NOMINATION INFORMATION

- Every exhibitor must submit nomination information online by 5 pm (central time) on July 1st and mail DNA envelopes postmarked by July 1st for all beef to be eligible to exhibit.
 - a. DNA envelope orders and online nominations will be done on aksarbenstockshow.com.
 - b. Official Nomination and DNA submission is required for all market beef, breeding beef, and feeder calves.
 - c. Nomination does not constitute show entry. They are separate and independent steps to participating in the Aksarben Stock Show.

ENTRY INFORMATION


- 1. Official online entries begin August 1st, 2024. Entries are due September 6th, 2024, at 11:59 pm (central time). Entry will be done on <u>aksarbenstockshow.com</u>. See Livestock Rules & Regulations for more nomination and entry information.
 - a. Late entries will NOT be accepted.
- 2. Showmanship entry must be completed on the online entry process. Entry at show will not be permitted.
- NEW 3
- 3. Entry Limitation: Participants are permitted to submit up to 8 beef entries but allowed to bring and show no more than 5. You must pay for all 8 entries and there will be no refunds.
- NEW 4.
 - 4. Animal and exhibitor substitution will NOT be permitted after entry submission.
 - a. Siblings may nominate the same animal but may NOT enter the same animal.
 - 5. At the official species check-in, an animal may be moved between breeds and divisions at the discretion of the superintendent.
 - a. In order to be eligible to move a female from breeding to market or vice versa, they must have been dual nominated for both breeding and market divisions.
 - 6. Entry fees:
 - a. \$50 per head (includes tie out space and bedding)
 - b. Showmanship: \$10 per exhibitor per species *MUST PRE-ENTER

GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1. Youth ages 9-19 as of January 1st are eligible to exhibit. Youth must reside at a permanent residence address in one of the following states: Arkansas, Colorado, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota, Wisconsin, and Wyoming.
- 2. Official identification is a visual tag, EID tag, or ear tattoo.
 - a. All registered beef animals MUST have a legible ear tattoo that matches its registration papers exactly. Show management reserves the right to check all tattoos.
- 3. Animals may only be exhibited in one show.
 - a. You may not exhibit the same calf in the market, breeding, and feeder calf shows.
- 4. The beef show is full fit. Breed characteristics must not be changed.
- 5. In the event that an exhibitor is exhibiting in another ring, classes will be held up for no more than 5 minutes from the conclusion of the previous class exiting the ring to allow for the exhibitor to show their own animal. Exhibitors are required to notify the superintendent for that species about the overlap.
- 6. Stalling
 - a. Stalling assignments will be made by the superintendent. In the event of a shortage the superintendent will have the right to reassign stalls. Requests for individuals to be stalled together will be considered but NOT guaranteed. Stall requests can only be made at time of entry.

- b. Stalling will be based on either how many head an exhibitor entered or the maximum number they are allowed to show (whichever is least). For example, you may enter up to 8 calves, but will only be assigned stalls for a maximum of 5 head. If you enter 2 calves, you will receive stalling assignment for 2 head.
- c. Extra stalls will be available for purchase on a first come first serve basis.
- d. Tack space is not guaranteed.
- 7. If a beef animal gets away from an exhibitor more than two times in the show ring, they will be dismissed from the class.
- 8. A 30-minute load in and out policy will be enforced. Violators will be subject to towing.
- 9. Beef exhibitors are subject to allowing their projects to be used for the Livestock Judging Contest.
- 10. Release Time
 - a. There is no specified release time. You may leave when done showing.

- 1. Showmanship entry will take place online at time of entry. Entry at show will NOT be permitted.
- 2. Any exhibitor entered in the Market Beef, Breeding Heifer, or Feeder Calf Shows is eligible for Beef Showmanship.
- 3. Showmanship will take place separate from the breeding beef, market beef, and feeder calf shows.
- 4. There will be two age divisions:
 - a. Junior: beef exhibitors ages 9-13 as of January 1st
 - b. Senior: beef exhibitors ages 14-19 as of January 1st
- 5. Exhibitors must use their own animal that is properly entered in the 2024 show.
 - a. Calf Challenge animals are NOT eligible to be exhibited in Elite Showmanship.



MARKET BEEF SHOW

- 1. Steers and heifers are eligible to exhibit.
- 2. Decisions to send market beef to harvest must be made at check-in. A sale affidavit (found in the exhibitor packet) must be provided at check-in if the beef will be sold. The official sale weight will be the declared weight at the show.
- 3. Weight Declaration
 - a. Exhibitors will self-declare the market beef's weight utilizing a weigh-card system. All weigh-cards will be due at check-in. All cards submitted to beef show staff are final.
 - b. Show management will weigh, at least, the first and second place animals in each class. Additional calves may be weighed at the judge's discretion.
 - i. A 5% variance from the declared weight will be allowed. Animals that do not meet the 5% variance, above or below the declared weight will forfeit premiums and will not be eligible for any further exhibition.
 - c. The minimum weight for market beef will be 1,000 lbs. with no maximum weight. Calves weighing less than 1,000 lbs. will compete in a weigh-out class and be ineligible for premiums and harvest.

5. Additional Market Beef Information

- a. Market beef will show lightest to heaviest within their respective class.
- b. Classes will be broken at the discretion of show management. Breeds with fewer than 5 head entered will be placed on probation and may be eliminated in the future.
 - i. Show management may combine classes until they reach a minimum class size deemed appropriate.
- c. Registered market steers will need to show registration papers at check-in. If registration and animal do not match, they will be moved to the crossbred market steer division.
 - i. To be eligible for exhibition, registered steers must be registered by the official breed association in the name of the youth and/or immediate family member or in partnership with a parent or guardian, family or farm name, and must be owned by the time of nomination.
 - ii. Registered steers must also have a legible ear tattoo that matches the registration papers. Show management reserves the right to check tattoos.
- 6. Purple Banner Knight September 28th @ 7:30 pm (formerly the Grand Drive)
 - a. 1st and 2nd place animals from each class will compete in the Division drives, where Champion and Reserve Champion are awarded. Champions and Reserve Champions from the six divisions will compete in the Purple Banner Knight, where the top 5 market beef will be selected.
 - i. Additional animals may be exhibited in division and Purple Banner Knight, at the discretion of the judge.
 - b. The Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Market Beef will become the possession of the Aksarben Stock Show at the completion of the Purple Banner Knight.
 - i. Failure to comply will result in the withholding of premium monies and the exhibitor may be disqualified.

7. Harvest Animals

a. It is the responsibility of all exhibitors to ensure that beef designated for harvest at check-in are put in the designated holding area to be loaded onto the trucks.

BREEDING HEIFER SHOW

- 1. To be eligible for exhibition, registered breeding heifers must be registered by the official breed association in the name of the youth and/or immediate family member or in partnership with a parent or guardian, family, or farm name, and must be owned by the time of nomination.
- 2. Registration papers should be presented at check-in. Animals whose registration papers are not approved or are still pending will show in the commercial class.

- NEW :
- Commercial breeding heifers will declare their weight using the weigh card system.
 - a. Show management will weigh, at least, the first and second place heifers in each commercial heifer class. Additional heifers may be weighed at the judge's discretion.
 - i. A 5% variance from the declared weight will be allowed. Animals that do not meet the 5% variance, above or below the declared weight will forfeit premiums and will not be eligible for any further exhibition.

5. Additional Breeding Heifer Information

- a. Registered heifers will be divided into classes by breed and then by age. Commercial heifers will be split by weight.
- b. Classes will be broken at the discretion of show management. Breeds with fewer than 5 head entered will be placed on probation and may be eliminated in the future.
 - i. Show management may combine classes until they reach a minimum class size deemed appropriate.

6. Supreme Breeding Heifer Drive


- a. 1st and 2nd place animals from each class will compete in the Division drives, where Champion and Reserve Champion are awarded. Champions and Reserve Champions from the twenty divisions will compete in the Supreme Breeding Heifer Drive, where the top 5 breeding heifers will be selected.
 - i. Additional animals may be exhibited in division and Supreme, at the discretion of the judge.

FEEDER CALF SHOW

- 1. Heifer calves and steer calves born January 1st, 2024 June 1st, 2024, are eligible to exhibit.
 - a. Heifers and steers will be shown SEPARATELY.
 - b. No bulls will be allowed to show. If there is any evidence of testicular development by manual palpation of the scrotum, the animal will be disqualified.
- 2. No nurse cows or dams of feeder calves will be allowed on the stock show grounds.
- 3. Weight Declaration
 - a. Exhibitors will self-declare the feeder calf's weight utilizing a weigh-card system. All weigh-cards will be due at check-in. All cards submitted to beef show staff are final.
 - b. Show management will weigh, at least, the first and second place animals in each class. Additional calves may be weighed at the judge's discretion.
 - i. A 5% variance from the declared weight will be allowed. Animals that do not meet the 5% variance, above or below the declared weight will forfeit premiums and will not be eligible for any further exhibition.
 - c. There will be no minimum or maximum weight limit.

 - b. 1st and 2nd place animals from each class will compete in the Division drives, where Champion and Reserve Champion are awarded. Champions and Reserve Champions from the two divisions will compete for Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Feeder Calf.
 - i. Additional animals may be exhibited in division and Supreme, at the discretion of the judge.

- 1. Entries are due September 6th, 2024, at 11:59 pm (central time). Entry will be done on the <u>aksarbenstockshow.com</u>. See Livestock Rules & Regulations for more entry information.
 - a. Late entries will NOT be accepted.
- 2. Showmanship entry must be completed on the online entry process. Entry at show will not be permitted.
- 3. Entry Limitation: Participants are permitted to enter a maximum of 2 broiler pens (3 birds per pen). You must pay for both pens and there will be no refunds.

 - a. \$20 per pen
 - i. If exhibiting two pens, both pens must be entered and the total entry fee of \$40 must be paid.
 - b. Showmanship: \$10 per exhibitor per species *MUST PRE-ENTER

 - a:—Each exhibited bird must have the original wing band in place. Birds who have lost their wing band for any reason will not be eligible for exhibition. Birds WILL be allowed to show without a wing band in the case that the wing band was faulty and didn't stay on.

BROILER ORDERS

- 1. Broilers must be ordered from the Show source and can be ordered on aksarbenstockshow.com.
- 2. Chicks can be ordered in quantities of 25 (25, 50, 75, 100)
 - a. Minimum order per exhibitor: 25 chicks
 - b. Maximum order per exhibitor: 100 chicks
- 3. Cost: \$1.87 per chick (wing banded male)
- 4. Order Deadline: Monday, July 15th, 2024, at 11:59 pm (central time)
- 5. Hatch Date: August 12th, 2024
- 6. Estimated Delivery Date: August 13th 16th, 2024



- 1. Showmanship entry will take place online at time of entry. Entry at show will NOT be permitted.
- 2. Any exhibitor entered in the Broiler Show is eligible for Broiler Showmanship.

- 2. Exhibitors will have to declare their 'final weight' until they declare their 'final weight' they can weigh and swap chickens within pens.
- 3. Wing bands will be recorded once final weight are established.
- 4. All broilers entered will be sent to harvest.
- 5. Exhibitors are responsible for their own herdsmanship at the show.
- 6. Show Structure: (if number of entries permits)



In the event that an exhibitor is exhibiting in another ring, classes will be held up for no more than 5 minutes from the conclusion of the previous class exiting the ring to allow for the exhibitor to show their own animal. Exhibitors are required to notify the superintendent for that species about the overlap.
- 6. Stalling
 - a. Stalling assignments will be made by the superintendent. In the event of a shortage the superintendent will have the right to reassign stalls. Requests for individuals to be stalled together will be considered but NOT guaranteed. Stall requests can only be made at time of entry.
 - b. Stalling will be based on either how many head an exhibitor entered or the maximum number they are allowed to show (whichever is least). For example, you may enter up to 8 goats, but will only be assigned stalls for a maximum of 4 head. If you enter 2 goats, you will receive stalling assignment for 2 head.

- c. Pen size will be 5ft 8in x 5ft 8 in.
 - i. Due to limited space available, you will likely have to stall multiple animals per pen. There will be no tack stalls.
- 7. Goats must have all blankets pulled at initial gate check-in for a vet to inspect the animal for fungus.
- 8. A 30-minute load in and out policy will be enforced. Violators will be subject to towing.
- 9. Goat exhibitors are subject to allowing their projects to be used for the Livestock Judging Contest.
- 10. Release Time
 - a. There is no specified release time. You may leave when done showing.

- 1. Showmanship entry will take place online at time of entry. Entry at show will NOT be permitted.
- 2. Any exhibitor entered in the Market Goat or Breeding Goat Show is eligible for Goat Showmanship.
- 3. Showmanship will take place separate from the market goat and breeding goat shows.

- 2. Decisions to send market goats to harvest must be made at check-in. A sale affidavit (found in the exhibitor packet) must be provided at check-in if the goats will be sold. The official sale weight will be the declared weight at the show.
- 3. Weight Declaration
 - a. Exhibitors will self-declare the market goat's weight utilizing a weigh-card system. All weigh-cards will be due at check-in. All cards submitted to goat show staff are final.
 - b. Show management will weigh, at least, the first and second place animals in each class. Additional goats may be weighed at the judge's discretion.
 - i. A 5 lb. variance from the declared weight will be allowed. Animals that do not meet the 5 lb. variance, above or below the declared weight will forfeit premiums and will not be eligible for any further exhibition.
