

Hello 4-H Member and Family,

Tagging Day Protocol

In an effort to provide a Covid safe meeting situation, members, family and volunteers are required to follow pre-screening health Guidelines. Self-screening of health status should include the following:

1. Self-screening of COVID-19 symptoms: fever of 100.4 F or greater, cough, shortness of breath, diarrhea, fatigue, headache, muscle aches, nausea, loss of taste or smell, sore throat, etc., within the 2 weeks prior to tagging.
2. Program participants who fall into a high-risk category may want to opt out of being present. Conditions include:
 - Chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma
 - Serious heart conditions
 - Immunocompromised
 - Diabetes
 - Chronic kidney disease
 - Liver disease
3. Determine if individuals have been in close contact with a person who has been diagnosed with, tested for, or quarantined because of COVID-19.
4. If it is determined that a risk of Covid 19 transmission is apparent, participant should not attend the tagging day. However, participant's animals are still required to be tagged that day. Please make arrangements with someone else to bring them to the fairgrounds on May 1.
5. Masks are required to be worn during tagging.
6. Social distancing is expected between members and families, so please stay with your truck and/or trailer throughout the tagging process.
7. As we normally would do, the 4-H member or a representative is responsible to present the animal on the trailer to the committee to tag. The animal will be tagged while remaining on the truck or trailer.
