Before entering, please refer to Entry instructions for Rules and Regulations.

- 1. Entries to be dropped off Sun., Aug. 18 and Mon., Aug. 21, between 10 a.m.–5 p.m. in Building 1.
- 2. All exhibits will be released Sun., Aug. 25, from 8 a.m.-10 a.m. Fair personnel and Superintendents are not responsible for items remaining after 10 a.m.
- 3. ENTERING: Pre-enter into <u>DEPARTMENT ONLY</u>. Itemized entry sheet PER DIVISION will be available on entry days in Building 1. Pick-up exhibitor number ONE WEEK BEFORE ENTRY DAY at the fair office. You will need your exhibitor number at the time of entering. Entries not picked up at set time will be discarded and names and ribbons will be left for you to pick up during regular office hours.
- 4. All exhibits must be labeled properly with the Exhibitor Claim Ticket. You may use address labels on ½ a recipe card size card stock, instead of the claim ticket leave room at the top for hole-punch. Please list name, youth or adult, exhibitor number, division letter, class number, and variety
- 5. Variety: Please label each with botanical or common name of plant.
- 6. **EACH ENTRY REQUIRES ITS OWN TICKET/CARD.** Entry table assistants will help you in filling out judging entry sheets on entry days.
- Example for entry ticket:
 - John Smith Adult
 - Exhibitor Number 01234
 - Division B
 - Class 01
 - Variety: Dahlia Ball (you can be more specific in listing color etc.)
- 7. Exhibits brought with insects, diseases or fungus will not be accepted or judged.
- 8. All specimen flowers must have been grown by the exhibitor. Flowers used in designs may be fresh or dried, depending on class, and need not be grown by the exhibitor.
- 9. Potted plants must have been in the exhibitor's possession for at least three months and must have a bottom that holds water.
- 10. Exhibitors must supply their own containers, vases, water bottles, etc. They must be the appropriate size for your entry. Example: if your cut flowers are top heavy & tip the vase over, you need a bigger vase. Be creative, use something unique.
- 11. Specimens must have foliage except where otherwise designated. Foliage below the water line on each specimen must be removed.

- 12. Judging will be done according to the Danish system, each judged on its own merit.
- 13. Exhibits are to remain in place until 8 a.m. Sun., Aug. 25. Exhibitors are responsible to pick up exhibits between 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. that day.
- 14. Exhibitors may replace wilted blooms during fair week, but it is not required. Building assistants will be watering plants and vases each day.

A. Rose with Foliage – Rose must be ¾ open at time of judging, Hybrid Teas must be disbudded. All rose varieties must be named properly on each entry ticket/card label: Climber-1 cluster, David Austin–single or cluster, Floribunda-single or cluster, Hybrid Tea-1 bloom, Miniature-1 stem, Old Garden-Single or cluster, Polyantha-single or cluster, Shrub Rose-single or cluster, and other variety.

1. Specify Variety – Limit 40 entries

DIVISION

B. Dahlia – Blooms greater than 2½ inches, 1 stem per entry. Blooms under 2½ inches, 3 stems per entry. Blooms should be same size. <u>All Dahlia varieties must be named properly on each entry ticket/card label:</u> Ball, Cactus, Collarette, Formal Decorative, Informal Decorative, Largest of all (diameter of bloom), Orchid, Pompon, Single, Water Lillie, and other variety (example: Novelty, Peony, anemone, mignon, seed).

CLASS

1. Specify Variety – Limit 50 entries

C. Gladiola – Foliage not required. Do not break off tips. Each specimen must be 1/3 open, 1/3 partial, 1/3 closed at time of judging. <u>All Gladiola varieties must be named properly on each entry ticket/card</u>
 <u>label:</u> Hardy-1 spike, Minature-1 spike, Spikes-1 spike.

D. Sunflowers – <u>All sunflower varieties must be named properly on each entry ticket/card label:</u> Ornamental-1 stalk 7"–12" diameter bloom, Ornamental – 1 stalk under 7" diameter.

DIVISION

Foliage – <u>All Foliage varieties must be named properly on each entry ticket/card label:</u> Hosta-small up to 3" across-1 leaf, Hosta-medium from 3" up to 8" across-1 leaf, Hosta-Large over 8" across-1 leaf;
 Ornamental Grass-small less than 15" -3 stems, Ornamental Grass-large taller than 15" -3 stems, other Ornamental Foliage -3 stems.

DIVISION

F. Bloom Specimens – a spray has at least 3 open blooms. <u>All Bloom Specimen varieties must be named properly on each entry ticket/card label:</u> Aster-3 blooms of 1 color, Calendula-3 blooms of 1 color, Carnation-3 blooms of 1 color, Celosia-1 stem, Chrysanthemum-1 spray, Cleome-1 stem, Coneflower (Echinacea)-3 blooms or 1 color, Coreopsis-3 stems, 1 variety, Cosmos-3 stems of 1 variety, Daisy-3 blooms, 1 variety, Gaillardia-3 blooms of 1 color, Pink (Dianthus)-3 stems of 1 variety, Lavender-3 stems of 1 variety, Marigold-3 blooms of 1 variety, Pansies-5 blooms of same or mixed colors, Phlox, tall garden-1 stem, Snapdragon-3 spikes of 1 color, Salvia-3 stems of 1 color, Viola-5 blooms of 1 color, Varrow-3 blooms of 1 color, Zinnia-3 blooms of 1 color; Any other annual not listed above-3 stems of 1 variety.

G. Specify Variety – Limit 50 entries

 G. Everlasting – <u>All Everlasting varieties must be named properly on each entry ticket/card label:</u> Annual Statice-1 cluster, Baby's Breath-1 cluster, Globe Thistle-3 stems, Lavender, Strawflower-3 stems, Any other-1 cluster.

 H. Potted Plants – Must have been in possession of the exhibitor at least 3 months prior to Fair. The diameter of container not to exceed 12 give botanical or common names of plant. Containers must have a bottom to hold water. <u>All Potted Plant varieties must be named properly on each entry</u> <u>ticket/card label:</u> Flowering -should be in bloom, Foliage-may bloom but is grown primarily for foliage, Single cacti, or succulent, potted.

- 4. Terrariums miniature landscape in covered transparent container. Can include 1 or more accessories to complete the landscape. Not to exceed 16" diameter; oblong 12" x 18."
