- 1. Market Goats: 60 – 85 Pounds
- 2. Alternate Market Goats: 60 – 85 Pounds

Breeding Classes

- **Breeding Stock**
 - A. Due to high risk of Q-Fever shedding in goats near kidding time, goats within 30 days before or after giving birth will not be allowed into Fair.
 - B. All dairy goats must have a required USDA or WSDA Scrapie Eradication Flock ID Tag or registered tattoo.
 - C. Goat(s) must be checked by the official Fair veterinarian prior to unloading. The fair vet's professional decisions to the health status of an animal are FINAL.
 - D. Does entered in these classes are not required to be Breed Registered. Each doe should be entered in the breed she most closely represents. If she has characteristics of two breeds, you may enter her in the crossbreed class. Contact Superintendent for assistance. 4-H & Grange Goat Certificate required to be turned into the Kennewick extension office by June 15.
- Limit 5 goats total, per exhibitor, which would include one (1) Market Goat (No companions or goats not entered in the Fair).

CLASS

1. Doe kids, 0 and under 3 months (Refer to Rule A.)
 2. Doe kids, 3 months and under 6 months
 3. Doe kids, 6 months and under 9 months
 4. Doe kids, 9 months and under 12 months
 5. Dry yearling, 12 months and under 18 months, never kidded, never in milk
 6. Dry yearling, 18 months and under 24 months, never kidded, never in milk

 10. Does, 3 years and under 4 years, having kidded, in milk. (Refer to Rule A.)
 11. Does, 4 years and under 5 years, having kidded, in milk. (Refer to Rule A.)
 12. Does, 5 years and older, having kidded, in milk. (Refer to Rule A.)

13. Best Udder in Show (All Senior dairy does)
 14. Dam and Daughter
 15. Produce of dam, to consist of two does, the produce of the same dam
 16. Get-of-Sire, to consist of three does, the get of the same sire, at least one having freshened. (Refer to Rule A.)
 17. Dairy herd, to consist of three does having freshened. All exhibits must be individual; exhibitors must be directly responsible for animals. (Refer to Rule A.)

DIVISION

- Q. Quiz Bowl - Tests exhibitors overall knowledge of goats; to include care and anatomy. Each exhibitor must enter separately online. Only Intermediate and Senior Youth exhibitors may advance to the State Fair.
- R. Dairy Goat Judging – This contest is open to any member enrolled in Youth and FFA. Contestants must be prepared to demonstrate skills and give written or oral reasons.
- S. Market Goat Judging - This contest is open to any member enrolled in Youth and FFA. Contestants must be prepared to demonstrate skills and give written or oral reasons.
- T. Obstacle Course – All breeds and all Youth and FFA Goat exhibitors will be allowed to enter.

CLOVERBUD SHOWMANSHIP
