GENERAL INFORMATION

NOMINATION INFORMATION

1. **Every exhibitor must submit nomination information online by 5 pm (central time) on July 1st and mail DNA envelopes postmarked by July 1st for all beef to be eligible to exhibit.**
 - a. DNA envelope orders and online nominations will be done on aksarbenstockshow.com.
 - b. Official Nomination and DNA submission is required for all market animals, breeding animals, and feeder calves.
 - c. Nomination does not constitute show entry. They are separate and independent steps to participating in the Aksarben Stock Show.
 - d. Late nominations will NOT be accepted.

ENTRY INFORMATION

1. Official online entries begin August 1st, 2026. Entries are due September 4th, 2026, at 11:59 pm (central time). Entry will be done on aksarbenstockshow.com. See Livestock Rules & Regulations for more nomination and entry information.
 - a. **Late entries will NOT be accepted. NO EXCEPTIONS!**
2. **Showmanship entry must be completed on the online entry process. Entry at show will NOT be permitted.**
3. Animal substitution will NOT be permitted after entry submission.
 - a. Siblings may nominate the same animal but may NOT enter the same animal.
4. At the official species check-in, an animal may be moved between breeds and divisions at the discretion of the superintendent.
 - a. In order to be eligible to move a female from breeding to market or vice versa, they must have been dual nominated for both breeding and market divisions.

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Youth ages 9-19 as of January 1st, 2026 are eligible to exhibit. Youth must reside at a permanent residence address in one of the following states: Arkansas, Colorado, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota, Wisconsin, and Wyoming.
2. Animals may only be exhibited in one show, by one exhibitor.
 - a. One animal cannot be entered in by two (2) exhibitors. You may not exhibit the same animal in the market, breeding, and feeder calf shows.
3. In the event that an exhibitor is exhibiting in another ring, classes will be held up for no more than 5 minutes from the conclusion of the previous class exiting the ring to allow for the exhibitor to show their own animal. Exhibitors are required to notify the superintendent for that species about the overlap.
4. A 30-minute load in and out policy will be strictly enforced. Violators will be subject to towing.
5. All exhibitors are subject to allowing their projects to be used for the Livestock Judging Contest.
6. All registered animals must upload a copy of their registration paper online through the Entry Portal.
7. A CVI must be issued within 7 days for all out-of-state rabbits.
8. Release Time
 - a. There is no specified release time. You may leave when done showing.

BEEF INFORMATION

9. Entry Limitation: Participants are permitted to submit up to 8 beef entries but allowed to bring and exhibit no more than 5. You must pay for all 8 entries and there will be **no refunds**.
10. Entry fees:
 - a. \$125 per head (includes tie out space and bedding)
 - b. Showmanship: \$15 per exhibitor per species ***MUST PRE-ENTER***
11. Official identification is a visual tag, EID tag, or ear tattoo.
 - a. All registered beef animals MUST have a legible ear tattoo that matches its registration papers exactly. Show management reserves the right to check all tattoos.
12. The beef show is full fit, however, breed characteristics must not be changed.
13. Stalling
 - a. Stalling assignments will be made by the superintendent. In the event of a shortage the superintendent will have the right to reassign stalls. Requests for individuals to be stalled together will be considered but NOT guaranteed. Stall requests can only be made at time of entry.
 - b. Stalling will be based on either how many head an exhibitor entered or the maximum number they are allowed to show (whichever is least). For example, you may enter up to 8 animals, but will only be assigned stalls for a maximum of 5 head. If you enter 2 animals, you will receive stalling assignment for 2 head.
 - c. Extra stalls will be available for purchase on a first come first serve basis.
 - d. **Tack space and tie-outs are not guaranteed, they are on a first come, first serve basis.**

ELITE SHOWMANSHIP – Sponsored by Grand Island Casino Resort

1. Showmanship entry will take place online at time of entry. Entry at show will NOT be permitted.
2. Any exhibitor entered in the Market Beef, Breeding Heifer, or Feeder Calf Shows is eligible for Beef Showmanship.
3. Showmanship will take place separate from the breeding beef, market beef, and feeder calf shows.
4. There will be two age divisions:
 - a. Junior: beef exhibitors ages 9-13 as of January 1st
 - b. Senior: beef exhibitors ages 14-19 as of January 1st
5. Exhibitors must use their own animal that is properly entered in the 2026 show.
 - a. Calf Challenge animals are NOT eligible to be exhibited in Elite Showmanship.

MARKET BEEF SHOW

1. Steers and heifers are eligible to exhibit.
2. Decisions to send market beef to harvest must be made at check-in. A sale affidavit (found at the sale drop-off) must be provided at check-in if the beef will be sold. The official sale weight will be the declared weight at the show.
3. Weight Declaration
 - a. Exhibitors will self-declare the market beef's weight utilizing a weight-card system. All weight-cards will be due at check-in. All cards submitted to beef show staff are final.
 - b. Show management will weigh, at least, the first and second place animals in each class. Additional calves may be weighed at the judge's discretion.
 - i. A 5% variance from the declared weight will be allowed. Animals that do not meet the 5% variance, above or below the declared weight, will forfeit premiums and will not be eligible for any further exhibition.

- c. The minimum weight for market beef will be 1,000 lbs. with no maximum weight. Calves weighing less than 1,000 lbs. will compete in a weigh-out class and be ineligible for premiums and harvest.

5. Additional Market Beef Information

- a. Market beef will show lightest to heaviest within their respective class.
- b. Classes will be broken at the discretion of show management. Breeds with fewer than 5 head entered will be placed on probation and may be eliminated in the future.
 - i. Show management may combine classes until they reach a minimum class size deemed appropriate.
- c. Registered market steers will need to show registration papers at check-in. If registration and animal do not match, they will be moved to the crossbred market steer division.
 - i. To be eligible for exhibition, registered steers must be registered by the official breed association in the name of the youth and/or immediate family member or in partnership with a parent or guardian, family or farm name, and must be owned by the time of nomination.
 - ii. **Registered steers must also have a legible ear tattoo that matches the registration papers. Show management reserves the right to check tattoos.**

6. Purple Banner Knight –September 26th @ 7:30 pm (formerly the Grand Drive)

- a. 1st and 2nd place animals from each class will compete in the Division drives, where Champion and Reserve Champion are awarded. Champions and Reserve Champions from the six divisions will compete in the Purple Banner Knight, where the top 5 market beef will be selected.
 - i. Additional animals may be exhibited in division and Purple Banner Knight, at the discretion of the judge.
- b. The Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Market Beef will become the possession of the Aksarben Stock Show at the completion of the Purple Banner Knight.
 - i. Failure to comply will result in the withholding of premium monies and the exhibitor may be disqualified.

7. Harvest Animals

- a. It is the responsibility of all exhibitors to ensure that beef designated for harvest at check-in are put in the designated holding area to be loaded onto the trucks. Failure to have your animal there will result in forfeiture of sale slot and premium.

BREEDING HEIFER SHOW

- 1. To be eligible for exhibition, registered breeding heifers must be registered by the official breed association in the name of the youth and/or immediate family member or in partnership with a parent or guardian, family, or farm name, and must be owned by the time of nomination.

2. Registration papers should be presented at check-in. Animals whose registration papers are not approved or are still pending will show in the commercial class.
3. Commercial breeding heifers will declare their weight using the weigh card system.
 - a. Show management will weigh, at least, the first and second place heifers in each commercial heifer class. Additional heifers may be weighed at the judge's discretion.
 - i. A 5% variance from the declared weight will be allowed. Animals that do not meet the 5% variance, above or below the declared weight will forfeit premiums and will not be eligible for any further exhibition.

5. Additional Breeding Heifer Information
 - a. Registered heifers will be divided into classes by breed and then by age. Commercial heifers will be split by weight.
 - b. Heifers can not be born any earlier than October 1st, 2024 and any later than April 30, 2026.
 - c. Classes will be broken at the discretion of show management. Breeds with fewer than 5 head entered will be placed on probation and may be eliminated in the future.
 - i. Show management may combine classes until they reach a minimum class size deemed appropriate.
6. Supreme Breeding Heifer Drive

- a. 1st and 2nd place animals from each class will compete in the Division drives, where Champion and Reserve Champion are awarded. Champions and Reserve Champions from the twenty divisions will compete in the Supreme Breeding Heifer Drive, where the top 5 breeding heifers will be selected.
 - i. Additional animals may be exhibited in division and Supreme, at the discretion of the judge.

FEEDER CALF SHOW

1. Heifer calves and steer calves born January 1st, 2026 – June 1st, 2026, are eligible to exhibit.
 - a. Heifers and steers will be shown SEPARATELY.
 - b. No bulls will be allowed to show. If there is any evidence of testicular development by manual palpation of the scrotum, the animal will be disqualified.
2. No nurse cows or dams of feeder calves will be allowed on the stock show grounds.
3. Weight Declaration
 - a. Exhibitors will self-declare the feeder calf’s weight utilizing a weigh-card system. All weigh-cards will be due at check-in. All cards submitted to beef show staff are final.
 - b. Show management will weigh, at least, the first and second place animals in each class. Additional calves may be weighed at the judge’s discretion.
 - i. A 5% variance from the declared weight will be allowed. Animals that do not meet the 5% variance, above or below the declared weight will forfeit premiums and will not be eligible for any further exhibition.
 - c. There will be no minimum but a maximum of 1,000 lbs weight limit.

 - a. Feeder Calves will show by weight.
 - i. Calves will show lightest to heaviest within their respective heifer or steer classes.
 - b. 1st and 2nd place animals from each class will compete in the Division drives, where Champion and Reserve Champion are awarded. Champions and Reserve Champions from the two divisions will compete for Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Feeder Calf.
 - i. Additional animals may be exhibited in division and Supreme, at the discretion of the judge.

1. Entry Limitation: Participants are permitted to enter a maximum of 2 broiler pens (3 birds per pen). You must pay for both pens and there will be **no refunds**.
2. Entry fees:
 - a. \$50 per pen
 - i. If exhibiting two pens, both pens must be entered and the total entry fee of \$100 must be paid.
 - b. Showmanship: \$15 per exhibitor per species ***MUST PRE-ENTER**
3. All birds will be the same sex and arrive wing banded.
4. Check-in will be on a first come first serve basis.

BROILER ORDERS

1. Broilers must be ordered from the Show source and can be ordered on aksarbenstockshow.com.
2. Chicks can be ordered in quantities of 25 (25, 50, 75, 100)
 - a. Minimum order per exhibitor: 25 chicks
 - b. Maximum order per exhibitor: 100 chicks
3. Cost: \$3.00 per chick (wing banded males) *Subject to change*
4. Order Deadline: Tuesday, July 15th, 2026, at 11:59 pm (central time)
5. Hatch Date: August 11th, 2026
6. Estimated Delivery Date: August 12th - 15th, 2026

ELITE SHOWMANSHIP – Sponsored by Grand Island Casino Resort

1. **Showmanship entry will take place online at time of entry. Entry at show will NOT be permitted.**
2. Any exhibitor entered in the Broiler Show is eligible for Broiler Showmanship.
3. Showmanship will take place separate from the broiler show.
4. There will be two age divisions:
 - a. Junior: broiler exhibitors ages 9-13 as of January 1st
 - b. Senior: broiler exhibitors ages 14-19 as of January 1st
5. Exhibitors must use their own animal that is properly entered in the 2026 show.

BROILER SHOW

1. There will be 3 chickens per pen.
 - a. The minimum weight per pen is 14 lbs. with no maximum weight.
 - b. Pens weighing less than 14 lbs. are still eligible to show but cannot place higher than 2nd in class and cannot qualify for the Purple Banner Knight (Grand Drive).
2. Exhibitors will have to declare their 'final weight' until they declare their 'final weight' they can weigh and swap chickens within pens.
3. Wing bands will be recorded once final weight are established.
4. All broilers entered will be sent to harvest. Exhibitors are responsible for feeding & watering animals through Saturday.
5. Exhibitors are responsible for their own herdsmanship at the show.
6. Show Structure: (if number of entries permits)
 - a. Lightweight Pen
 - b. Middleweight Pen
 - c. Heavyweight Pen
7. 1-10 will be placed in class.

8. **Purple Banner Knight** – September 26th @ 7 pm (formerly the Grand Drive)
- The Champion and Reserve Division Champion of the light, middle, and heavy weight broiler pen divisions will compete in the Purple Banner Knight, where the top 3 broiler pens will be selected.
 - Exhibitors are responsible for transporting their birds to and from PBK.

RABBIT INFORMATION

1. Entry Limitation: Participants are permitted to enter a maximum of 5 rabbit pens (3 rabbits per pen). You must pay for all pens and there will be **no refunds**.
2. Entry fees:
 - a. \$50 per pen
 - i. If exhibiting two (2) or more pens, both pens must be entered and the total entry fee must be paid.
 - b. Showmanship: \$15 per exhibitor per species ***MUST PRE-ENTER**
3. Show Sanctioning: This show is NOT sanctioned by American Rabbit Breeders Association (ARBA) and is running an adjusted weight of 4 lbs. to 6 lbs. (12 lbs. to 18 lbs. per pen).
4. There are certain breeds that are eligible to show in the Rabbit show. Breeds will not be split. Eligible Breeds are:
 - a. Californian
 - b. New Zealand
 - c. American
 - b. American Chin
 - c. Argente Bruns
 - e. Champagne D'Argent
 - f. Cinnamon
 - g. Creme D'Argent
 - i. Palomino
 - j. Satin
 - k. Rex

ELITE SHOWMANSHIP – Sponsored by Grand Island Casino Resort

1. **Showmanship entry will take place online at time of entry. Entry at show will NOT be permitted.**
2. Any exhibitor entered in the Rabbit Show is eligible for Rabbit Showmanship.
3. Showmanship will take place separate from the rabbit show.
4. There will be two age divisions:
 - a. Junior: rabbit exhibitors ages 9-13 as of January 1st
 - b. Senior: rabbit exhibitors ages 14-19 as of January 1st
5. Exhibitors must use their own animal that is properly entered in the 2026 show.

RABBIT SHOW

1. There will be 3 rabbits per pen.
 - a. Rabbits will all be of the same breed and variety, but do not have to come from the same litter.
 - b. The minimum weight per rabbit is 4 lbs. and the maximum weight is 6 lbs.
 - c. Pens weighing less than 4 lbs. or more than 6 lbs. are still eligible to show but cannot place higher than 2nd in class and cannot qualify for the Purple Banner Knight (Grand Drive).
 - d. Top 10 pens will be sold in the Purple Banner Rabbit Auction.
2. Exhibitors will have to declare their 'final weight' at check-in. The judge has the right to reweigh any rabbit at time of show to verify it meets the 4 to 6 lbs weight range. Any animal not weighing back correctly will result in disqualification. It will be the responsibility of the exhibitors to get their rabbits brought up for entry weight in and showing.
3. Exhibitors are responsible for their own herdsmanship at the show.
4. Show Structure: (All entries will be divided into 2 divisions. There is no set weight ranges for division breaks. Classes can be broken at the discretion of show management.)
 - a. Lightweight Pens
 - b. Heavyweight Pens
5. 1-10 will be placed in class.
6. Ownership Certification/Fitting: Exhibitors must own their animals throughout the feeding period. Rabbits must be owned by the time of entry. Rabbits must have a permanent tattoo in the left ear.

7. Care of Animals: Exhibitors must bring your own water and feed containers. Exhibitors are responsible for feeding and watering their own rabbits. Overnight rabbit coops will be provided for any youth exhibitor. 1 coop per pen will be provided. Each set of 3 will be placed in the same coop. Risers to keep the rabbits out of the coop bedding will NOT be provided but it is recommended to be used.
8. IMPORTANT: Rabbits are not required to be cooped if the exhibitor chooses to show out of their own carriers. Exhibitors are not allowed to sell animals. Any "For Sale" sign will result in forfeiture.
9. **Purple Banner Knight – September 26th @ 7 pm** (formerly the Grand Drive)
 - a. The Champion and Reserve Division Champion of the light and heavy weight rabbit pen divisions will compete in the Purple Banner Knight, where the top 3 rabbit pens will be selected.
 - b. Only one (1) meat pen per exhibitor will have the opportunity to advance to Purple Banner Knight. In the event that a judge selects two (2) meat pens from the same exhibitor to be placed in the top 3, only the higher placing pen from that exhibitor becomes eligible to be awarded any top 3 prizes.
10. **Purple Banner Rabbit Auction – September 26th** from 4 - 9 pm CST
 - a. Top 3 pens will be required to participate in the Purple Banner Rabbit Auction.
 - b. The judge will select the top 10 pens will be selected to participate in the auction. If selected, all rabbits must sell.
 - c. Ownership will not transfer until after the completion of the Purple Banner Knight.
 - d. All monies will be distributed from Aksarben Stock Show less commissions (10% Sale Fee 15% AKSS Rabbit Fund Commission).
