3. The top dozen eggs for each group – Pee wee, small, large, extra-large, jumbo and white, brown eggs and blue/green will receive rosettes.
4. One Best Overall Dozen Eggs will be chosen.

CLASS:

- The Poultry Judge will separate eggs into a class according to the size.
- Pee Wee (X-Small) eggs shall average not less than 15 ounces per dozen.
- Small eggs shall average not less than 18 ounces per dozen.
- Medium eggs shall average not less than 21 ounces per dozen. Large eggs shall average not less than 24 ounces per dozen.
- Extra Large eggs shall average not less than 27 ounces per dozen.
- Jumbo eggs shall average not less than 30 ounces per dozen.

Parent cannot sign for the youth. Ensure last name is included. PLEASE DO NOT list any child/children that is/are NOT present on the sign in sheets. NO credit will be given for that child.**
- Show times **DO NOT** count towards community service hours.
- Other activities during the fair outside of the tent **DO NOT** count towards community service hours. These activities include other shows, food booth duty or walking around the fair.
- Certificates will be emailed to exhibitors after the fair.
- All exhibitors showing poultry are automatically entered.
- Extra points earned for barn duty of minimum of 2 hours at a time. (No points given if work 1 hr. 59 minutes – sorry).
- Extra points can also be earned by doing a proper demonstration on poultry.
- All demonstrations must be a PROPER DEMONSTRATION and will be monitored by committee member or someone appointed by the Committee Chair. Each demonstration to be 5-10 minutes long each in front of the committee member monitoring the demonstration.
- Sign up available at check-in only. Available date(s)/time(s) will be listed. Once a time slot is filled it is closed. If you come at a time that is closed and time allows, you may do a demonstration.
- Maximum demonstrations allowed is two (2) – **must be different**. **5 points per demonstration.
- Points are earned and tabulated with highest two (2) scores will receive in each age division JR/INT/SR
Master Exhibitor-\$50 and a BELT BUCKLE Reserve Master Exhibitor-\$25 and Conchos.
- Each section gets points; a percentage of the points is used towards the total accumulated points:
