Rules

- 1. All entries are subject to General Fair, and General Sales Rules and Regulations.
- 2. A) The 20 Art Auction lots will consist of the Best of Class, Reserve Best of Class, and Outstanding from the Art I, Art II, Art III, Art IV, and Portfolio divisions, in addition, 5 Judges Choice pieces from the Art I, Art II, Art III, Art IV, and Portfolio divisions, will be selected.
 - B) Only current fiscal (since January 1) original undamaged artwork drawn by hand that can be framed will be eligible for auction. This includes, wet media, (oil, acrylics, watercolor, tempera, pen-ink) and dry media (pencil, pastels, charcoal.) Artwork cannot have been previously shown in any competition.
- 3. The designated piece of art from the winning portfolios will be sold.
- 4. All items in the Student Art Auction will be sold by the lot. Each exhibitor will be eligible to sell only one (1) lot.
- 5. A Student Art Auction Release Agreement must be signed and notarized by all 9-12 graders and parents or guardian eligible to compete in the Student Art program.
- 6. The piece of art chosen by the judges for the auction must be the item that sells in the auction. No substitutions of art will be allowed under any circumstances.
- 7. The art chosen for auction will be framed and sold including the frame. The cost of framing will be deducted from the proceeds of the sale. The student can secure a sponsor to cover the cost.
- 8. The Student Art will be displayed throughout the fair. The Student Art that is sold at the auction will be displayed until Auction time and the buyer will take possession following the Auction.
- 9. Exhibitors must be present and checked in for Art Auction half an hour before the reception. Failure to comply may result in forfeiture of sale participation.

10. All exhibitors selling in the Student Art Auction will remain after the auction's conclusion to receive disposition paperwork. A "Thank You" letter to each buyer and add on contributors MUST be received in the Fair office on or before 4pm November 8, 2024. Thank You letters MUST be properly addressed to the buyer/add on contributor, have the exhibitor's return address and a stamp, and be left UNSEALED. The Fair Office will forward thank you letters to the buyer(s) and add on contributors. Failure to comply with this rule will result in a 3% loss of all net sale proceeds and exhibitor will be disqualified from any BCFA activities where the result pertains to an auction for the following year.
