- **All entries are received upon the express condition that the society shall not be responsible for the loss or damage to any such property.**
- Please “READ & FOLLOW THE RULES” exactly as given in the Exhibitor’s Guide.
- No article previously exhibited in this building may be exhibited. All articles must be made by the exhibitor personally during this past 12 months.
- **An exhibitor shall make only one entry in each class unless otherwise stated.**
- Placing will be awarded based on quality of exhibit and the decision of the Judges will be final.
- If a class is available for an item, the “Any Other” class CANNOT be used.
- No names should be visible on any items.
- In event of fewer than 3 entries in any given class, the Management reserves the right to combine comparable classes. If there are sufficient entries, classes may be divided at the discretion of the Judge.
- The Management reserves the right to reclassify an exhibit if they think it is in the wrong class.
- A “DISQUALIFIED” means that the rules were not followed.
- All premium money will be paid from awards as marked in the Judge’s book and NOT from the ribbons that may be attached to exhibits, as ribbons are sometimes misplaced.
- YOUTH EXHIBITS are open to any person 9 to 18 years of age as of January 1 of current year. Exhibitors less than 9 years will have their own classes, CHILD EXHIBITS. ADULT EXHIBITS are open to anyone who have reached the age of 20 as of the Fair date. Please include the ages of the exhibitor on all entries.
 - No person may exhibit in both Adult, Youth, and Child Classes.
 - If you have any questions, please email, or call the Superintendent.
 - Any person who sells and/or teaches the craft or products that they are exhibiting, must enter T/P (Teacher/Professional) before the Class number.

2021 MAFA State Photography Competition – Adult



Contest Rules & Regulations:

- The photo must be exhibited in a MAFA member's 2021 Fair by a non-professional adult.
- By exhibiting at the Three County Fair you are automatically qualified for the competition, as long as the subject of your photo is agricultural in nature or depicting the agricultural aspects of a Massachusetts Fair.
- The photo must be exhibited & judged to be best overall agricultural photo at the originating member Fair.
- An 8x10 un-matted and unframed photo will be judged at the convention.
- Winner must supply either an 8x10 photo or a jpeg file so an 8" x 10" photo can be reprinted.
- The winning photograph will reproduce with the best quality if it is taken with a minimum of 300 dpi, but this is not a requirement for submission.
- MAFA and MDAR have the right to use the winning photograph in publications promoting agriculture in the state of Massachusetts.

Canned and Preserved Goods - Division 129



Rules and Regulations:

- The products shown must be canned in the past 12 months and have been made by the exhibitor.
- Labeling and Jars shall all be uniform. Each entry shall be of the Standard Commercial Jar size and type.
- All products, including jam and jelly, shall be sealed by processing—*hot water bath for fruits, pressure for tomatoes, vegetables, and vegetable combinations.*
- Foods to be canned must be fresh produce, not previously canned or frozen.
- The owner's name and address must be clearly written on the underside of each jar for identification.
- Preference shall be given to practical packs, rather than to fancy packs.
- Rings should be removed and jars should be clean & clear of sticky residue.

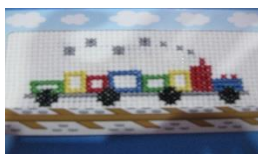
