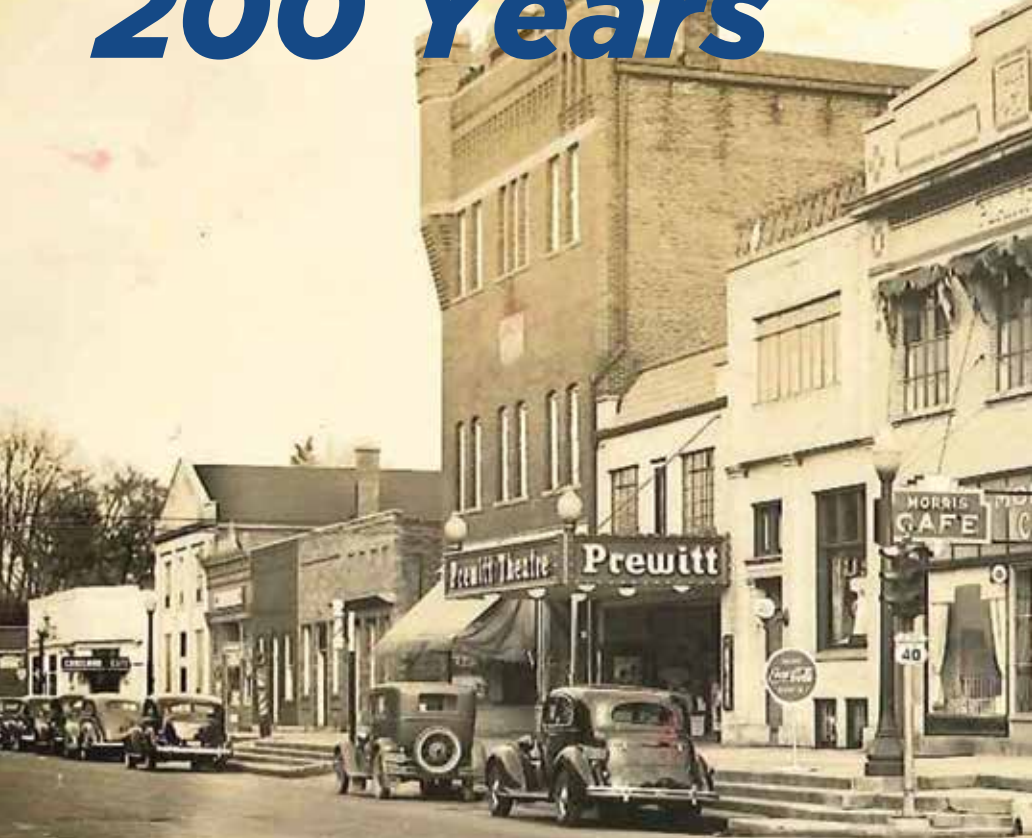

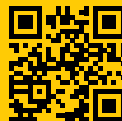

Hendricks County 4-H Fair History

Making the Best Better

The first county fair in 1852 was hosted by the newly formed Hendricks County Agricultural Society, on property purchased west of the boundaries of Danville, on the south side of what was known as the Rockville Road. For the admission price of 20 cents, the visitor could see “animals and articles of manufacture” that represented the best the county had to offer. The one-day event proved successful, and the following year improvements were made to the grounds and the fair was expanded to a three-day program adding crowd-pleasing events like harness racing and a ladies’ riding match.

These fairs took place at the western fairgrounds until 1881, when the land was sold to settle the debts of the Agricultural Society. For the next several years, there was no county fair, but smaller agricultural fairs took place at different locations around the county.

In the early 1900’s, President Theodore Roosevelt established the Country Life Commission to study the best ways to improve rural life and create a more efficient food production system. The Commission recommended the teaching of agriculture in schools and the establishment of an agricultural college extension service in 1914.

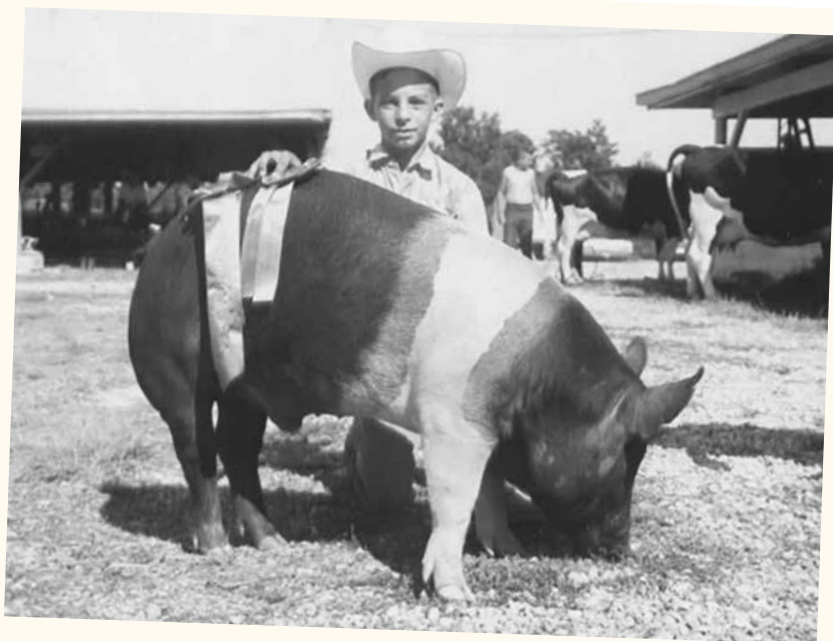
One of the results was Corn Contests for school children, with prizes for yield and quality. These clubs were the beginning of 4-H.

In 1927, the Danville Commercial Club organized a Town and Country Festival that combined with the 4-H Club exhibitions. Within a few years, the 4-H portion of the fair was moved to the Center Township School grounds (now the Hendricks County Government Center). The 4-H Club members used the gymnasium for exhibits. A large tent was put up in the schoolyard for the livestock exhibition.

In 1938, a group of farmers interested in promoting 4-H Club work formed the Hendricks County 4-H and Agricultural Association, Inc. That year there were 800 boys and girls taking part in the various 4-H Clubs.

By 1950 the 4-H Fair had 1,243 exhibits. It was time to look for a bigger location. In April of that year, the County Commissioners had plans drawn up for a new “4-H and storage building” on the site of the old County Highway Garage that had recently been destroyed by fire. The 120’ x 50’ concrete block building hosted its first 4-H Fair in 1951. (The building is still in use today by the Highway Department.)

In 1955, the Commissioners approved a one-

time tax of 5-cents per \$100 assessed valuation for the purpose of constructing, operating and maintaining 4-H buildings to be owned by the Hendricks County 4-H Fair & Agricultural Association. In May of 1956, the Commissioners signed a lease with the Fairboard for 20 acres of land on the south side of U.S. 36, just east of the County Home. It was there that the new fairgrounds would be established. The first 4-H Fair took place on the new grounds in August 1956.

Improvements were made to the fairgrounds, new buildings added, roads extended, but the amount of room for expansion grew smaller.

Land to the south was taken when a four-lane section of U.S. 36 was built. A new county jail, built in 1974 and expanded in the 1980's, encroached on the west side. As the county entered a new century, it became clear that the fairgrounds could not keep up with the growth in population.

When property at the intersection of Old U.S. 36 and CR 200 E was acquired by the County in 2003, it seemed the ideal location for a new, expanded fairgrounds. Work on the project began in 2004.

The new fairgrounds, close to three times the size of the old fairgrounds, was designed

to serve not only the citizens of Hendricks County, but all of Central Indiana. "This will be an exciting place to be," said past Hendricks County 4-H Fair and Conference Complex Director Gary Emsweller. "It will be the hottest place in Hendricks County and in Indiana. We plan for it to be in use 52 weeks a year."

The Hendricks County 4-H Fairgrounds and Conference Complex hosted its first 4-H Fair in 2006. With its large buildings, sidewalks and promenade, many compared it to the Indiana State Fairgrounds in Indianapolis.

Today's 4-H Fairgrounds and Conference Complex is not only a continuation of those early county fairs, but a tribute to the growth of 4-H in Hendricks County. With a full schedule of year-round events, it's become what Gary Emsweller envisioned, a gathering place where citizens and visitors of all ages can find entertainment and education.



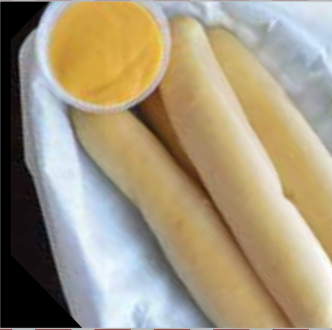

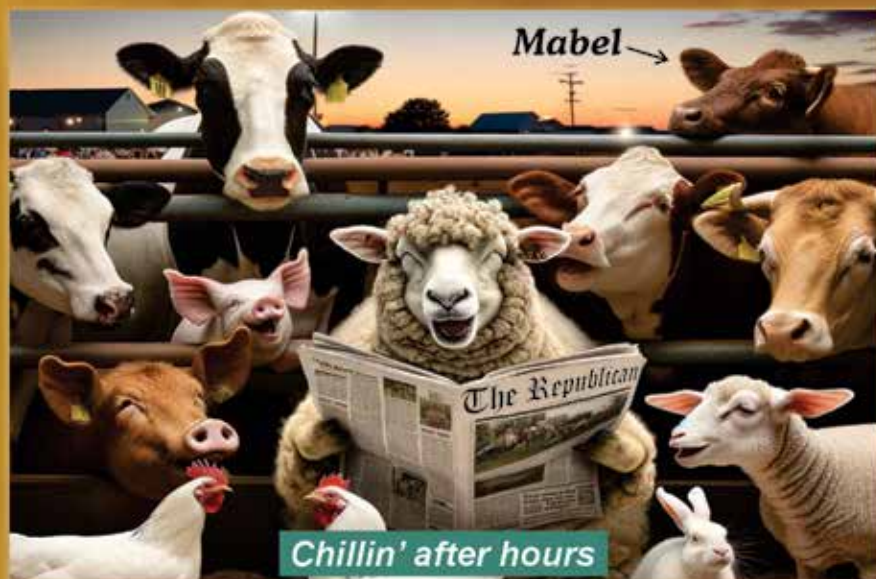

Master Gardener

The **Master Gardener** association and program is provided in Hendricks County to allow like minded individuals the opportunity to learn and educate their community about home-based horticulture. The Master Gardener Basic Training Class is typically held each year. The class is a 15-week course that covers topics such as soil science, vegetable/fruit gardening, plant science, insect identification and benefits, lawn care, plant disease diagnostics, ornamental care, and many more.

Class graduates are eligible to become members of the Purdue Extension Hendricks County Master Gardener Association. The main goal of this club is to network, learn, and help educate the community. The club has approximately 150 active members each year. The members conduct their monthly

association meetings and provide additional educational opportunities for club members. Each October, the club hosts the “Adventures in Gardening Program” that has multiple speakers throughout the day on a variety of horticultural topics. In addition, over 2,600 individuals will participate in the “Gardening for All Ages” event. This event supplies event goers with multiple speakers, gardening booths, a children’s interactive booth and a seed and tree giveaway. The club also partners with multiple agencies in the county to help educate others as well as sharing their knowledge of gardening at community events.

Statewide, Master Gardeners in 2023 provided their communities with 162,734 volunteer hours, valued at \$4,693,256.92. The program has been an integral part of the success of Purdue Extension.

4-H FAQs

What do I need to be a member?

To be an active 4-H member simply complete your online registration after October 1 at www.v2.4honline.com, pay the associated fees, and complete your online profile! You do not have to exhibit at the 4-H Fair to be considered an active 4-H member. Attendance at club meetings, while recommended, is not required. 4-H members can attend a one-time workshop, participate in trips, or simply join to make new friends!

How do I know what projects to choose?

There are over 70 projects you can complete! There is even a self determined category for any projects that may not fit into a predetermined category.

What do I need to exhibit at the 4-H Fair?

To exhibit at the fair, 4-H members need to have completed their 4-H online profile after registration opens October 1. 4-H members will select the projects they are interested in 4-H online. In June, the 4-H Fair Entry program will open. Members will log into 4-H Fair Entry through their 4Honline account and register for the projects they are bringing to the 4-H Fair.

If you have any questions you can call the Extension Office at 317-745-9260 or email hendrces@purdue.edu. Every year the handbook is published online and contains all the project requirements as well as contact information for all project superintendents and club leaders. We are all here to help!
