# AKSARBEN STOCK SHOW & RODEO REDEFINES TRADITIONS FOR 2016

*Omaha, Neb.* (August 15, 2016) – The 89<sup>th</sup> annual AKSARBEN Stock Show & Rodeo will include exciting updates in 2016. The nation's largest 4-H stock show will be complemented by educational and family events and the AKSARBEN tradition of Giving Back and Moving Forward.

Taking place September 22 to 25 at the CenturyLink Center in Omaha, events start Thursday with the opening of the 2016 AKSARBEN Stock Show in the convention center. The expanded AKSARBEN Ag Science Experience and Animal Zone features dozens of interactive educational exhibits for youth and families. New this year, replacing the parade, the AKSARBEN Heritage Festival will take place at CenturyLink north lawn Friday and Saturday, featuring music, BBQ and western-themed fun for all ages.

### AKSARBEN Stock Show (Sept. 22–25)

Kicking off events on Thursday, the AKSARBEN Stock Show is the nation's largest 4-H stock show, drawing 1,200 exhibitors and their animals from a 10-state region to Omaha. Another 700 youth attend annually to participate in National Livestock Judging and 4-H Quiz Bowl competitions. The AKSARBEN Stock Show culminates Sunday with the AKSARBEN Purple Ribbon Auction, which raises more than \$250,000 annually to fund AKSARBEN 4-H Scholarships, premiums and awards.

## Ag Education & Career Exploration (Sept. 23 – 24)

One in four jobs in Nebraska and western Iowa are directly tied to agriculture. The AKSARBEN Stock Show gives visitors numerous opportunities to learn more about the Heartland's agriculture landscape of food, fiber and fuel production.

Educational opportunities include the Animal Zone, Ag STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) exhibits, a mobile meat lab and the College Fair & Career Exploration area staffed by representatives from the Heartland's top agricultural colleges and employers.

The AKSARBEN Stock Show also partners with Douglas County Extension and the Nebraska Department of Agriculture's annual Nebraska Agricultural Youth Institute (NAYI) to create special exploration opportunities. For 2016 more than 2,000 third and fourth graders will participate in educational programs and school tours led by extension, and commodity group experts. Another 500 high school students will visit with representatives from agricultural universities and colleges as well as some of the major agricultural employers in the Heartland at the AKASARBEN Stock Show as part of their NAYI-Omaha experience.

Crowd favorite Mutton Bustin will also return for youngsters to live their cowboy dreams. Before the main event ticket holders can also take in the family friendly pre-show for a chance to meet cowboys and rodeo clowns, enjoy pony rides, sit on Midnight the live bull, and take a behind-the-chutes tour.

## AKSARBEN Heritage Festival (Sept. 23-24)

The tradition of community celebration in conjunction with the AKSARBEN Stock Show & Rodeo continues in 2016 with the AKSARBEN Heritage Festival. Located on the north lawn of the CenturyLink Center, the AKSARBEN Heritage Festival is free to the public and will run Friday and Saturday with attractions and activities for all ages.

The festival will feature Western merchandise vendors, youth attractions, BBQ and beer garden. Entertainment from the region's top bands kicks the celebration up a notch before each rodeo performance. Lincoln-based 80's rock cover band AM/FM takes the stage Friday, while Omaha-based band Breakaway keeps the action going Saturday, playing a range of top 40, classic rock, country and folk favorites.

Saturday's slate of family events kicks off with a 4-H flapjack breakfast, open to the public. Flapjack breakfast tickets can be purchased onsite. Agriculture-related attractions include an antique tractor display and a performance from Greg Peterson of the popular Peterson Farm Brothers Youtube channel. Saturday will also include a number of attractions for children, including face painting, inflatables and multicultural dance demonstrations.
